FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

My dear friends,

VALUE-DRIVEN LEADERSHIP

I groaned inwardly at this title for a presentation by one of our bishops. "Yet more management-speak", I thought to myself.

But I was wrong. Admittedly our diocesan management expert was using his particular expertise in this field, but he was trying to guide our attention away from the business of maintaining the institution (the Church) towards furthering the brand (see what I mean!) which the Church exists to represent.

And the 'brand' (I hate this term) he had in mind is Jesus Christ (I much prefer this term). That's the tricky one; just how much Jesus is there in our church?

What does what Christians actually do, have to say about Jesus?

The Bishop proposed to us some possible values...

TRUTH JUSTICE FORGIVENESS GENEROSITY RESPECT

all of which he sees in Jesus. Jesus promoted these values in both what he said and also in the way he lived his life.

There might be other values we'd add to the list, but surely most of us (in fact, I would hope all of us) would not simply support but want to actively promote truth, justice, forgiveness, generosity and respect. And wouldn't the world be a much better place if we all did?

We're coming up again to Christmas. What does Christmas really mean? It doesn't mean a mid-winter party, though there's not necessarily anything wrong with a mid-winter party, something to cheer people up at the darkest of times.

Nor, actually, does Christmas mean a baby in a manger, though the baby in the manger is the focus of what Christmas really does mean.

Christmas means that God - yes, God - is in the world, not to boss us around, not punish us, not to set us against one another in support of barmy ideas which pretend to be religion. God doesn't come among us to play silly games with us, but to love us to death.

Surely to goodness, that's a good idea.

No, it's more than a good idea. It's a wonderful idea.

In loving us to death, God comes among us and plants loads of good ideas - the five I've listed are merely the start - God's Christmas present to the human race.

We really could do with them.

Come to church this Christmas to celebrate all this, and then go out from church this Christmas to live our values out in a pretty pagan sort of world.

Jesus did.

A blessed Christmas and a peaceful new year to all.

Christmas: Hoping against Hype

It surprises me that TV soaps have to invent a Christmas story-line to bolster their ratings year by year. After all, the Christmas story itself has all the ingredients they need. An unexpected pregnancy with paternity issues at stake. The birth of a baby in less than ideal circumstances with visitors bearing exotic gifts from near and far. The friendly pub landlord is not backed up by community leaders who would rather see this dysfunctional family off their manor as soon as possible. Enough there to keep a Soap in story-lines without needing to invent new hyped-up versions.

Indeed, in many ways, Christmas spells hype in our current culture. But, of course, Christmas actually spells Hope. Hope can be in short supply when jobs are threatened, homes are at risk of re-possession and some of the poorest people in our society become ever poorer.

Yet the birth of Jesus counters a culture of hopelessness. It is about a new life being born into the world and that is itself a sign of hope. NOTES ON MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 4TH NOVEMBER 2010

Adjournment period for public questions

Matters raised and discussed were: The Council had previously been asked to investigate whether the railings on the pavement to the west of Glentham Court obstruct the view of motorists exiting from it. A member of the public strongly expressed the view that the railings are essential for road safety reasons. Councillors explained that no action can be taken pending receipt of a survey conducted by Lincolnshire County Council, when the matter will be reviewed. The road around the village hall is becoming difficult for people and vehicles, and parking is exacerbating the problem. Ways of ameliorating this situation were discussed and actions agreed.

Highways

The County Council have agreed to remove the dead tree at Barff Meadows that has given rise to safety concerns but are unable to give a date for the work. Little progress has been made on the road repairs reported to the County Council over the last two months and the Parish Council will continue to press for these to be carried out.

Environment

An application to Lincolnshire County Council for a grant of £250 to buy equipment for flood use has been agreed. A letter has been sent to the people responsible for winding up the estate of Cherry Tree Farm, requesting the entrance be tidied up. The Council is awaiting a response to its application to the Future Jobs Fund Initiative (FJF) for a part-time worker to carry out environmentally-related jobs that need doing in the village.

Village Hall

The Council discussed the possible replacement of the Council notice boards, both of which let in water, in the High Street and outside the Village Hall. It was agreed that an additional notice board for Village Hall notices was needed and that quotes should be sought with a view to including the new boards in the Hall refurbishment programme.

Playground

Repair work to play equipment was due to begin at the end of October, but is now expected to begin week commencing 17 November. Quotes will be sought for repairs to fencing surrounding the play area.

New Clerk

A new Parish Council Clerk has been appointed; Jeff Reynolds took up his duties on 4th November. Contact details are inside the front cover of Signpost and on the Owmbly Group website.

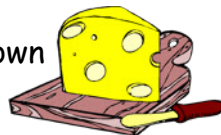

Reminder that we still have a number of 'flu vaccines available. If you think you qualify for one do not wait until we write to you - please ask at reception for details.

He has agreed to remain as Vice Chair and we welcome the appointment of Mr Mal Reynolds as his successor and look forward to continuing our working relationship with this greatly appreciated and well established Patient Group. Doors and Windows not secured - Ensure all doors and windows are locked

Gifts displayed under the tree - Ensure all gifts are kept out of view

Car keys and handbags conveniently placed? - Never leave car keys or handbags downstairs at night - take them to bed with you

The unoccupied look - going on holiday? Consider using automatic lights, cancel milk and papers, ask a neighbour to keep an eye on your house. If you belong to a Neighbourhood Watch inform your co-coordinator

Open your door to strangers - Before you open your door to strangers, use a door chain and check the validity of all cold callers.

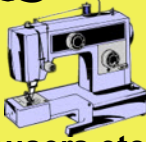

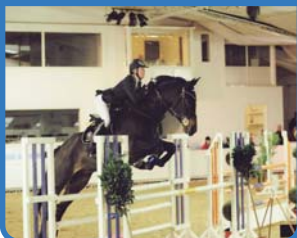
