AUGUST'S LETTER FROM THE RURAL DEAN

Dealing with disappointments and their consequences can be so difficult at times, can't it? We all discover that in life and I have certainly discovered it in my 17 years of ministry. Things I thought would always be, are no longer. That is very true in the Diocese of Lincoln at the moment as we have embarked on a programme of change under the heading of 'Time to Change Together'.

Before the pandemic, the Diocese (covering Lincolnshire, North East Lincolnshire and North Lincolnshire) came to the view that it needed to reorganise. There are approximately 630 church buildings in the Diocese, many of which have very small congregations, and sadly the pandemic has accelerated the closure or temporary closure of a few of them. Worshipping congregations have decreased in size and inevitably the income that is required to pay a stipend (salary) to clergy has reduced. This has meant a major review of all sorts of aspects of life in the Diocese - its finance, assets and investments; how we bring about growing church numbers; how paid clergy are deployed; how lay ministers are deployed; what worship can be supported and where; what central services of the church can be financed in order to support the legal and safeguarding functions of the church.... And so it goes on.... It is major change.

The outcome of all of these discussions is beginning to bite in parishes. In 2022 parishes were asked to covenant finance in order to cover the costs of paid ministry through to 2025 and this now determines the number of paid clergy in the Deanery, which runs from Glentham, through Welton Dunholme and Scothern, south to Greetwell and Cherry Willingham, round to Burton and through Nettleham and up the A15 to Fillingham; 27 church communities, to be covered eventually by 3 paid Priests (carrying one vacancy currently) plus those who give of their time having 'retired' alongside Lay Ministers. It is unlikely that this will change in the near future, however it means that some groups of churches (such as Owmbly) do not have a member of the clergy resident among them. However, we are currently organising local contacts and an oversight Priest who will be the person who helps us navigate through this situation in the local area. For the Owmbly Group this is Revd Judy Shaw.

I recognise that this is not ideal, but it is where we are. I am indebted to those who live in communities in the Owmbly Group and support their churches in one way or another. It is incumbent on all of us who wish to see healthy churches at the heart of our communities to support in whatever way we can. If you think you can help, contact your local churchwarden, or someone you know who goes to church - I am sure they will point you to the right people.

By the time you read this, we will have held our Leavers' service. It is always a poignant event as the Year 6s share their memories of their time at Hackthorn. Their speeches are always filled with stories of embarrassing moments, accounts about their favourite trips, subjects, and events and then the customary memories which tug at our hearts. It is then my opportunity to share my memories and those of the staff about each Year 6 pupil. This year however, it will also be my turn to share my own memories as I will be taking up my new position in September as Headteacher of Dunholme St Chad's Church of England Primary School. I am writing this a week before I share my speech and have been on quite an emotional roller coaster considering what I will say. Hackthorn has been such a special place for me over the last nine years. It has wonderful children, fantastic staff, supportive parents, dedicated governors, and an amazing community. I will always have fantastic memories of my time here.

Many people think that schools 'wind down' in the final weeks...not at Hackthorn! We have been incredibly busy. Y6 pupils have been attending their secondary school induction days and we have had the pleasure of meeting our new Reception pupils.

Despite threatening rain, we managed to hold our Sports Day, which was well attended by parents. The children competed in mixed age team sporting activities in the morning -they were amazing as they encouraged one another. We were also able to complete all the competitive races in the afternoon, even though we thought we might have to run and take cover at one point.

KS1 staff decided to leave their DT project until the last two weeks of term. Mrs Dodson has always been honest about her feelings related to DT...they come close to those on Computing! The children were quite ambitious with their designs, so we used a 'hair-mometer' to judge Mrs Dodson's stress levels and the success of the children's efforts. Surprisingly, her hair remained 'reasonably' coiffured.

KS2 pupils came back buzzing from their trip to Magna. They thoroughly enjoyed the interactive exhibits as they explored the wonders of science and technology.

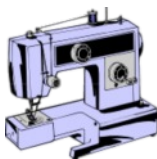

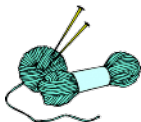
