

AUGUST'S LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Meteorologically speaking, it is summer. However, I am not sure that, as is so often the case in the UK, the weather got the memo!

Summer is traditionally a time of journeying, of change. I have spent many years playing, singing and hearing that wonderful children's hymn, '*One more step along the world I go*'. At this time of year, the Year 6 children have left their primary schools to prepare to start a new adventure at secondary school, others are preparing to go to new schools for a variety of reasons, others will be preparing to start school, college, university or jobs for the first time. However, if you place your faith in God, you will know that He travels with you every step of the way; on the journey, at the stops, in times of joy and in times of difficulty. You are not alone, ever. He was with you from before your birth and will be with you beyond your death. One of the most comforting verses in the Bible is at the end of Matthew's gospel, chapter 28:20(b) where Jesus says to his disciples "And surely I am with you always to the very end of the age." What a wonderful gift that is, to have God, the creator of this wonderful world who loves you, as your travelling companion on your train from the start of your journey to the very end.

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

Wow - another jam packed half term at Hackthorn.

We have now completed our ten weeks of swimming sessions and are proud to say ALL our children achieved a safety skills and distance award. Well done all.

Key Stage 1 pupils have been looking at ariel views of the school. This started with working on ariel views of the classroom; looking at shapes around the classroom to help them. They then used photos of the outside of the buildings to help create an ariel map of the school, showing great perseverance in doing this... perseverance being the 'value' we are thinking about this term. Years 1 and 2 have also been working on their Design and Technology; they have been creating winding mechanisms using axles to create a prop, which they will use when they sing nursery rhymes to reception.

Key Stage 2 have been busy historians and detectives, learning all about the history of our village and piecing together clues from evidence and sources. These have included census documents, gravestones and our local history expert Cathy Andrews who has been a fountain of knowledge - thank you. The children have loved the whole topic and enjoyed walking around the village looking at dates and features on the buildings.

Key Stage 2 are also busy working on their Design and Technology topic. Years 3 and 4 are busy designing bags; making plans and prototypes with paper before moving on to sewing with their chosen fabric. Years 4 and 5 are busy making hats and had great fun measuring each other's heads! We cannot wait to see the finished products as we have lots of budding designers in school.

Reception children sang their hearts out in front of a packed audience in Good Work Assembly, singing their number bonds to 10 song, which you can hear most days while the children are going about their usual routine. Reception children have also written a whole class letter to our new starters, telling them all about the exciting things they can look forward to in September.

We had a great day learning all about 'A Road to Paris' with our sports coaches from JB Sports. The children spent the whole day accessing different activities and sports, learning about the Olympic Games on the way.

Some of the sports they had a go at were; boxing, archery, bocce, goal ball - where the goalkeeper is blindfolded and the ball has a bell in it, nerf gun target practise and wheelchair racing.

As well as all these sports to play, the children also had classroom-based learning too; designing their own sports kit, going on a virtual tour of Paris and writing a postcard to tell all the friends and family about the landmarks and museums, and researching about the Olympic rings and making some fantastic art displays of the countries that participate.

Sports Day was a busy time again with all the children working in teams from reception through to Year 6 in the morning, taking on various sporting challenges and then in the afternoon racing against their peers in front of parents and carers.

- Upon receiving a crime number from the police, please pass it to the clerk. (Clerk@owmbybyspital-pc.gov.uk)

- Provide a brief outline of the incident to be kept as a record.
- 3. Councillor Notification:

- All councillors will be informed of the incident as soon as possible.

4. Financial Redress:

- If the perpetrator is confirmed, financial redress will be sought for any damage caused or expenses incurred.

Vandalism, or any other form of anti-social behaviour, will not be tolerated.


