RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

We've never done it that way before.

I'm really very excited. Bill Williams from Ingham, a long-time resident of the village, former churchwarden, now a lay reader, is to be ordained deacon by the Bishop of Grimsby on September 27th.

Bill will become curate in Springline, with a view to being ordained priest in the Summer of 2010. Our parishes will have a home-grown priest, and perhaps that's the shape of the future.

You might say that it's a bit like supermarkets and farmers' markets. Supermarkets bring in their produce from almost anywhere, often spending a fortune on transport. Produce at farmers' markets is home-grown and, in many eyes nowadays, preferable.

I was brought in from almost anywhere. My first contact with Lincoln was when I came to the theological college in 1985. Prior to that, Lincoln didn't mean much to me. Since then, however, I've had time to get my feet under the soil. I moved into the Owmby Group in 2000, and into Springline in 2008, and in three years' time I shall depart for retirement somewhere else altogether.

In contrast, Bill deliberately settled and made his home in Ingham. Bill's vocation to ordained ministry was nurtured in his own village, and his service as a curate will be based there, from where he will also serve surrounding villages.

I, by contrast, was sent to serve as a curate in a place I'd never been before, among people I'd never met before. It's a different way of doing things.

Perhaps the biggest rub is this. I cost a lot of money, because this is what I do for a living. Clergymen like me (the technical word is 'beneficed') have always cost, but never quite as much as we do now. It's a sign of the times. Today's home-grown clergy don't cost in the same way, because they either work full-time elsewhere, or are retired from such work. They may not have quite as much time for parish work as the likes of me, but in villages with a small populations, this usually works out.

When I first came to the Owmby Group, there were six full-time clergy in the deanery. When I took on Springline, there were still five. Now there are three. But Bill's not the only <u>locally-ordained</u> minister in these parts. He is one of several.

So there are still priests, but a different sort of priest. There are still ministers, but a different sort of minister. There is still ministry, and there is still church life, but a different sort of ministry and life. We have to change with the times, whether we like it or not.

So pray for Bill as he approaches his ordination, pray for his family, for all our parishes, and for God's guidance on new ways of being church in these villages.

And, Owmby Group people, why is this in Signpost as well as the Village Venture and the Burton News?

Guess!



REPORT FROM GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL

ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING was held on 14th May in The Village Hall at 7:30 pm. Cllr G Wiseman was elected Chairman and Cllr G Fox was elected Vice Chairman. ADJOURNMENT – A donation of land for a new Village Hall and sports facilities has been offered by Mr and Mrs Rose. A working group has been formulated to look at the viability of this proposal.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - The recently installed domestic turbine has caused problems for some residents and WLDC Planning are to visit the site. A request for a donation had been received from the Bowls Club and the Council agreed this, dependent on the Bowls Club finalising other grant funding.

CO-OPTION - The Council were delighted to welcome two new members and a letter of thanks is to be sent to the retiring members wishing them good luck in their new home. The Councillors for 09/10 are:

Cllr G Wiseman (Chair); Cllr G Fox (Vice Chair); Cllr D Wiseman; Cllr J Summers; Cllr M Raymond; Cllr N Simpson;

The Council would like to co-opt one more Councillor to bring the Council to full membership. Interested parties should contact the Clerk.

REVIEW OF POLICIES - The Council carried out their annual review of policies, standing orders and financial regulations. A new Grant Aid Policy was agreed and accepted. STEERING GROUP REPORT - Cllr Fox presented the draft Parish Plan which has been sent to CCL, WLDC and LCC and will present the plan for adoption by the Parish Council at the June meeting.

VILLAGE HALL - Cllr D Wiseman stood down as the Parish Council representative. FINANCE - The proprietor of Glentham Village Stores had agreed to act as internal auditor, the external auditor being Clement Keys. The Council approved the Statement of Accounts.

GRANT AID

GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL will receive applications for Grant Aid from any organisation which benefits the residents of the Parish. A Grant Aid form is available from the Clerk and applications must be made by October 09. The applications will be awarded on merit at the November Budget Setting meeting to be paid the following April. All applicants will be notified in writing of the decision.

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWSLETTER

It was good to see so many drivers attending the recent meeting organised by our Patient Group and we would just like to pass on our sincere thanks to everyone involved in this scheme which is greatly appreciated by the Practice team and many patients.

As many will already be aware, the on-going financial support for the Patient Group Transport Scheme has sadly been withdrawn by the local council due to cut-backs, and the Committee have reluctantly had to impose an increased charge to users to 40p per mile which is payable from the home of the driver and back for surgery journeys. A rate of 20p per mile (from and back to the home of the driver) is still payable at the moment for all other journeys under this scheme. Whilst all drivers live within the Practice area there is inevitably a range of overall costs depending upon the total length of the trip for an individual and we would ask all potential users of this service to bear this in mind when requesting transport. It should also be noted that this Scheme is not intended to replace friends and family who may well be able to transport the patient but is for those who cannot easily access other forms of transport to their appointment.

Dispensary staff are again reporting a great increase in the amount of prescription requests which patients advise need same day processing. Whilst we fully appreciate that there are some urgent needs which we will always try and respond to, our routine turn around time for repeat prescription requests is two working days to ensure that we can deal with them efficiently and safely and we would ask patients to please bear this in mind.

At the time of writing the World Health Organisation has just declared that we are now at Level Six, the highest alert for a 'flu pandemic. If this situation spirals we will be advising patients how to deal with potential cases in line with recommendations from NHS Lincolnshire and NHS Direct can advise on any queries on 0845 46 47 at any time.

During May we had fifty seven appointments made which were not kept in the surgery and had notification of ten failed hospital out patient attendances. As always, please let us know if you are unable to use a booked slot so that we can offer it to someone else.

BOBBIES BEAT Lincolnshire Police

Bonfires - We have had it reported from several residents that garden bonfires are being lit with little or no consideration to neighbours. Lighting a bonfire in itself is not illegal; it is the smoke that can be a statutory nuisance. The environmental health department of your local authority will be able to take action if the smoke from the bonfire is classed as a statutory nuisance. You need to record the details of who are lighting the fires, what time, what the effects were and your details. If the fires are very irregular then it is unlikely that the council will take any action. The council can stop the person from committing a statutory nuisance and failure to comply can lead to prosecution.

<u>Vehicles</u> - Opportunist thieves appear to operating in the area, targeting parked vehicles, sheds etc. I have said this many times before but make no apology for repeating it again. MAKE SURE YOUR VEHICLES ARE EMPTY OF VALUABLES AND LOCKED. This same advice is also applicable to sheds.

<u>Snitterby</u> - Concern has been raised about parking on the hill in Snitterby. Residents are reminded that parking should a) be legal i.e. not near the brow of a hill, parking facing correct way at night and b) parking with consideration to other resident i.e. not parking directly opposite a residents driveway causing difficulty in exiting or entering the property. Where necessary enforcement would be considered, but it hoped this could be avoided.

<u>Sheds</u> - Recently, north of the area two villages have been hit with shed breaks. In some cases nothing was stolen however damage was still caused to the small padlock. Please check your garden shed. Make sure it has a substantial padlock on it and the shed is secure. Consider buying a shed alarm from a good DIY shop. Anything valuable in the shed?...could it be kept in a garage? Could it be secured to the floor or wall? Above all make sure your shed is secure and contents are safe.

<u>Community/Police Panels</u> - Just to recap. Following Government proposals that Local Neighbourhood Policing should be a priority working in conjunction with Crime and Disorder initiatives, Police

Community Beat Managers were established assisted by Police Community Support Officer. As you will know I am the Beat Manager and Matt Trafford is the PCSO. It was proposed that "Neighbourhood Panels" be established. These would be made up from members of the community, set up and initially chaired by myself. We would hope to elect a secretary who would be responsible for minutes. My intention was to set up a partnership with representatives from the Welton & Dunholme area to meet regularly to identify local concerns or problems, and then to form further panels to cover the rest of the beat area. I felt that one panel for the entire beat of 82 sq miles was unworkable and not really "local". We would then look to members from the committee to help resolve any issues raised. These would be community issues, not necessarily Police or Parish Council ones. The idea would be to call upon all partner agencies to help provide a sustainable solution.

The three panels covering your village will consist of -

- 1) Bishop Norton, Atterby, Snitterby & Waddingham
- 2) Glentham, Caenby, Owmby, Normanby
- 3) Hackthorn, Saxby, Spridlington, Faldingworth, Newtoft, Buslingthorpe, Wickenby, Friesthorpe Snarford & Snelland,

PCSO Trafford has arranged 3 "get together" meetings, followed by the first formal meeting as follows;

For Bishop Norton, Atterby, Snitterby & Waddingham:

The Police and the community must work together to make sure property is secure and suspicious incidents reported to Police at the time.




