



DOG FOULING

Why is dog fouling a problem?????

Any one who has trodden in dog dirt knows how messy, smelly, and unpleasant it is.

However, as well as this nuisance value, dog dirt can carry various diseases that adults and children can catch, the most notable of which is Toxocara canis. This is a roundworm whose eggs can be present in dog dirt. If swallowed, the eggs may grow into round worms, which can in extreme cases cause blindness.

To help reduce the risk of disease, dogs should be properly and regularly wormed. Hands should also be washed if there has been contact with any animal or their faeces.



GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Glentham Parish Council met on 12th January 2006 in the Village Hall at 7.30pm. There were 10 members of the public present and they raised concerns about the explosive sounds that have been heard on a regular basis over the village, felling of trees in a conservation area and the weight restriction on the bridge on Bishop Norton Road.

All these items will be on the agenda for the next meeting on the 9th March 2006. Complaints were received about the fireworks on Sunday 8th January 2006.

P.C. Oakes acknowledged the "speed problem" in Glentham and explained that 36 villages were covered from Welton and the "Speed Guns" were used when the Officers were able to be released from other Police activity.

Councillor Taylor's resignation was announced and Councillors were encouraged to actively seek nominations for Councillor Child's position which had been inappropriately filled.

There will be a bench placed at the corner of Highfield Terrace and Bishop Norton Road dedicated to the memory of **Dennis Knight.** If anyone has any suggestions or requests as to what the wording should be then please contact Mrs Gill Tuxworth on 01673 878639. These suggestions will be discussed at the next meeting.

It was acknowledged that there is still a problem with dog fouling and one resident was seen committing this offence and has been reported to West Lindsey District Council.

There was a request for an extra "dog bin" at the corner of Middlefield Lane and Barff Lane and the Council were happy to approve this request.

It was acknowledged that the Switching on of the Christmas tree lights was not publicised sufficiently and systems were put in place to ensure that the event is better publicised in future years if the next Council continues this practice. Thanks were expressed to Zoë and Steve Harris of the Crown Inn for providing the electricity for the lights and Mr Robert Cox for providing the Christmas tree.

Quotations are to be obtained for the pruning of trees around the beck and at the corner of Highfield Terrace and Bishop Norton Road.

The A15 Speed restriction (60 mph. to 50 mph) from Caenby Corner to Norton Place is due to be enforced from April 2006.

Correspondence was received from The Highways Department detailing the investigations into various issues on Barff Lane and is satisfied that no further measures are necessary. The situation will be monitored and Glentham Parish Council was in agreement with the Highways department and removed the item from the next agenda.

There were issues raised about the drains in Barff Meadow and the Council agreed to contact the builders. Landscaping at the top of Barff Meadow is due to start shortly. The Lincolnshire Road Partnership scheme has undertaken work from Corringham to Middle Rasen, and although it was acknowledged that further work needs to be done, it has resulted in fewer serious accidents along that stretch.

A Planning Application to convert Cherry Tree Farm, Gainsborough Road, Glentham, in to an Education and Petting Farm has been approved.

The Precept of £4896 was agreed, this figure has remained the same during the 4 years that the current Council has been in office.

SATURDAY MORNING WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE will continue until at least March. The vehicle will be on the Village Hall Car park from 8.15am to 11am the third Saturday in every month.

ST. HILARY'S ORGAN RESTORATION APPEAL

SHORA was founded in 2003 in order to raise in excess of £50,000 for the restoration of the historic organ in Spridlington Church. This organ, only one of six in Lincolnshire with a Historic organs Certificate from the British Institute of Organ Studies, is "the finest surviving organ by Thomas Nicholson", a member of a notable family of Victorian organ builders. The instrument is in severe need of a thorough mechanical and tonal restoration inside, and external redecoration of the highly decorated front pipes, designed and created to match with the interior of the church.

Two years on we can record good progress. Our current total stands at £19,792 represented by:

The recent grant of £7,500 from the Council for the Care of Churches is both a windfall for us and an indication of the wider importance of this project. This is a generous grant from a central council. We are now encouraged by the CCC to apply for Heritage Lottery Funding for the project, and a small team of SHORA members is working at this quite large task. Part of this bid will be a clear indication that we are undertaking this project not simply to provide music for church services at Spridlington, but with the wider aim of making this valuable historical and musical resource available to the community, both in Spridlington and further afield. Teenage organ scholars and the featuring of the instrument in academic dissertations are two indicators of this.

At the behest of the CCC we have engaged Paul Hale, an independent organ consultant, to advise on the project, and from a short-list of two organ builders we have decided to retain Andrew Carter of Wakefield as our preferred restorer. Mr Carter was responsible for the excellent restoration, in 1999 of the organ in Hackthorn Church, also listed as an historic instrument. If we continue to make good progress with our fund-raising, it will not be long before work can begin on this major project.

BOBBIES BEAT

You may have read in the papers last month a report of bogus Police Officers visiting elderly residents in Lincoln. To give you some advise about strangers at the door – If you are worried, call the Police. Don't be put off calling us by him saying



he is in a hurry, a genuine caller won't mind waiting. If fitted keep the door chain on. Do not part with any money. If you need work doing on your property, use a reputable company from recommendation, a local magazine or yellow pages. Only accept land line telephone numbers and a permanent address, not just mobile numbers. Never sign anything on the spot. If an offer seems to good to be true, then it probably is. Never keep large amounts of cash in the house; if you don't have it you can't give it. Consider joining a Neighbourhood watch Scheme. Contact me for crime prevention advice. If you have a good neighbour ask the caller to go there. your neighbour may then be able to check the caller out. DO NOT let anyone in your house you do not know or part with any cash unless, and until, you are completely happy and satisfied with who they are and can be traced at a later date. As for cowboy builders, gardeners, tarmac layer etc they often turn up and can be intimidating. They often say they have materials left over from a job down the road and will do you a good deal for cash. The work is usually poor and then they will ask for more than originally quoted. It has been known for the culprits to drive the person to a cash point and stand over them while thy draw the cash. Never agree for work to be done after an unsolicited knock on the door or telephone call. As mentioned above use a known reputable company. Get several quotes then when the

job is done get a bill before paying. Please be aware of vulnerable relatives, neighbours or friends and help where necessary.

WELTON PRACTICE NEWSLETTER

Firstly a very happy and healthy new year to everyone and a big thank you to everyone who sent cards and gifts to the surgery staff over the Christmas period – much appreciated.

The start of the year has been extremely busy for the practice with a huge increase in the demand for appointments which, like many other surgeries, we are struggling to meet with the resources available to us. We have taken the decision to offer reduced booked appointments in a morning only and ask anyone else who needs to be seen to come down and wait at an "open surgery". We appreciate this is not always convenient for everyone but at least we are guaranteeing to see anyone making such a request whilst retaining the afternoon and early morning bookable slots for those that cannot. It is not ideal but is a stop gap until the present situation settles and we apologize for any inconvenience caused to anyone.

We aim to start a revised appointment system during February which will mean the doctors triaging requests by telephone routinely, not just when booked slots have been taken, which we hope will allow appropriate timely access for those patients that genuinely need to be seen by a healthcare professional. Details will be available in the surgery during the run up to the changes.

During February we are also having a new telephone system installed in the practice. This will take place week

commencing 13th February and will mean changes in the way calls are handled.

One major change is a new telephone number for all calls to the surgery (with the exception of district nurses, health visitors, physiotherapists – who will retain their present numbers)

The new contact number for use AFTER around midday on Wednesday 15th February will be 0844 477 3072 – no local code needed. During the initial period anyone dialing the former numbers will be given the new number to ring. Callers will be presented with an option when ringing to go through to the right department automatically - which will include 'emergencies', appointments, ordering repeat prescriptions etc. Calls will cost no more than the present arrangement and patients will be informed where they are in a queue and also given the option to leave messages to cancel appointments. Calls out of hours will routinely be transferred to the Out of Hours Emergency Service thus saving the patient from making two calls instead of one. An option to link direct to NHS Direct will also be available out of hours. There are bound to be teething troubles and we ask for co-operation during this change which we hope will improve the overall service to patients.

Finally a request from the dispensing team – could patients please only order repeat prescriptions which are currently due – not just tick all items on the repeat slip whether needed currently or not – we are doing our best to reduce wastage in the NHS and this is one way we can make a difference.
