MINISTRY LETTER FOR AUGUST 2026

Who is my neighbour?

What a sporting month we have just experienced; Wimbledon, the World Cup, a Grand Prix, just to name a few. My first thought for this letter was to reflect on the World Cup but as I am writing this, the semi-final match against Argentina hasn't been played yet.

Instead, I am going to reflect on the story of the Good Samaritan, which I am sure that most of you will know well. This story came to mind as I was participating in a 100km endurance event recently. Don't worry, I'm not going to bore you with the details; those who know me will already have been bored with it and been subjected to looking at my medal, and yes, I got the t-shirt too.

The story came to mind because of the way that the participants looked after each other. When I say participants, I mean the other mortals like me who were still going whilst the elite runners had finished, had a hearty meal, gone out for the evening and were now in bed!

The route took us along an ancient pathway which would have been a dangerous place for travellers of yesteryears who would be at the mercy of robbers and wild animals. Even tripping over could prove fatal as settlements were far apart, no sat nav tracking in those days. This could have been the fate of the man who was set upon in Jesus' story if the Samaritan had not helped him. Obviously, with our modern technology this was not going to happen to my fellow participants, although there were some pretty scary noises from the hedgerows at one point in the middle of the night.

What made the story of the Good Samaritan resonate though, was the fact that the majority were solo participants from different countries, different backgrounds with different reasons for taking on a challenge. But we looked after each other. If someone had stopped, we checked they were ok or whether they needed help. When someone was struggling, we walked beside them and ensured they got to a pit stop. There were people who put their race on hold to stay with those unable to continue until help reached them. For me, it certainly felt that, as The Troggs sang, or for any younger readers, Wet Wet Wet, 'Love is all around.'

Which brings us back to the reason for the Samaritan story. A lawyer wanted to know who his neighbour was as the law said that to gain eternal life you must 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind'; and also, 'Love your neighbour as yourself'. This event illustrated who my neighbour was. It was all of these individuals who were willing to give and receive help from strangers. A neighbour is not about location; it is about love.

Our recent whole school visit to Normanby Hall was a wonderful success from start to finish. The children were, as always, exceptional ambassadors for our school and represented us beautifully throughout the day. Across the school, children fully embraced every opportunity to explore, discover and learn something new within the stunning grounds.

Key Stage 2 particularly enjoyed pond dipping, enthusiastically investigating the wildlife beneath the water's surface-thankfully with no accidental dips themselves! They also developed their knowledge of the natural world through tree identification, showing curiosity and teamwork as they learned to recognise different species.

Key Stage 1 were equally engaged, taking part in tree identification and immersing themselves in listening to bird sounds. These calm, reflective moments allowed children to connect with nature in a meaningful and often spiritual way, fostering a real appreciation for the environment around them. The excitement continued with a minibeast hunt, where children used nets to sweep figure-of eight shapes through the grass, carefully collecting and identifying a variety of fascinating bugs. There was a real sense of wonder and enthusiasm as children shared their findings and learned together. This trip was a fantastic example of The Hackthorn Way in action. Children took on board every opportunity to learn, respect for the environment and each other, resilience when trying new activities, and a strong sense of community as they supported and encouraged one another throughout the day. Thank you to our Friends of Hackthorn School for donating the funds to cover the cost of the coach, making the trip more affordable to parents.

KS2 proudly presented their annual Production 'Mystery at Magpie Manor' - a whodunnit tale set in the 1920s. We had magpies, flapper girls, upstairs and downstairs characters, as well as several famous names making an appearance. The children worked hard to learn their lines and all the songs as well. A group of children took it upon themselves to become the official choreographers and then busily set to teaching the rest of the class dance moves, taking into account suggestions and adapting their routines. Costumes were sourced by parents and looked absolutely amazing and really made the shown feel like the 1920s. As to be expected, the children were fantastic. Every one of them shone and sparkled. It is always a joy to see children come out of their comfort zones and trust us enough to throw themselves into their parts. I hope they enjoyed themselves as much as their audiences did.

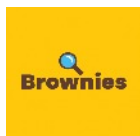
