

RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

The parish where I served as a curate was next door to the Maidstone headquarters of Southern Television, & one of the producers developed a close association with our church. One Christmas he had the idea of "Dial a Carol", people phoning in for a carol to be sung by the church choir and congregation, and perhaps a greeting for someone they loved far away. So one Sunday afternoon in December we practiced almost every carol you could think of, served tea and cake in church, and as 6 o'clock drew near, sat back and waited for the phone in. The vicar was going to take the phone calls, the organist would conduct the choir & I would conduct the congregation, because for a live televised service everything has to be just right. We were taking a big risk in not knowing what people might ask for, or what might be the stories we heard.

I don't think we were quite ready for what we did hear.

Every single one of those phone calls – admittedly, they had been filtered through the producer in the van outside church – had a sad story to tell. For these people, Christmas wasn't just going to be a bundle of fun. Bereavement, loss, estrangement, ill-health. All of these featured.

What we had expected to be a Christmas celebration from our church turned out instead to be more of a healing service. Fortunately, everyone concerned rose to the occasion, and we had reason to believe that we had done our job well.

Perhaps you remember the service. It was broadcast nationally, & it must have been Christmas 1988 or 1989.

For a lot of people, Christmas is not going to be a happy time. In fact, I don't believe it was a happy time for Joseph, Mary and the baby Jesus.

Perhaps it's important, then, for somewhere in our Christmas celebrations in church, to take note of those who will feel on the edge of the Christmas cheer.

Among all the new services and liturgies being produced, one this year is catching the attention of clergy everywhere...

A Quiet Christmas: A service for those for whom Christmas will not be 'very merry', but overshadowed by mixed feelings, pain, loneliness and grief

Christmas is traditionally a time of gladness and celebration, a time when families gather together for parties and merriment. But for those grieving the loss of loved ones, or whose family circumstances are difficult, it can be a very lonely, depressing, time. Somehow isolation is more painful when it seems that all the rest of the world is celebrating.

While the birth of the Christ child is rightly an event for joyful celebration, a quieter service, which acknowledges that not everyone is looking forward to Christmas and the New Year, can offer some people a way of honouring their mixed feelings at this special time. This liturgy offers prayers, Scripture and music that acknowledge God's presence in the lives of those who mourn, and with those who struggle - and that God's Word comes to shine light into the darkest places of life. It is an attempt to engage these people, who are often on the fringes of the church community, in the churches' response to the coming of the Saviour.

We shall hold such a service this year. It will be at Owmby, at 6.00 pm on Saturday 23rd December, just before the "Christmas Rush" gets seriously going. Perhaps it will be right for you. Perhaps it will be right for someone you know. Do come along. Do bring them.

And may I wish you a peaceful and a blessed Christmas this year, especially those of you for whom it will not be a happy one.





Following on from last year's successful SAT results, once again, all our pupils attained at least a level 4 in all subjects in the statutory KS2 tests which took place in May 2006. This year, however, our results will not be published in the league tables, as we had less than 10 pupils taking the test. Well done to everyone on another successful year.

We have had a lot of fun being involved in a 2-day art project which has involved all the school children, Busy Bees pre-school children and the village Art Club. Using African Art techniques, we have produced a whole-school tapestry and some very large African masks. It was a fantastic experience and an opportunity for all ages to work

together, and we thank members of the Art Club for supporting the school in this project. The work will be displayed in our newly-decorated school hall on a permanent basis, but will also be displayed publicly in Market Rasen during the Summer terms alongside artwork from Legsby School and Osgodby School.

A belated thank you to Phyllis Fields - a member of the village Art Club - who organised a Wallace and Grommitt art competition for our children. The finalists got to paint their designs on one of our toy sheds.

Congratulations to Years 5 and 6 pupils on winning a tag rugby tournament at Market Rasen School in November.

On Remembrance Day, Normanby and Owmby villages joined together to remember the soldiers who died during the First and Second World Wars. It was a very well supported day, with the children attending in World War I costumes; £20 cash prizes were awarded for the best dressed children and all children who attended in wartime dress received a £10 cash prize. Minor planning to be dealt with at ordinary Parish Council meetings or if timescale does not allow, by circulation method. (This arose from Adjournment period).

This fencing has deteriorated and needs repairing and wood preservative applying. It was agreed the Council should employ a handyman at a rate of £7 per hour on an 'as needed' basis. Post to be advertised in The Signpost and on the noticeboards.





At the time of writing we are still awaiting two further supplies of influenza vaccine, the last one is due in December. Most years we are well on the way to completing the annual programme but this year due to reasons beyond our control we have been unable to offer appointments to those needing them in a timely manner and our apologies to everyone concerned. Supplies have been limited and late, not just here but nationally, but we will do our best to ensure that vaccines are given as quickly as possible to those in need. We have been asked several times if we can administer private supplies – under NHS Regulations we are unable to offer this service on a private basis to our own registered patients.

We have several nebulisers loaned out to patients and would appreciate an early return of them. We offer a loan service via our Respiratory Nurse, which is intended to be for short term only.

Thank you to everyone who has completed the questionnaires we have been handing out to patients recently regarding the care given by their doctor in the practice. This helps us to gauge how our services are viewed and to plan for the future. Alternatively comments may be left anonymously or otherwise in our Suggestion Box in the waiting room – and thank you also to everyone who takes the trouble to complete these forms – the feedback is really useful and appreciated.

Our Reception staff would be very grateful if patients would offer their full names when ringing in to make an appointment in order to prevent the wrong patient being booked into surgery.

Plans have been displayed recently showing developments to the Village Centre and the surgery is pleased to be part of this project which will include improved parking facilities for our patients and contrary to rumours, we are not moving premises!

Christmas opening times – the surgery will close at 12 noon on Friday 22nd December and Friday 29th December. As at all times please ring 0844 477 3072 to direct to out of hours emergency services.

Please also remember to allow forty eight hours (two working days) notice for repeat prescriptions, especially important around Christmastime.
