LETTER FROM THE RECTOR

Dear All

Greetings to all Signpost readers. After such a long time it is good to have our community magazine back in production. It is like having a long-lost friend back in circulation. There have been so many times we have looked for a contact number, advertiser or just to see what's going on in the villages.

Thanks to all who make Signpost possible, it's good to have you back.

Since the last issue so much has happened as we live and work through the pandemic that has touched nearly every part of our lives. And what has been evident is love: love for one another, for friend and stranger. Supporting one another through lockdown, volunteering to shop, keeping in touch, cheering each other up and being so incredibly appreciative of our NHS and who all work in it. 





WHY DO DOGS LIVE LESS THAN HUMANS?

Here's the surprising answer of a 6 year old child.

Being a veterinarian, I had been called to examine a ten-year-old Irish Wolfhound named Belker. The dog's owners, Ron, his wife Lisa, and their little boy Shane, were all very attached to Belker, and they were hoping for a miracle.

I examined Belker and found he was dying of cancer. I told the family we couldn't do anything for Belker, and offered to perform the euthanasia procedure for the old dog in their home.

As we made arrangements, Ron and Lisa told me they thought it would be good for six-yearold Shane to observe the procedure. They felt as though Shane might learn something from the experience.

The next day, I felt the familiar catch in my throat as Belker's family surrounded him. Shane seemed so calm, petting the old dog for the last time, that I wondered if he understood what was going on. Within a few minutes, Belker slipped peacefully away.

The little boy seemed to accept Belker's transition without any difficulty or confusion. We sat together for a while after Belker's passing, wondering aloud about the sad fact that dogs' lives are shorter than human lives. Shane, who had been listening quietly, piped up, "I know why."

Startled, we all turned to him. What came out of his mouth next stunned me. I'd never heard a more comforting explanation. It has changed the way I try and live.

He said, "People are born so that they can learn how to live a good life — like loving everybody all the time and being nice, right?" The six-year-old continued,

"Well, dogs already know how to do that, so they don't have to stay for as long as we do."

Live simply.

Love generously.

Care deeply.

Speak kindly.

Remember, if a dog was the teacher you would learn things like:

- When your loved ones come home, always run to greet them.
- Never pass up the opportunity to go for a joyride.
- Allow the experience of fresh air and the wind in your face to be pure ecstasy.
- Take naps.
- Stretch before rising.
- Run, romp, and play daily.
- Thrive on attention and let people touch you.
- Avoid biting when a simple growl will do.
- On warm days, stop to lie on your back on the grass.
- On hot days, drink lots of water and lie under a shady tree.
- When you're happy, dance around and wag your entire body.
- Delight in the simple joy of a long walk.
- · Be faithful.
- Never pretend to be something you're not.
- If what you want lies buried, dig until you find it.
- When someone is having a bad day, be silent, sit close by, and nuzzle them gently.



We are operating on much reduced hours and are unable to offer computer or printing facilities and this may or may not continue during December depending upon lockdown decisions yet to be taken. The reduced hours are Mondays 3-4 pm and Tuesdays 10-11 am, however after our session on 1st December this may change and we will publicise on our Welton Village Library Facebook page, Welton Parish Council and Welton News websites as well as on posters at the library and around the village.

For click and collect if you are already a library member you can go on line by searching for the Lincolnshire Libraries website and select renew or reserve books, you then enter your library card number and PIN and will then have the entire Lincolnshire library stock to select from. You select the book you want and that you would like it delivered to Welton - or any other library on the list that suits you. When the book arrives at the library site selected you will received an email or text message to inform you it is ready for collection. If you do not know your PIN or you get a message that your card has expired or you aren't a member and want to become one then please ring 01522 782010 and it will be resolved quickly and easily. You can of course join on line at the libraries website or call in to us at Manor Park.

Please also remember that both new and existing members can take advantage of a number of free on line services that Lincolnshire Libraries provide. A really great offer at the moment for people researching family history is that you can access the full Ancestry website from your home computer at no cost and with no need to input credit card details or receive annoying marketing emails. All you need do is go to the Lincolnshire website, select new or reserve books, input your library card and PIN details and at the top of the next page you see there is a link to Ancestry. I understand this service will be available until 31st December so if you are interested it is well worth trying it out, I have really found it useful.

Also members have access to ebooks which can be read on your tablet, phone or home computer, again there is no charge for this service and there are many titles available and not only that there is access to e-audiobooks, e-newspapers, e-magazines and music streaming and downloads. Just choose the e-books & audio option from the green menu you will see having signed in.

Finally please note that the library will be closed over Christmas and New Year. We expect our last sessions to be in week commencing 21st December and that we will reopen on 4th January 2021, things may change so please keep an eye out on line or around the village.

Our best wishes and hopes for a less stressful festive period and a more positive New Year is sent on behalf of all the volunteers who operate the library for the benefit of the village and surrounding area along with the parish council and staff who support the library in so many ways.


