THIS MONTH'S MINISTRY TEAM LETTER

ONE MORE STEP ALONG THE WORLD

"As soon as He was baptised, He came out of the water. Then heaven was opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God coming down like a dove and alighting on Him."

Matthew 3. 15-16

When Rev Sally retired, I began to help with the coordination of baptisms in the Owmbly Group of Parishes. In previous years, there had only been two or three baptisms each year throughout the whole group. This year has been significantly different. Since January 2022, there have been fifteen requests for baptisms. This number may continue to grow now that churches have reopened and the full range of services can go ahead.

Although there is a noticeable reduction in the number of people who come to church for normal Sunday services, there appears to be no reluctance to have children baptised. Many of you reading this letter will have been baptised but no longer "go to church." So, what makes the tradition of baptism, or christening, so popular and important with families? Baptism with water is a Christian ritual. It is a reminder of when Jesus went forward to be baptised by John the Baptist in the River Jordan. A church baptism service is quite short, but it contains some of the most important decisions parents and Godparents can make during their lives. The service is a joyful occasion where all ages come together to celebrate an important milestone in Christian faith. The service includes promises made by parents, Godparents (or Sponsors) and friends and family on behalf of each other and the infant being baptised.

Parents, Godparents and Sponsors make promises that they will "strive to share love, faith, wisdom and understanding with the child." Family, friends and the church community promise that with God's help they will "form a community of love in which the child will grow, and to keep parents, Godparents and carers in their hearts and prayers and give an example of faith, hope and love to them all." These are big promises; they are Christian promises not to be undertaken lightly and never to be broken.

Being baptised is a transformational event in a person's life when God calls them out of darkness into His marvellous light. As witnesses, parents, Godparents, Sponsors and the wider congregation become part of this transformational event.

In the Gospels there is no record of Jesus baptising children or adults. He was an adult at the beginning of His Ministry when He was baptised in the Jordan River. Some adults are baptised when they are ready to make their own decisions and promises. It is never too late to be baptised or confirmed and, I promise, that you will receive a warm welcome into the Church family.

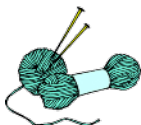

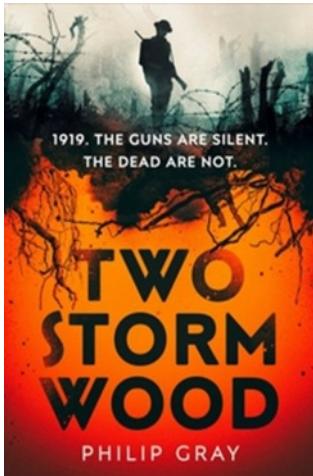

Two Storm Wood by Phillip Gray

This atmospheric novel looks at a time in history that is not often discussed, the post first world war recovery of bodies from the battlefields. It was undoubtedly demanding work as some bodies had been left for a considerable time, it was also a surprise to me to find that a



large group of Chinese workers were paid to undertake much of the work. The fictional side of the book concentrates on Amy looking for Edward her fiancé who has been listed as missing in action. Amy travels to these desolate battlefields despite advice to the contrary, she bravely faces rat infested tunnels in the search for Edward. It then becomes apparent that there has been a mass murder involving the teams searching for the bodies that the authorities appear to be trying to cover up. Amy also starts to find out more about the grim actions Edward undertook during the war and begins to wonder if he is actually still alive. But how does it all fit together with the recent murders? It all builds up to a riveting end with twists and turns on the way.

I found this fascinating and a different perspective from the awful carnage of large groups of young men being sent 'over the top'. But be warned, it certainly does not sugar coat what we would now call 'guerrilla warfare'

that also happened during this horrific period in history.

Incidentally I read this on my tablet using the library's free ebook option meaning it was available more quickly than waiting for a printed copy - just ask us for details if you want to try this service.
