

#### LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Dear Friends,

#### Pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Walking in the footsteps of Jesus.

The Pilgrimage to the Holy Land was a wonderful opportunity to put some flesh onto the names and places that are important in the story of our Christian faith. It was also a privilege to experience this diverse land and cultures two thousand years after the time of Jesus. Three full days in and around Jerusalem and three full days exploring the area around the Sea of Galilee made for a very full programme for 54 intrepid pilgrims from Lincoln Diocese. Each day began with morning prayer on the bus as we sped off to another site to walk in the footsteps of Jesus.

Many of the places we visited in and around Jerusalem were full of tourists and pilgrims from all over the world; from the Mount of Olives down through the Garden of Gethsemane to the church where Jesus was buried. Bethlehem was as busy and it wasn't always easy to find a quiet place to reflect on the significance of these places. Reflection has had to wait until coming home and certainly for me is still an on-going process.

Living as a Christian in the Holy Land today brings many risks and challenges. Palestinians, even though their home may be Jerusalem have to apply every three years for a permit to live in the city and a separate permit to work in Israel. These permits don't always run concurrently and can be denied at any time by the authorities. Imagine having to apply for a permit to live in one of our villages and another permit to work in Lincoln?

We visited the site of his baptism and held a moving service on the banks of the River Jordan during which we renewed our baptism vows. After this we travelled through the Judean desert, a most inhospitable area and where Jesus spent 40 days after his baptism being tempted by the devil. On the Sunday we joined the local congregation in Nazareth for their Eucharist. The service was conducted in Arabic and English. Singing hymns and saying prayers at the same time each in our own language created a wonderful togetherness of spirit. Oh... and how we needed to really focus on the words and how much more meaningful they became. We are so used to familiar prayers and hymns that we don't always take note of their meaning.

Personally, the highlight of the week was the visit to Capernaum, Jesus' base for his ministry and the journey across the Lake. Here was a distinct feel that this is where Jesus really was, the synagogue he taught in, the ruins of Peter's mother in law's house where he healed. Walking on the shores where he walked, seeing the rock on which he baked the fish after his resurrection and the journey across the lake were all powerful reminders that in this out of the way place God came among us to live as we live, to walk the same paths we walk and to share in all that makes our life unique to each one of us.

There are many experiences yet to share: the visit to the orphanage, walking the stations of the cross, visiting Emmaus and many more.

Watch out for the next instalment.

God bless us all.

At the last meeting of the Parish Council held on 10th January 2019 members discussed:

Highways - a) Footpaths were discussed, clerk to research definitive map.

b) Drainage on Main St - clerk to contact Environment Agency regarding the foul water.

c) Subsidence on Cold Hanworth Rd - clerk to submit a second report of subsidence and potholes. **Litter Pick** - after the recent successful litter pick, another one has been arranged for 16th March 2019, 10am at the bus shelter, Main Street, Hackthorn. Parishioners are very welcome to take part. High-vis vests, gloves, bags and long reach pickers are provided.

**Policing Matters** - the Police report gave details of 2 sheep reported missing from Cold Hanworth (2 heads and skins found later in a field) and possible scam phone call stating that landline and internet would be cut off. Please can all residents report anything suspicious to the police by calling 101.

**Broadband** - The Council are looking to request a quotation from Openreach to bring fibre into Hackthorn under the community fibre scheme. This needs us to indicate what level of interest there is to do this - If you would like to register interest in this potential project (the more the better!), then please forward your name, address, landline number and email to the clerk at mariawass@live.co.uk. Registering does not commit you to anything - at this stage we are seeking to understand costs, and there will be grants available.







#### HAPPY NEW YEAR!!

I have to comment on the lovely Christmas season we all enjoyed, with lots of festivities. The highlight being Santa magically appearing at our Christmas Party, taking time out from his very busy schedule to hand deliver presents to both children and staff.



We start the new term by focusing on the children's interests with the topic Poles Apart, looking at animal who live at the north and south pole. The children have enjoyed making penguins, polar bears, arctic hares and foxes for our class display, playing in the igloo role play area, pretending to catch fish through a snow hole, then cooking them over a camp fire. Of course we will also be celebrating Chinese New year, Australia Day and Burn's night

Later in the month we will be looking at a baby's first 12 months of their life, learning about how to care for them and what they eat to make them grow.

We have started our rising five sessions, these are for the children who will be starting school in September, to help them prepare for starting schools. These sessions include a P.E Lesson each week which will teach the children to dress independently, recognising and writing their name, sound recognition through phonic games and guided reading.
