

RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

Challenging times for the local church

This letter is being circulated to everyone in each of the 26 churches which make up Lawres Deanery.

In 2004, the Deanery of Lawres, like the rest of the Diocese of Lincoln, found itself in a New Era. Instead of the ministry and mission of the local church being largely delivered by full-time, paid stipendiary clergy (vicars), it was necessary to look to new ways of doing this work. This was partly because the number of people in full-time ministry in England was dropping fast; far more were retiring each year (about 500) than were coming on board (about 200). Also, they were becoming very expensive.

Lawres Deanery's Mission Area Planning Group at that time had a vision...

... A Federation of Churches largely responsible for their own day to day mission, ministry and maintenance, under the supervision and guidance of a small number of stipendiaries who work across the whole deanery and who are also able to devote time to new initiatives and to the building up of churches which are in difficulties but have the potential for development. Such a deanery would have largely vibrant and confident churches engaged in all sorts of different ways with their own communities or in offering something specific to the wider area, though at any time some churches might be struggling and a few might be terminally ill.

By 2009 the number of stipendiary clergy has dropped from 6 to 3, and we are caught up, like everybody else, in the financial difficulties caused by a time of recession. At the same time, the number of people involved in unpaid ministry — Ordained Local Ministers (OLMs), Readers, Local Ministers — has increased dramatically — and the church's life and mission is thriving in many of our parishes. Even so, a time of rapid change is, for many people, quite scary.

We have every confidence under God that He will guide us in new methods of being the local church. In the meantime, we are called (a) to hold together as a united deanery (b)to keep the matter constantly in our prayers (c)to work together imaginatively to encourage and advance a Christian way of life in every area of our communities.

It is our hope and prayer that every member of all our churches will want to be part of this process.

OWMBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL

Notes on Annual Parish Meeting held in the Parish Church on Wednesday 20 May at 7.30pm

PRESENT :Cllrs G. D. Crompton-Howe; Mrs J. A Buckley; Mrs D. Lea; D. J. Mellor; Mrs M. E. Perry. The Clerk. PC D. Oakes. 3 Members of the Public

APOLOGIES: Cllrs C. L. Strange; J.J. Summers

POLICE REPORT: There had only been 2 reported crime incidents in the area since January.

Police had funding available for any schemes connected with young people, i.e. Youth Club

PC Oakes promised to remind children about safe cycling on the road when he next visited the school.

A Parishioner complained about vehicles, in particular a motor cycle, which regularly ignored the speed limit, but refused to give PC Oakes any details.

Chairman advised that a SID monitor to test vehicle speed had been used for a week last year and the majority of vehicles were within the speed limit. The operators themselves had said the sound of the vehicle often gave the impression it was travelling at speed.

A Parishioner complained that there was no white line on the corner of Fen/Spridlington Rd. He also suggested that the 30mph sign on Spridlington Rd should be moved further out towards the village name sign. (*Chairman's note, letter sent but road tar & chipped shortly after so now has to be re marked)

Potholes on Pump Hill and near the bridge on Cliff Rd needed repair. (*Now repaired)

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT: In his report the Chairman summarised the Council's work over the last year.

The Council was supporting the "Voices of '39 Project" and the Chairman acknowledge the commitment and enthusiasm of Jim Connor, who had done so much research and work to

Produce the book, which would be a social/cultural history of Normanby & Owmby during World War II. Funding of £7250 had been achieved towards the project.

The dormant Normanby Village Hall Trust fund now totalled £9,891.78. There is some urgency for the Trustees to meet and decide on the future of the charity. Chairman intends to arrange this meeting.

The Chairman thanked Mrs Hall for auditing the accounts and his Council colleagues and the Clerk for their support and commitment.

NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL

At the Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 24th June the Councillors – Roy Bellamy (Chairman); Mrs Adele Crowther (Vice-Chairperson); Mrs Jeannie Fortnum; Adam Carter, Ken Green and Mike Crowe – welcomed their newest Councillor Jonathan Brindley, which means the council is back up to full strength.

No members of the public attended this meeting, though County Councillor Lewis Strange and District Councillor Jeff Summers had sent their apologies for absence.

Highway matters – potholes keep reappearing along Private Lane, even though a request to make proper repair to them has been made. The low kerbs outside the Post Office will not be raised until the road is next resurfaced – so please be careful not to park on the pavement – see notice on wall. It is very unlikely that our village will be able to have solar speed signs erected, though the cardboard green signs with 30mph on them are to be requested – asking for them to be erected higher up the lamp posts this time as the others were taken away by unknown persons. Parking on Private Lane is still a major problem. Could all residents, who do not have room to park their vehicles in their own drive, please try to park so as not to make it difficult for other residents to get out of their drives and also please be aware that this time of year extremely large combine harvesters, tractors and other farm vehicles need to be able to get through. Please try to park on your own property – off the road.

There are some hedges, shrubs and trees overhanging the pavement along Main Street, Private Lane and Front Street. If they belong to you, would you please be kind enough to cut them back as these make the already narrow pavements even narrower.

The Councillors have agreed to give £100 towards the launch of the book called Voices of '39, which is due out this September marking the 70th anniversary of World War 2. The funding bid for the book was successful but the committee thought that it would be a shame not to launch it without a similar fanfare as the first book 'They Went to War' and so are looking for local businesses to donate towards an exhibition which will be open to the public on the day of the launch. Further launch information will follow in the Signpost.



OUTSTANDING BUSINESS

- 1. It was resolved that the Council do not proceed with a Parish website. Not everyone had access to the internet and the "Signpost", received by every household in the Parish, contained comprehensive local information and details of community events.

The Chairman advised that this funding would be operated by Owmby PC as Normanby PC had administered the funding for the "They Went To War" project.

NORMANBY VILLAGE HALL TRUST

The Chairman advised that the funds in this dormant trust needed to be used for the benefit of the parishioner of Normanby & Owmby, otherwise they would be absorbed by the Charity Commission. He was planning to call a meeting with the Trustees. He suggested that a bus shelter would be of general benefit for Owmby but other ideas need to be considered.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Permission refused to convert MWC offices into dwelling on Fen Rd. Owmby

PC had no objections to proposed chicken unit on Highgate Lane provided the design & location of the buildings complies with all the relevant regulations, but requested that there were no vehicle movements during school arrival & leaving times.

CORRESPONDENCE

- 1. WL Environmental Protection Team asked for details on any unmentioned ditches/water courses which are likely to cause flooding. Only one, going downstream from the bridge on Spridlington Rd, was identified as having caused flooding in past years.
- 2. Chairman advised that he had given permission for the Electricity Board to lop any cherry trees along Normanby Rd that were interfering with power lines.
- 3. The following were circulated: WL. Agenda & Minutes; Clerk & Councils Direct; Standards Committee Annual Report; LALC Bulletin.

The meeting closed at 8.57pm.

GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Thursday 11th June 2009

Bus Service: During the adjournment period a parishioner asked if the Saturday bus was now stopping in Glentham. It has now been ascertained that the 94 service bus is stopping at the Old Parsonage at 9.24am and the return leaves Scunthorpe at 12.30pm and gets to Glentham at 13.30pm.

Co-Option: The Council were delighted to welcome another new Councillor, Mrs Judith Summers. This brings the Council to full strength with 7 members.

Adoption of Parish Plan: The recently formulated Parish Plan has been submitted to LCC and WLDC for their comments and will now be published. The Council voted to formally adopt the Parish Plan and extended thanks to the members of the Steering Group, led by Cllr Fox, who had worked so hard. This will be an invaluable document for the village.

Highways matters: Several matters were raised with regard to overhanging bushes, hedges and trees. Clerk has reported these to the relevant authorities and it is hoped that the problems will be dealt with as soon as possible.

Church Clock: The Chairman is to meet with the maintenance contractor to ascertain why the clock keeps stopping.

COMPUTER CLASSES

Computer classes will again be offered this autumn 2009 in the Area Community Education and Training Centre at the Old School Dunholme.

Two classes for beginners are offered; one on Tuesday morning 9.30am to 11.30 am and the other on Thursday afternoon 12.30pm to 2.30pm. These classes are for those that have little or no knowledge of computers. It covers aspects of computing that is not normally covered by other training providers or in house training. It starts with how to set up your own filing system in your own folders The course progresses using a word processor (Microsoft Word) for learning how to create, save and print letters, using the auto-correct function, and the use of all the menus and pictographic tools. Also creating posters by creating text boxes and inserting clip-art and photos. You will also be using a scanner and editing of photos and the use of the Internet and the use of emailing with attachments.

To meet the demand for different levels there will be a class on Thursday evening of two hour duration 7.00pm to 9.00pm to cover beyond the basics skills. This course is mainly for those who use computers regularly at home or work but have only been self-taught or taught within a working environment.

This course will be ideal for SME's whether self-employed or in a small company, those in a busy organisation where responsibility for output targets are required or those running voluntary organisations. More emphasis will be on using the computer to make the running of your organisation easier. i.e., Using Microsoft Word to create letterheads, forms, flyers, posters, leaflets and newsletters well as creating computerised accounts, and invoices etc using Microsoft Excel. Also covered are animated presentations using Microsoft PowerPoint and photo editing using PhotoSuite and Serif PhotoPlus. You will also look into doing routine error checks on your computer, customising your defaults, menus and tool bars.

The cost will be £48 for twelve weeks for each course starting week beginning Monday 21st September 2009 (there will be a break for the School half term).

All courses will be open to every one of any age, gender or ability and to ensure personal attention from the tutor no more then six places will be offered for each class.

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWSLETTER

At the time of writing we are putting our pandemic plans into place in anticipation of a surge in potential Swine Flu cases.

The GP surgeries at Welton and Nettleham are working closely with each other to ensure that we can both continue to serve the patients of our practices if resources become overstretched.

Current advice if you have a temperature and are displaying flu like symptoms is to remain at home and contact either NHS Direct (0845 4647) or your surgery for advice. Do NOT come in person to the surgery if you think you may have flu. Shortly a National Flu Line will become available which will aim to deal with the majority of uncomplicated flu with surgeries concentrating on those aged under five or over sixty five, pregnant or with known underlying health problems and others with complications. Every patient is advised to identify a "'Flu Friend" as a precautionary measure – this person may be asked to collect the authorisation letter from the surgery to take to an Anti Viral Centre where the antiviral medications are given out. Anti-viral drugs will **NOT** be available from the GP surgeries, only at these designated collection points and with an authorisation letter. The Flu Friend will also be required to produce identification for themselves and for the patient when collecting the medication. Hospitals will also be working under additional pressures in the event of a large outbreak and routine operations may need to be cancelled, outpatient appointments suspended and some patients who would normally be seen in hospital may need to be treated at home instead

A vaccination is anticipated in early autumn and we understand that it will be offered to a similar group of patients to those who are normally entitled to the seasonal flu vaccination. Our websites will be updated regularly with the current information (www.weltonsurgery.co.uk) and

We would also like to point out that we have cleared our waiting room of toys, books and all other items which may get in the way of thorough cleaning and ask patients to kindly suspend bringing in magazines for us at the present time.

LINCOLNSHIRE POLICE PLEDGE

THE POLICE SERVICE IN ENGLAND AND WALES WILL SUPPORT LAW ABIDING CITIZENS AND PURSUE CRIMINALS RELENTLESSLY TO KEEP YOU AND YOUR NEIGHBOURHOODS SAFE FROM HARM. WE WILL:

- 1. Always treat you fairly with dignity and respect ensuring you have fair access to our services at a time that is reasonable and suitable for you.
- 2. Provide you with information so you know who your dedicated Neighbourhood Policing Team is, where they are based, how to contact them and how to work with them.
- 3. Ensure your Neighbourhood Policing Team and other police patrols are visible and on your patch at times when they will be most effective and when you tell us you most need them. We will ensure your team is not taken away from neighbourhood business more than is absolutely necessary. They will spend at least 80% of their time visibly working in your neighbourhood, tackling your priorities. Staff turnover will be minimised.
- 4. Respond to every message directed to your Neighbourhood Policing Team within 24 hours and, where necessary, provide a more detailed response as soon as we can.
- 5. Aim to answer 999 calls within 10 seconds, deploying to emergencies immediately giving an estimated time of arrival, getting to you safely, and as quickly as possible. In urban areas, we will aim to get to you within 15 minutes and in rural areas within 20 minutes.
- 6. Answer all non-emergency calls promptly. If attendance is needed, send a patrol giving you an estimated time of arrival. and:
- if you are vulnerable or upset, aim to be with you within 60 minutes.
- •if you are calling about an issue that we have agreed with your community will be a neighbourhood priority and attendance is required, we will aim to be with you within 60 minutes.
- •alternatively, if appropriate, we will make an appointment to see you at a time that fits in with your life and within 48 hours.
- if agreed that attendance is not necessary we will give you advice, answer your questions and/or put you in touch with someone who can help.
- 7. Arrange regular public meetings to agree your priorities, at least once a month* giving you a chance to meet your local team with other members of your community. These will include opportunities such as surgeries, street briefings and mobile police station visits which will be arranged to meet local needs and requirements. *or some other suitable period. Also see Lincs Police web site.
- 8. Provide monthly updates on progress, and on local crime and policing issues. This will include the provision of crime maps, information on specific crimes and what happened to those brought to justice, details of what action we and our partners are taking to make your neighbourhood safer and information on how your force is performing. Again see Lincs Police web site.
- 9. If you have been a victim of crime agree with you how often you would like to be kept informed of progress in your case and for how long. You have the right to be kept informed at least every month if you wish and for as long as is reasonable.
- 10. Acknowledge any dissatisfaction with the service you have received within 24 hours of reporting it to us. To help us fully resolve the matter, discuss with you how it will be handled, give you an opportunity to talk in person to someone about your concerns and agree with you what will be done about them and how quickly.

We want to do our best for you, but if we fail to met our Pledge we will always explain why it has not been possible on that occasion to deliver the high standards to which we aspire and you deserve.
