RECTORS LETTER

My dear friends,

A gloomy place

Do you think real people can be like characters out of stories? Some people do seem to be like someone out of The Famous Five, or The Wind in the Willows, or Winnie-the-Pooh.

I cannot imagine why people sometimes give me cards or little toys with Eeyore out of Winnie-the-Pooh. I'm looking right now at a toy Eeyore that someone once had as a free gift from Macdonalds. I use it to clean my computer screen. Poor Eeyore. I'm not really that miserable ... am I?

So on the study radiator there is a fridge magnet given me by some kind person which proclaims "EEYORE'S GLOOMY PLACE".

Sometimes the whole world can seem a gloomy place. Terrible things happen, and even when the sun is shining so much of the world seems covered in darkness. What do we do about it?

I think there are two choices. We can wring our hands, and moan about how terrible things are nowadays. Certain newspapers seem to do that all the time. I think they are out to make their readers depressed.

Or we can try to brighten things up a little, to be a spark of light in someone's dark life. That doesn't require a relentless cheerfulness from us all the time. We're not all cut out to be Tigger, thank goodness. Thank goodness indeed. I find Tigger hard work.

It's in the little things that we do to support one another, whether it's a person we know and love, a family member, or a near neighbour, or even if it's someone on the other side of the world, through a coin in a charity box. REPORT FROM GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Various matters were discussed at the December meeting of Glentham Parish Council. These included the reporting of a drain which was not performing well on Bishop Norton Road and the state of the road on Highfield Terrace. At the January meeting it was reported that Highways intended to surface dress Highfield Terrace in 2008. The Parish Council are trying to arrange a meeting with Highways to discuss this road and also the pathway of Little Hill.

The Council have applied to the Councillor Initiative Fund for a grant to have a thorough Spring Clean of Little Hill. This would enable the hedges and trees to be cut back and all the nettles and assorted debris cleaned away. The Council will then pay for follow up maintenance as necessary.

Several Councillors met with Steve Wiles, LCC Highways, on 15th November to discuss the provision of a Speed Indicator Device. Unfortunately, Highways feel that the accident figures do not justify the installation of such a device. They are going to lower a section of the banking on the main road to provide better visibility.

The Parish Council have made a request to the Diocesan Board for a faculty with regard to a clock winding mechanism.



GEOFFREY CALLAGHAN,

Those who remember him will be saddened to hear of the death of Geoffrey Callaghan, formerly of Greenfields, Glentham, who died in Shrewsbury on 15th December, aged 76. He had been suffering with Parkinson's Disease for many years.

Geoffrey and Joyce moved to Greenfields in 1990, where Joyce died in 1994. Geoffrey moved away for a short spell in 1995 before returning for a while and inally moved away, first to Retford and then to Shrewsbury.

He was born and grew up in Manchester, before joining the Royal Air Force, retiring as a Wing Commander at RAF Scampton in 1974. He and Joyce then lived in Saxilby and Heighington before settling in Glentham.

He will probably be best remembered locally for his work with the late Dennis Knight on a small history of Caenby, Glentham and Bishopbridge, published in 1992. It is hoped to produce a revised edition in the near future as a tribute to the two of them.


HACKTHORN C.OF.E PRIMARY SCHOOL

BOBBIES BEAT

Anti-Social Behaviour

Local youths keep knocking on my door and running away/throwing eggs at my window, what can I do? It is possible that this type of behaviour could constitute harassment (see Related Information). However, it would probably be best if you firstly made contact with your local neighbourhood policing team who



may be aware of other incidents and know the identity of the youths involved (if you don't). Police Community Support Officers are a valuable source of information. The



officers may be able to consider applying for anti social behaviour orders if the same youths are persistently causing a community problem with these types of nuisance activities. You should be aware that these types of problems are not solved overnight; a lot of hard work is required by both officers and members of the community to combat anti social behaviour.

There are gangs of youths hanging around on street corners drinking what can be done about them? If this is a one off incident then you should contact the police who, if possible, will try and attend and disperse the youths. The police do now have powers to confiscate alcohol from youths in a public place including open and sealed containers (subject to certain conditions). If this is a persistent problem then it could be classed as anti social behaviour and you should contact your local neighbourhood police officer(s) who will over a period of time collate the necessary evidence against the youths with a view for eventually obtaining anti social behaviour orders (ASBOs) (see related question for details of an ASBO). Unfortunately this will not happen over night, as the police and local council have to ensure that they have all the necessary evidence. However, as a member of the public you could greatly assist the police by keeping your own diary of the behaviour. Ensuring that you record as much details as possible, including times, dates, types of behaviour, names and/or descriptions.

What can be done about children who play ball games on a grassed area/verge even though there is a no ball games sign? Playing ball games despite a no ball games sign could be a breach of a byelaw. You would need to contact your local police station but you must be aware that unfortunately it will not be a high priority matter for the police, you could also try the local council.

Normanby – A member of Normanby Parish Council has informed me that they have received complaints from three Normanby residents about my piece "Christmas plea" in the December issue. The complaints were about the content and that certain words were in capitals.
