MINISTRY LETTER FOR FEBRUARY 2026

When I first thought of writing this for February, I was looking out of our picture window at the beautiful January snow fall. The garden looks so clean and bright. The only foot prints in the snow at present are those of little birds, and some that look like cat paw prints. However, now the snow has gone and so has Christmas, and the New Year celebrations. As I think about what to write, I realise that from January 6th (4th for some) we are in Epiphany.

The Meaning of Epiphany is a sudden and profound realization or discovery. In a broad sense, an Epiphany can refer to a moment when an individual gains a deep understanding or clarity about something that was previously obscure or confusing. This can be related to a concept, a solution to a problem, or an aspect of one's personal life. In religious contexts, the term 'Epiphany' is also used to describe a manifestation of a divine or supernatural being. This is what brought the 3 Wise Men from the East to visit the baby we know as Jesus. The journey started when the wise men saw His Natal Star which was so bright that they realised that it must mean something special. They searched their ancient texts and scrolls and discovered that this sign definitely meant the manifestation of a divine or supernatural being. They wanted to pay homage to this Divine Supernatural Being. They set out on a journey which would take them 2 years! They would travel over scorching lands, mountainous and rocky landscapes and deserts. There were no motor cars then and so, they travelled on camels. It would not have been a very easy or comfortable journey. Riding a camel is definitely not easy or comfortable as Keith and I found out on one of our foreign holidays.

Thinking about this 2 years journey, we realise just how important those three wise men thought it was to go and worship this young child, The whole of the Christmas story is amazing. The King of Kings, God's only Son, born in poverty. The first beings to see Him apart from Mary and Joseph were the animals who were sleeping in their stable. They would have crowded around the manger, their manger, looking upon Him in wonder. Those animals knew exactly who He was, as did the Shepherds who followed bringing Him, gifts of lambs.

Then 2 year's later, the 3 Wise Men appeared bringing their gifts and homage to Him, again, knowing exactly who He was. Their gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh, the only gifts suitable or fit for a great King. Why then, do some people not believe in the absolute miracle of Christmas. Some of the children tell what wonderful presents they had, I tell you, that the most precious gift or present that we were given is the Lord Jesus Christ who came to give us Eternal Life. What more do we want!

The new term has got off to a busy and exciting start at Hackthorn Primary School, with lots of learning, creativity and enrichment happening both in and out of the classroom.

One of the highlights for our younger pupils has been the start of gymnastics sessions at Witham Hill. Reception and Key Stage 1 children have been attending for the past two weeks and have embraced the opportunity with enthusiasm. During the sessions, pupils have been able to explore a range of apparatus, including the trampoline, floor, vault and bars. Children who had attended gymnastics previously were proud to demonstrate their skills and confidence, while our new Reception children showed real bravery as they tried unfamiliar equipment for the first time. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow week by week, alongside their strength, coordination and teamwork.

In science lessons, pupils have been learning all about keeping healthy. A particular focus has been dental hygiene, with a fun and memorable practical activity using a model crocodile to demonstrate how to brush teeth properly. This hands-on approach helped children understand why good oral health is important and how small daily habits can make a big difference. The children were fully engaged and keen to share what they had learned.

Meanwhile, Key Stage 2 has been full of music and excitement as pupils prepare for the upcoming Young Voices concert. Singing can be heard echoing around the school as children rehearse with energy and enthusiasm. The excitement is building as the concert approaches, and pupils are very much looking forward to performing as part of such a large and inspiring event. Their commitment and joy for singing has been fantastic to see.

After-school clubs are also thriving, with two new additions proving particularly popular. Dodgeball and archery have recently launched and have already captured the children's interest. Alongside our established Monday Cook Stars cookery club and Tuesday board game night, there is now a wide variety of activities on offer. These clubs give pupils the chance to develop new skills, work as a team and, most importantly, have fun in a relaxed and supportive environment. It has been lovely to see children so engaged and enthusiastic at the end of the school day.

Creativity has also been flowing in drawing club, which forms part of our Young English lessons. Children have been inspired by an old favourite: Inspector Gadget. This project cleverly combined history and English, sparking imagination and discussion. Pupils designed and drew their own inventive gadgets for Inspector Gadget to use in new and interesting ways, producing some wonderfully creative ideas and artwork.

Overall, it has been a vibrant and positive start to the term at Hackthorn Primary School, and we are proud of the energy, curiosity and enthusiasm our pupils continue to show every day.

Following a committee meeting last night, 8th January, it was decided to keep the cost of a ticket for the Spring lunch to £8 the same as last year.
