MINISTRY LETTER FOR APRIL 2025

Praise God from whom all blessings flow

Spring seems to be appearing all around us now, the days are getting longer and the beauty of God's creation is just incredible at this time of year. My youngest son Jenson and I love to go out for a walk and he always looks out for new flowers springing up and each day is so wonderfully different. The blanket of daffodils and snowdrops in the churchyard at Welton at the moment are so beautiful, and every time Jenson sees them, he exclaims with such excitement, "look at the lovely yellow and white flowers!" as if it's the first time he's spotted them all over again! Oh to look at the world through the eyes of a child... but isn't this what we are called to do though?

In Matthew chapter 18 the disciples asked Jesus, "Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of Heaven?" He called a little child to him and placed the child among them. And He said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of Heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of Heaven."

Recently at our 4 o'clock Shine we had a session called 'Spring into Life' and we shared a lovely afternoon looking at the theme of Spring, and how beautiful it is if only we just pause and take a moment or two to appreciate what's around us. The children made their own spring wreaths, planted pea seeds to grow on their windowsills at home and we played games and sang songs together. We rounded off the session by learning The Grace prayer in Makaton sign language!



Children view the world with such genuine and honest simplicity; they say it exactly as it is, and perhaps as adults we have the tendency to over-

complicate matters? Our life experiences, good and bad, have a real impact on how we react to situations we face, so to humble ourselves like a child is a hard task. But God presents us with a different view: an understanding of dependence, trust, and love which allows us to appreciate and understand all that Jesus has done for us.

As we journey through Lent we have the opportunity to reflect on the painful times we face in life, through the lens of our Lord's immense sacrifice. It is often when we look back that we can see how different people, or perhaps a certain place has been the strength we needed to get through. God answers our prayer and blesses us daily, just sometimes not in the way we might have been expecting! So I wish you a peaceful Lent and when it arrives all the joys that Easter brings!

HACKTHORN & COLD HANWORTH

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

At the beginning of March, we have had a very exciting installation at school - a new sensory gazebo!

We watched with eager anticipation over the course of the week as step by step the project came to life. By Friday, the work was complete and we watched as the sun shone through the coloured windows creating wonderful reflections.

Reception children were the first to try it, loving the coloured circles on the floor. It made an excellent base for a pirate ship! We have plans to utilise this as a meeting space; our collective worship and school council are keen to hold their meetings in here; a social space and also a teaching space. We can't wait to spend more of the summer months outdoors.

Over recent weeks, Key Stage 2 pupils have started learning about Blues music. We learnt a song (by Lisa from The Simpsons!) and worked on bending notes. We then moved on to playing the 12-bar blues.

Initially we were aiming to master the first four bars but, after a short while, it became clear that the children needed an additional challenge so we moved on to the next four bars quite quickly. On the glockenspiels it sounded a bit different to the base guitar we were listening to, but 'bluesy' all the same! We are hoping to be able to share a live performance of the 12-bar blues soon.

In Art, we have started looking at pattern and have investigated patterns from different time periods.

Last week we started thinking about Neolithic art and pattern. The children each designed their own Neolithic inspired clay tiles and then produced their design onto a clay tile. They all looked really effective.

Years 5 and 6 enjoyed their residential trip to Willersley Castle in Derbyshire. The children took part in a range of activities including: A blind trail, zip wire, rock climbing, fencing and grass sledging all in a beautiful, picturesque setting. As always, the children were a credit to the school and behaved impeccably remembering their manners and exhibiting the Hackthorn Way values throughout their stay.

Key Stage 1 youngsters have been busy exploring colour in their art lessons. They have created colour fields, worked on shades and tints and then used this new knowledge to create an abstract Jackson Pollock-style painting using drip art. The artwork created is gallery worthy... the cupboards and the carpet would fit in there also.

Key Stage 1 and EYFS have also embarked on their annual dance topic. This term we have been looking at dances from around the world.

So far we have tried our hand at Irish dancing, line dancing and Chinese ribbon dancing. The most popular so far has been cheerleading, so much enthusiasm and fun had by all.

A couple of upcoming events we have are our Easter church service on April 4, where we will be celebrating with lots of songs followed by a cake sale at the village hall - you are welcome to come and join us and buy a cake or two.

We also have our annual Treasure Hunt held on April 26 at 1.30pm starting at school and taking place in surrounding villages.

This is always a family favourite and can get very competitive. It costs £5 per car and then back to school for refreshments and the completed questionnaires to be marked.



Neighbourhood Plan - Joint Opportunity with Normanby-by-Spital

At the recent public meeting in Normanby-by-Spital, the idea was raised that Owmby-by-Spital might join in developing a joint Neighbourhood Plan. This would mean working together as one community to shape the future development of both villages.

Currently, neither village has a Neighbourhood Plan, and the Parish Councils have been asked by West Lindsey District Council to determine whether residents would like to proceed with one. At this moment, Normanby has been designated to develop its own plan. However, following the recent discussion, we would like to hear from Owmby-by-Spital residents to understand their views.

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A Neighbourhood Plan allows communities to create a vision for their future, influencing the type and location of development. It provides a formal policy document that helps guide planning decisions in line with local needs and aspirations. The process involves community input and can be supported by grants and professional advice.

What Happens Next?

- Step 1 The designated area needs to be agreed upon. Currently, Normanby has its own area, but this could be expanded if Owmby wishes to join.
- Step 2 A public consultation will be carried out to gauge interest. This could include meetings and/or a questionnaire.
- Step 3 Volunteers from the community are needed to form a working group to develop the plan, supported by some Parish Councillors and other organisations.

How Can You Get Involved?

At their recent meeting Owmby by Spital Parish Council unanimously agreed to support a joint plan and we are keen to hear from Owmby-by-Spital residents for their views:

Eva Batt - 100 Glorious Years - 1925-2025

Christine and Stephen would like to thank everyone who came to mum's funeral and celebration of life at Owmby church on the 26th February. Mum was a remarkable woman whose positive outlook and zest for life amazed everyone who was fortunate to have known her. She was born in Saxilby in 1925 and passed away in her own home in Welton exactly 100 years and one week later on the 19th January 2025. Mum's family moved to Maltkiln Farm when mum was a young girl. They owned and farmed the land at the back of Skinners row on Fen Road down to Carter's corner. The Brightwater green burial ground where mum now lies, next to her husband, Geoff, was Mum's playground and cow fields that belonged her family. When mum and dad married they lived at Normanby opposite the school for 80 years. Mum was heavily involved in church activities and village life, raising funds for various causes and attending events and activities in the villages. She loved singing and dancing, and the local drama group shows. Mum loved her family, and we adored her. She was thrilled on her 100th birthday to receive a card from King Charles and Queen Camilla, and although very frail, managed to celebrate with sips of champagne, and her family around her. She will be very sadly missed.
