DECEMBER'S LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

How do we all approach Christmas this year. I have no doubt that for many, Christmas will again present its challenges - for some it will be financial, for others it will be to do with loss of some form or another, for some, maybe worries about the future and a general dis-ease with the world. Christmas and the new year, I think, always sharpen our focus. We have to work out what is really important in the midst of all the frenzied activity that surrounds us - that is not a bad thing - to work out what is most important in reality and in eternity, in life and in love and enter into those things.

Jesus was born into a context of great uncertainty. An occupied land, an oppressive Roman regime in itself vexed by what was going on in this middle eastern land. It wasn't really the starstruck event that is so often depicted on cards and images. It was by many, unnoticed. God didn't choose a palace, or a crown or the famous. He chose Mary and Joseph, going through their own tough times and uncertainties and then having to escape their own land for a while to keep their first born son safe. The first to be told of the birth of Jesus were shepherds - invited to come and see the Christ-child and then at some point later, wise men or kings.... Bowed and worshipped and brought gifts. The whole event speaks of invitation - an invitation to come and see and explore something deeper - something of God.

That is what we offer you this Christmas - something deeper. The invitation of God to come and look, come and see this Christ-child in a new light and new way - to focus back on the birth of Jesus and to consider it in relation to your own life, love and eternity. Come and join in as we celebrate His meaningful birth.

May you know God's richest blessings this Christmas and new year.

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

What a busy month November has been here at Hackthorn. Starting with a Key Stage One and Reception trip to Lincoln Castle for their history topic; designing their own shields, holding a banquet with entertainment of jesters, dancers and music too. The children walked the wall walk before looking at all the armoury and trying their hand at archery. Once back in the classroom the children then built their own motte and bailey castles from the construction materials available to them in school.

Reception children have been busy making a poppy display for the school entrance and again we all walked to the village war memorial where the community came together to pay respects and remember all the soldiers who fought for the freedoms we enjoy today. Our traditional singing of Pack up your troubles and It's a long way to Tipperary was welcomed by the community and it was lovely that everyone joined in too.

Year 5 have had bike ability training. We are pleased to say all children were presented with their certificates and badges in school by headteacher Mr Gibbons. Well done Year 5!

We were lucky to have a member of the Red Arrows display team come in and talk to the children during a special assembly. There was a real emphasis on how science and maths are crucial in the performance of all that goes into flying one of the famous scarlet aeroplanes. The children had some fantastic questions for the pilot, and everyone learnt something new.

Key Stage two have visited Gainsborough Old Hall for their history topic of the Tudors.

Our Friends of Hackthorn School have been busy. We held a Halloween disco on the last day of term which was a great night with spooky mummies being created from toilet rolls and apple bobbing, which was a great success.

We have a **Christmas Fayre** being held in school on **Friday, December 1 at 3.30pm** that our Friends of Hackthorn school are busy planning. Also Pre-school winter activities on November 30 from 1.30pm-2.30pm.

During December the whole school will be working on their DT skills. Key Stage 1 are set to look at healthy foods and will be making pasta salad, while Reception will be channelling their inner Jamie Olivers and making fruit kebabs - yum yum.

Key Stage 2 will explore different elements of DT skills. While Years 5/6 are creating their own recipes and making soup, Years 3/4 have the task of working on controllable vehicles and torches. Of course it's also a time of year when the Key Stage 1 and Reception will be busy practising their Nativity and enjoying performing this to the school and community. At the same time. Key Stage 2 will get crafty by producing some lovely Christmas creations such as wreaths and decorations.

Thanks to our Friends of Hackthorn group, the whole school is set to have a fabulous treat - a visit to the pantomime at Lincoln's Drill, Lincoln, where we will be laughing and cheering along to Peter Pan and the Revenge of Captain Hook, where the children will be able to see past and present Hackthorn pupils performing on stage alongside the professional cast.
