THIS MONTH'S MINISTRY LETTER

My family's Easter egg hunts are one of our favourite things to do together. Over the years, they've ranged from simple searching in the long grass, under plant pots and balancing on tree branches, to following clues, unravelling riddles, even having to do a bit of maths. Sometimes the adults have designed the hunt for the children and grandparents, sometimes it's been the children who have enjoyed hosting the egg hunt. Invariably, we lose an egg and it isn't found until much later, usually whilst gardening in August.

For me, this experience captures something of the story of Easter. Like that one lost egg, we too can often feel a bit lost. In the run up to Easter, in our churches, we'll remember Jesus' last meal with his disciples on Maundy Thursday after which Jesus' friend Judas betrayed him, having lost faith in Jesus. We'll remember Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday, where Jesus' friends lost hope as they saw the one who was to save others killed himself. It is a moment to remember that we are not alone in feeling lost, without faith or hope. We can identify with what Jesus' friends went through and also see how much Jesus identifies with us as he suffered and faced failure as we do. But that's not the end of the story, for on Easter Sunday, early in the morning, some women went on their own hunt, searching for Jesus' body in a garden tomb so they could lovingly prepare his corpse. But the tomb was empty and to the great surprise of Jesus' friends, they were to see Jesus again, resurrected, alive.

For some, the Easter story is unbelievable; for others, it is the story that makes sense of everything. From the moment we are born until our final day, and beyond, we live in a world saturated with the presence of a God who shows us that our loss of faith and hope is not the final word and that in our suffering, we are not alone. We don't need to approach our search for God as trying to unravel a riddle, but rather to simply look to Jesus. Through him we see that even from the most seemingly lost situation, success and transformation can emerge, new life can grow.

As this article goes to print, I do not know how the crisis in Ukraine will have evolved. I hope that peace will come, and I will keep on praying that transformation and new life will emerge from this seemingly lost situation. Many in our local community have responded with donations of supplies and money, some are offering to open their homes. In this we are identifying with the suffering of others and being their source of hope. We're taking part in the Easter story as it unfolds in our time, desperate for that day when war will be no more.

Prayer for peace in Ukraine

Holy and Gracious God

We pray for the people of Ukraine and the people of Russia; for their countries and their leaders.

We pray for all those who are afraid; that your everlasting arms hold them in this time of great fear.

We pray for all those who have the power over life and death; that they will choose for all people life, and life in all its fullness.

We pray for those who choose war; that they will remember that you direct your people to turn our swords into ploughshares and seek for peace.

We pray for leaders on the world stage; that they are inspired by the wisdom and courage of Christ.

Above all, Lord, today we pray for peace for Ukraine.

And we ask this in the name of your blessed Son.







The Valley of Lost Secrets by Lesley Parr

For fans of Goodnight Mister Tom and Carrie's War, this is a beautiful story of evacuees Jimmy and Ronnie who are evacuated to Wales. Living in Wales is very



different from their home in London and while Ronnie settles in quickly, his older brother Jimmy is really unhappy. Ronnie is a loveable little boy and he loves the Thomases who have taken the boys in. Some of the local children are friendly but some are very unfriendly and the village seems to be full of secrets...Then there is Florence who has also been evacuated from London. She was always rather untidy, dirty and rather neglected back in London and they never had much to do with her, but in Wales she is well cared for, has ribbons for her hair and she becomes something of a hero...and a friend.

This is an absolutely wonderful story for middle grade and for adults! It is one of my favourite books from 2021 full of special characters, friendship and courage. It made me laugh and cry. Nominated for the Yoto Carnegie Medal in

2022 this is one you will never forget, and it is available as a physical book or an ebook at no cost to library members.

When Mary thro' the garden went, Her eyes for weeping long, were dim, The grass beneath her footsteps bent,


The solemn lilies white and slim, These also stood and wept for Him.
