

Looking Ahead

As the winter progresses and February sees the evenings draw out - my Granny would be saying by February 5th we'll be eating tea in daylight. Tea in those days was 5 o'clock on the dot! And as each year comes round I find she is right!

Spring is just around the corner and we can look ahead to warmer weather and evenings that mean for many travelling home from work is in daylight.

Time is an ever-rolling stream that seems to go by faster with each passing year. But I make no apologies for asking if you have seen Easter eggs in the shops yet? I haven't but no doubt they will soon be appearing. Planning for Easter is starting to take shape and it's only the end of January! The season of Lent starts on Ash Wednesday March 1st and for the forty days until Easter it is symbolic of the time between the baptism of Jesus and the start of his public ministry. BISHOP OF LINCOLN'S LETTER

Dear Friends

I am writing this letter to you on a cold and wintery January afternoon. This year, the Church's calendar gives a relatively long gap between Epiphany and the beginning of Lent, and I have a real sense of being in an 'in between' time.

Being 'in between' can be an uncertain and even challenging thing - we may be in between jobs, in between school and university, in between work and retirement, in between surgery and recovering to full health. Our nation is also in between, as we wait for outworking of last year's vote to leave the European Union.

Being in between one place and another can be a time to rest and take stock; but it can also be a time of fear and disorientation as the hopes and dreams that have motivated or even driven us thus far - doing well in our last job, getting into university or safely through an operation - no longer apply. We can find ourselves without direction as we wait passively for the next stage to begin.

W.H. Auden, reflects on this in his Christmas oratorio 'For the time being':

But, for the time being, here we all are, Back in the moderate Aristotelian city
Of darning and the Eight-Fifteen, where Euclid's geometry
And Newton's mechanics would account for our experience,
And the kitchen table exists because I scrub it...

The Time being is, in a sense, the most trying time of all...

In the meantime

There are bills to be paid, machines to keep in repair, Irregular verbs to learn, the Time Being to redeem From insignificance.

Redeeming the 'time being from insignificance' is the challenge of living life in between: in between the various stages and conditions that come our way; in between the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and his coming again.

As Christians, we believe that we do not remain 'in between' forever. We believe that in the fullness of time God calls each person, and in fact the whole of creation, into his Kingdom. We redeem the 'time being from insignificance' by asking God to maintain and nourish us on our journey, and to provide us with all that we need to take us on the journey from being in between, to being with God in his Kingdom.

NORMANBY & OWMBY

NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

So far, it has been a good start to the new year. Confirmation that WLDC have agreed to change of use of the field to the east of Normanby Road, Owmby for community facilities. More details in a separate notice.

A defibrillator has been installed on the wall outside the Post Office/shop. This is now active and anyone who calls 999 will be told where the nearest defibrillator is to them, they will be given the code and then told to collect it. Apparently, instructions on how to use it are easy to understand, and hopefully an ambulance will arrive quickly as it will have been despatched as soon as 999 call received. 7 volunteers have agreed to go on a course to learn how to use it, but a date has not yet been arranged,

We are still asking for white lines, especially at junctions and on bends to be refreshed and potholes filled in.

On the down side, a lot of dog mess has appeared along Main Street. Would the owner please clear up any mess, I know the majority of dog owners are very responsible, but the minority cause a lot of distress for children, pram users, wheel chair users and walking aid users, as the mess is carried on shoes and wheels, which are then taken into their property and of course, they would find it difficult to clean. Please, clean up after your dog(s) has fouled the pavement and or grass verges. This goes for any dog fouling in the cemetery as well. Let us make our village (and any other village) a dog mess free village.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 15th February at 4 Field Lane, starting at 7.30. Anyone is welcome to attend.

RECREATION CENTRE FOR NORMANBY AND OWMBY

Normanby- by- Spital and Owmby-by-Spital Parish Councils are pleased to announce that West Lindsey District Council have granted permission for the change of use of the field east of Normanby Road in Owmby-by-Spital. This land can be used in the future as a community open space. Mr Marshall, who has also been granted outline planning permission to build up to 7 dwellings on the field has very generously donated approximately 8 acres of this land and a sum of £10,000 to begin to develop it. After many years of looking for such a site, the community will be able to look forward to having recreation facilities. In the near future we will be looking for volunteers to form a committee to help with the planning, organisation and running of these facilities.

OWMBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting of the Parish Council held 11th January 2017 the following matters were discussed: County Council- Cllr Strange reported that the County Council are very short of money but continue to make the books balance. Children's Services are judged as one of the best in the country and the schools in the area are doing well. He reported that Sir Edward Leigh has managed to secure more money for Lincolnshire schools. The schools were receiving 10% less per head than urban schools. This will now be changed so they receive the same amount. Highways continue to resurface the roads and potholes that are reported are being dealt with. Lincoln Castle has been awarded a National Geographic worldwide tourist award. The bypass on the eastern side of Lincoln is about to start. Cllr Strange reported that Government funding cuts are going to be replaced by business rates. This needs to happen soon as County Council reserves are being used up. Cllr Strange reported that he was disappointed with the SERCO issues. SERCO have been fined £1 million. It was reported that Councillors would like a medical school at the University of Lincoln in order to attract and retain medics to the area. Lincoln City Council is working closely with the University and hopeful will have good news regarding a medical school in the near future. Cllr Strange expressed the view that carrying out a Neighbourhood Plan would be a worthwhile thing for the village to undertake and would hold a lot of weight with regard to any future developments.

Public Participation - A member of the public explained that he wanted to find out if a small piece of road had been adopted by WLDC. The road needs repairing and WLDC have stated that it is an un-adopted road. The resident thought that it was adopted a number of years ago. Cllr Strange said he would follow up the enquiry.

There was a request for up to date information regarding what can go in the recycling bins. Cllr Strange to follow up and Clerk to contact Cllr Summers.

Correspondence - A letter regarding a Neighbourhood Planning Training session was circulated. Clerk to pass on the volunteers who have expressed an interest in helping with a Neighbourhood Plan. Correspondence from WLDC regarding street signs was circulated. Cllr to check if any signs in Owmby need any maintenance.

Cemetery - It was reported that work on the new foot path has been completed. Resolved the clerk to contact Green Grass again regarding cutting back the hedge.

Planning - PA134670- Application to erect 3 dwellings on Owmby Cliff Road, councillors comments have been submitted to WLDC- No further information received from WLDC

PA133521 & 133550- Playing field and S106 update. Both applications have been granted.

Playing Field - The S106 agreement has been signed and planning has been granted. The clerks from both Normanby and Owmby have contacted highways about creating an entrance. This will need to be followed up when the land is finally handed over. A joint meeting of the councils will need to be held and a playing field committee formed.

Neighbourhood Plan - The meeting was well attended and there was a core group of volunteers willing to move forward with the plan. Another meeting is due to be held in early 2017 in the school hall. Luke Brown from WLDC will lead the meeting and anyone interested in neighbourhood planning will be welcome.

Neighbourhood Watch - Cllr Mellor reported that he will bring any items which may be of interest to the village which he receives via the Neighbourhood Watch alert scheme.

Transparency Fund - The Parish Council are happy for the clerk to purchase IT equipment and undertake IT training using the grant received from the fund.

Items on Next Agenda - Risk assessment, health and safety policy, website.

NOTES ON COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 5th January 2017

The January Parish Council meeting took place on 5th January 2017, with 4 Councillors, the County Councillor, and 1 parishioner in attendance. Updates on Council matters are as follows:

Children's Playground - the loose gate post is still to be repaired. Please can parents remind children using the park that the fence and gate are not part of the play equipment.

Memorial Stone - The report has been received by the Diocese and agreement has been given for the original wording to be re-instated. The Council are now looking at costings for the project and grants to help finish the project.

Village Hall Benches - excitingly the Parish managed to secure a Tesco Bags Grant - we are now awaiting the result of voting across Tesco stores in December to see how much funding will be awarded. This will then be used to buy Benches and Picnic Tables and help with the planting in the below project around the Village Hall and Beck.

Nature & Wildlife Project - planting of new bulbs around the Beck area has taken place. Thanks to a generous donation by Gary and Suzanne Fox - the Village Hall now has new planters around the edge of the Village Green, which have been planted using funds donated by the Gardening Club. If any parishioner would like to be involved in this ongoing project, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Precept Setting - the Council resolved to submit a figure of £7,500.00, which will result in an increase on the Parish element of your Council Tax bill. The reason for this increase, in part, is a change in the way Parish Councils are funded. West Lindsey District Council has a decrease in the funding it receives from Central Government and therefore its members have decided that they can no longer award a grant to Parish Councils relating to Local Council Tax Support.

Church Clock - the Church Clock has been visited by the clock repairers, and at the time of writing the repairs have confirmed that no major works are required, therefore it is hoped that the Clock will be repaired and working by the end of January.

Finally - The Council take this opportunity to wish all Parishioners a Happy New Year!

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

Thank you to everyone who brought presents and cards for the staff over the Christmas period - they were greatly appreciated by all of us. Thank you also to the PDA for an excellent (as always) Christmas Lunch in December, again, much appreciated by all concerned.

We have experienced a high volume of staff sickness in recent weeks leading up to Christmas, obviously a particularly busy period, and thank patients for bearing with us during a difficult time and apologies to anyone who was inconvenienced by appointment changes etc.

A reminder that it would be very helpful if requests for routine repeat prescriptions could be left on the dispensary answerphone; there is no need to speak directly to a dispenser in these cases. Such messages are extracted and acted upon regularly throughout the day and it is much safer and efficient for staff to use this process rather than have to break away from what they are doing to answer the 'phone during the day.

At the time of writing we are still awaiting the report from CQC following our formal inspection on 12th September 2016. Once approved, this will be posted on our website in due course.

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Nurse Practitioner Kerry Belshaw has joined our team and part of her role is triaging requests and undertaking appropriate home visits during the week. A home visit is intended for those patients who are bed bound or terminally ill and unable to attend the surgery in any other way. Doctors can see patients much more effectively and swiftly and carry out any necessary examinations appropriately in the practice setting rather than in the patients' homes. Our Practice area is very large and it can take an hour to travel and undertake certain house calls so please be aware that unless there is a medical need for the visit, patients will be asked to attend surgery and with just under 9500 patients (and more to come!) it is no longer possible (or necessary) to routinely visit all patients who are discharged from hospital.

We are doing our best to help our A&E colleagues and trying to encourage patients to seek assistance from a pharmacist for minor complaints or ourselves where appropriate, rather than using A&E services in such circumstances. Please help us to protect our A&E and ambulance services - who knows when any of us may need them in a true emergency.


