THIS MONTH'S MINISTRY LETTER

Your young men will see visions and your old men dreams. Acts 2:17

Dreams and Visions

When I was a child in the late 1950s I was an avid reader of "The Girl" comic. I waited eagerly each Wednesday for it to be delivered and often missed the school bus because I couldn't put the comic down. I loved the stories about the exploits and adventures of girls who often got into a fix. Other stories told real life tales, again of women. One of these features was a series about a missionary in Nigeria called Mary Slessor (1848-1915) who was known as The White Queen of Calabar. I found the story of her missionary work fascinating and so inspirational. I was heartbroken when the story concluded with her death in one of the remote mission stations in Nigeria. For several years after this I wanted to be a missionary. It became a dream of mine but that is how it remained a dream that never materialised. Her vision of becoming a missionary had its roots in her Presbyterian Church, where her mother was a devout member. It was through her church that she trained in Edinburgh before travelling to the Calabar region of Nigeria. By gaining the trust and acceptance of local people she was able to spread Christianity by standing up for women's rights and protecting native children. She is most famous for stopping the common practice of leaving twins in the bush either to starve or be eaten by animals. Her vision of becoming a missionary became a reality and her legacy lives on in the province of Calabar where amongst other honours there is a church, a road, a roundabout and several statues of her, usually of her carrying twins. The Church of England even has a commemoration day for her on 11 January. Mary Slessor's name and reputation have stayed with me ever since.

During the past two years two young men have also proved to be inspirational to others, especially as role models to young people. Marcus Rashford and Raheem Stirling are two of our most talented and famous footballers. Both of them grew up having a dream of playing professional football for a top team and of being selected for the England Squad. If you are a football supporter you will know how talented these men are. They are regularly selected to play for England and they each play for rival Manchester clubs. In addition to this, because of circumstances in their childhood, both men have used their talent and fame to promote a vision of how some lives can be changed for the better.

Marcus credits his devoutly Christian mother for giving him "values, rules and respect for each other". His experiences of food poverty as a child and the way his mother struggled to feed the family drove him to be an Ambassador for FareShare which eventually changed the Government's policies about Free School Meals during Lockdown. When asked in an interview "are you religious"? He said "yeah, definitely, sometimes the faith we have in God is shown by the people who we are".

Raheem Stirling also had a tough start in life and has been involved in several attention grabbing headlines, often unrelated to football. Undeterred he has launched his own charitable foundation to champion greater social mobility and further education to enable young people in Jamaica and the UK to reach their full potential. Raheem recognises the influence of his Christian mother and although he says he is not 100% religious he adds that his belief is strong.

We can all dream but not all dreams come true. We may all have a vision of a fairer, better, more tolerant world. The difficulty lies in making this happen. Mary Slessor, Marcus Rashford and Raheem Stirling did make their vision a reality so perhaps by sharing their faith, God will show us the people we are and what we can become to make our own vision a reality.

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

It is always reassuring, after the great excitement in the build-up to Christmas and the holiday itself, with all its indulgence and exciting presents, to find that our pupils, far from having forgotten everything, actually return refreshed, and with renewed enthusiasm for learning!

In Science this term, KS1 pupils are learning about Seasonal Changes whilst KS2 pupils are studying Earth and Space. Year 3 and 4 pupils are studying a book called 'Hidden Figures' which tells the amazing true story of four black women who participated in some of NASA's greatest successes. Meanwhile Year 5 and 6 pupils are reading 'One Giant Leap'. KS2 pupils are also enjoying their Ancient Greece topic.

Our Christian value this term is 'Courage,' which is linked to our Hackthorn way value of 'Opportunity' and Hackthorn pupils certainly have lots of opportunities to learn new skills.

We are delighted that we have been able to resume our gymnastic sessions at Witham Hill. Our new Reception and Year 1 pupils are particularly excited every Thursday morning as it is a new opportunity for them. KS2 pupils will attend after February half-term.

This term all of the children have been working with an external specialist music teacher. KS1 pupils have been singing and using percussion instruments whilst all of KS2 have been practising chords using the school's new set of ukuleles.

We appreciate the skills that our external specialist teachers provide. Mr Bullivant and Mr Southwell continue to keep all of our children fit during weekly PE sessions and Mrs Payne increases their love of languages. Years 3 and 4 learn Spanish and Years 5 and 6 learn French. Of course our regular teachers are also passionate about the subjects that they teach and we are grateful for their dedication to prepare exciting, interesting lessons which inspire the children and prepare them with transferrable skills for the future.

We hope to hold an Easter Activity Afternoon for pre-schoolers on Tuesday 29th March from 1:30pm until 2:3pm. This is an excellent opportunity for all who are exploring their options for September 2022 to discover what our school is all about. Our pupils always look forward to welcoming all who attend these sessions, which are always very popular. Spridlington Village Hall Committee is pleased to announce that we now have a clothing recycling bank situated in the village hall car park discreetly sited on the left-hand side of the building as you come through the gates.

As everyone is aware, the last 18 months have been very hard on village halls. As a direct result of the COVID restrictions we have (almost certainly permanently) lost both of our regular weekly bookings, which means we will soon be struggling to pay the bills. Astco, the Alford-based company that has provided the bank, will pay us 30p for every kilo donated, which doesn't sound like a lot but could add up to a useful amount over a year.

With this in mind, the Committee very much hopes that residents of Spridlington and surrounding villages will consider this a useful service (no more having to drive to Welton or Lincoln to recycle) and a way of helping to keep our lovely village hall viable.

We would be very grateful to receive your unwanted clothing, handbags, belts, and shoes. (However, please do not place any rags, carpets, rugs, blankets, towels, sheets etc in the bank).





Following on from my repeated pleas to please call the Health Centre to book transport, I'm pleased to say that, in general, this does seem to be happening. As a volunteer I'm not always glued to my desk or the phone, meaning I have, in the past, had very random messages left, sometimes with no indication as to who the caller was!

I now have another very important message!

My primary concern at the moment is to protect all of my drivers, who are also volunteers, from Covid. Going forward the PDA policy for carrying patients is with immediate effect as below.

- 1) To protect patient and driver both must be fully vaccinated
- 2) Patient and driver must both wear a face covering unless exempt.
- 3) Patient should sit in the back of the vehicle unless **physically** unable to do so.
- 4) Car windows should be open, where possible, to allow adequate ventilation of the enclosed space.

I hope that no-one takes offence by this but I feel it is important to get this message across.
