MINISTRY LETTER FOR DECEMBER 2025

As I write this month's letter for the December/ January edition of Signpost I cannot help thinking that Christmas will soon be here. Already thousands of Christmas cards, Advent calendars, sparkly decorations, and holly wreaths are appearing in shops, and it will not be long before Christmas trees are on sale. Churches and other organisations are already planning Carol Services. These services are amongst the most popular with Christians and non-Christians alike when churches have full congregations who go along to sing their favourite Christmas Carols.

The origin of singing Christmas songs goes back to medieval times. Then, they were sung throughout the year and not only in churches. Over the years these songs became more associated with Christmas; except during the civil war in the 1600's when Oliver Cromwell, who thought that Christmas should be a solemn day, banned the singing of Christmas carols in churches in England.

The tradition of going from house-to-house carol singing may also have its origins from during the civil war. If you have followed this tradition of carolling around your neighbourhood, you will know that at each house visited you will be made welcome and rewarded with liquid refreshments and a mince pie or two. Fortunately, carols survived the Puritans of the 17th century as people still sang them in secret and the singing of Christmas Carols became increasingly popular in taverns and ale houses. It was not until the late 19th century when the first Bishop of Truro became dismayed that the true celebration of Christmas was being ignored is credited with introducing the first Church Carol Service in Truro Cathedral, Cornwall. Many of our most favourite carols such as *O Little Town of Bethlehem*, *We Three Kings of Orient Are, Once in Royal David's City* and *In the Bleak Mid-Winter* have their origins in the 19th century.

Once in Royal David's City originated as a poem, written by the Irish poet Cecil Frances Alexander in 1848, who also wrote All Things Bright and Beautiful.

In the Bleak Mid-Winter was written by the English poet Christina Rossetti 1872, after she responded to a magazine's request for a Christmas poem. Gustav Holst composed a melody to the poem in 1906, and so a new Christmas Carol was born.

Listening to, and singing, Carols is a wonderful way to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Christmas Carols tell the story of the journey to Bethlehem by Mary and Joseph; the songs of the angels; the surprise and joy of the shepherds when they found Jesus in the manger, and the arrival of the Wise Men.

During all of our Christmas celebrations, and the singing of carols, let us not forget that Jesus was born into poverty, became a refugee and a stranger in a foreign land. Two thousand years later there are still many people amongst us who are experiencing similar circumstances.

The final verse of one of our favourite carols, *While Shepherds Watched Their Flocks by Night* encourages us to reflect on the Christmas message of joy, peace and goodwill to all.

"All glory be to God on high, and to the earth be peace; Goodwill henceforth from heaven to men begin and never cease!"



HACKTHORN & COLD HANWORTH

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

Well, what a busy start to the new half term!

Key Stage One and Reception have already been on a school trip to Lincoln Castle to help with their learning and understanding of motte and bailey castles and their history topic.

Everyone had a great time designing their own shield with colours and emblems which at the end of the day they brought home with them. They enjoyed a royal banquet, with the children taking on the parts of the royals, the gamekeeper, the jester and entertainers. The day ended with the children trying on knights' armour and having some archery training, and all on our own doorstep of Lincoln.

Reception have also made some beautiful Remembrance artwork that is on display at the front of the school as parents and visitors come in.

With it being Bonfire night this half term we thought it would be a good idea to have a fire safety talk. We had a local firefighter in school to tell us about the job of a firefighter. Years 1 and 2 learnt about the 'stop drop and roll' technique. The children remembered a lot about our fire evacuation procedures in school and learned what to do if there were ever a fire at home.

Years 5 and 6 took part in an informative fire safety talk. They learned about the fire triangle and identified sources of heat and potential fires. They watched a simulated fire in a bedroom and were shocked to see how quickly a fire can spread from something as simple as a phone (with a faulty wire) charging on a bed. All the children had lots of ideas on how to keep themselves safe and lots of questions for the expert.

Key Stage Two's youngsters have been busy getting started on their latest Design and Technology project: Crumble. This is not the kind of crumble you might be expecting from a DT project, sadly there are no delicious apples or custard involved. Instead, they are using an electronic controller of the same name. They have already constructed their chassis and axle for a vehicle base and will build the remaining part of the vehicle over the coming weeks. Their final part of the project will be to assemble the electronic wheels of the Crumble microcontroller which will then be connected to a computer programme enabling the vehicle to be controlled. An early and exciting start to electronics and engineering.

We have marked the beginning of Anti-Bullying week; our school council invited all the children (and staff) to wear odd socks to school for the day. This was to highlight that we are all different and unique and that it is important to embrace these differences. There were lots of wonderful combinations on display.

If you would like to come and see our school, we have a stay and play session for preschool children on Monday 15th December 1.30-2.30pm where we make lots of lovely Christmas crafts.
