FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

As I write this, the Elton John concert has been and gone, the Queen's official 90th birthday celebrations are over, we are either 'in' or 'out' of the European Union, and we may have a little time to be normal before the summer holidays start in earnest. There has been much to celebrate and those celebrations are many and varied. Great though they are celebrations can get in the way of our normal routine and how often do we hear the comment "won't it be good to get back to normal."

But I'm not ever so sure what normal is. What constitutes normality for you? What sort of activities do you do on a normal day? Going to school or work, travelling, meeting people, preparing tea, cleaning windows (now that is definitely not normal for me!)... all are ordinary, normal activities and part of everyday life. Life though, can be upset by illness, work issues, holidays and all manner of interruptions which change the nature of what is normal.

Ordinary and normal doesn't mean dull or unimportant - though if it's cleaning windows that's another issue altogether! But not an unimportant one as I am always amazed at how much more can be seen when they have been cleaned! The view has lost it's haziness, I can see much further and everything seems to be in sharper focus.

"Everyday God" is the title of two books, both very readable. One written by Paula Gooder, the other by George Guiver, both books explore the nature of God being visible in the ordinary, everyday encounters of life. Encounters we have with friends, neighbours, at work or in our communities. *Everyday* suggests normal and ordinary and that is just where God wants to meet us. Paula is keen to point out that ordinary does not mean boring and certainly shouldn't be neglected.

If we have too many celebrations, life would become extremely hectic, there would be little or no time to tend to everyday tasks that are important to how we live. Those windows would become so dirty anything beyond them would be hazy and unclear!

We don't have to wait for a special occasion to encounter God, though of course we will meet him at those times too.

The church's year is a bit like this in that we are now in the middle of what is called *Ordinary Time* which occurs twice a year in between all the major seasons and festivals. Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Ascension & Pentecost - seasons that give us a particular focus on God and Jesus. To be in celebratory mood all the time is not only exhausting but the impact of these occasions would be lessened and so the church sandwiches these seasons between 33 weeks of *Ordinary Time*. To have a period of ordinary time in between the special events helps us to concentrate on the day to day relationship God wants to have with us. It also serves as a reminder that it is very much in the ordinary that we encounter God.

Ordinary Time is an opportunity for us to seek God in our everyday lives, to recognise him in ordinary activities and to be open to seeing and encountering him afresh.

I really must have a go at those windows!

God bless us all.

Dear Friends

One of the many privileges of being Bishop of Lincoln is the joy of travelling round the beautiful counties of the diocese, discovering so many interesting places and meeting more inspirational and humbling people than I could ever number. During the month of July, I will be travelling much further than usual, however: to Fiji, to represent the Church of England at an international consultation. I will be one delegate among many from around the world, all of whom will be representing their part of the Anglican Communion. My fellow delegates and I will gather from dioceses and provinces as diverse as Brazil, The Philippines, Central Africa, The Indian Ocean, Aotearoa (New Zealand) and Polynesia, and Jerusalem and the Middle East, as well as from England.

We meet as delegates of USPG, a mission agency that believes that every person and every community should be able to live a full life. I will be travelling right around the world to attend the consultation, and meeting partners who face very different challenges from our own. Many of them face daily struggles with the effects of climate (or climate change), geography, war, poverty or famine. Yet I am struck by how similar USPG's belief is to our own desire here in the diocese of Lincoln to see lives transformed through an encounter with the living God.

As members of the same human family across the world, all of us created and loved by God, we are united by so much more than the things that might divide us. I continue to pledge myself to do my part in the building up of God's kingdom in our diocese, so that all the members of this part of the human family have the opportunity of a full life, and to become the people that God has created them to be.

May God bless all his people, wherever they may be, and may the message of his love for the world continue to inspire us in the work of transformation to which he has called us.

IF YOU FLY AN UNMANNED AIRCRAFT (DRONE)

You are responsible for each flight	You are legally responsible for the safe conduct of each flight. Take time to understand the rules - failure to comply could lead to a criminal prosecution.	Keep your distance	It is illegal to fly your unmanned aircraft over a congested area (streets, towns and cities). Also, stay well clear of airports and airfields.
BEFORE each flight, check drone for damage	Before each flight check that your unmanned aircraft is not damaged, and that all components are working in accordance with the Supplier's User Manual .	Keep your distance 50 metres	Don't fly your unmanned aircraft within 50m of a person, vehicle, building or structure, or overheac groups of people at any height.
Drone is in sight at all times	You must keep the unmanned aircraft within your sight at all times.	Consider rights of privacy	Think about what you do with an images you obtain as you may breach privacy laws. Details are available from the Information Commissioner's Office.
YOU are responsible for avoiding collisions	You are responsible for avoiding collisions with other people or objects - including aircraft. Do not fly your unmanned aircraft in any way that could endanger people or property.	Permission to use drones for paid work	If you intend to use an unmanned aircraft for any kind of commercial activity, you must get a 'Permission' from the Civil Aviation Authority, or you could face prosecution. HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

What can be more fun for young children than investigating small things with more legs than would seem reasonable to the older generation? Imagine, then, how much fun most of Key Stage 2 had when they spent the day at Whisby nature reserve learning all about the things that live in the water. Theory is all very well, but there's nothing like a bit of practical experience to really bring things to life, and the undoubted highlight of the day was the 'pond' dipping session in the afternoon... which came a close second to the real joy of the detailed examination of the contents of each groups' buckets afterwards. The sheer quantity of wildlife contained in a few buckets of fresh water was staggering, but the highlight was the greater diving beetle larva caught by one team - the first one seen at Whisby in over 4 years! All the children behaved impeccably throughout the day, something which, they learned, allowed them to do more than is sometimes allowed by the organisers, who thanked them at the end for their attentiveness and keen questioning during the various sessions.

Later in the month, there was another opportunity to get 'up close and personal' with some larger and even more 'exciting' members of God's creation, when Barry from Zoolab paid a visit with his array of snakes, spiders and other things with even more legs, which brought joy to the children and other feelings to the staff! Again, though, they did us proud with their sensible behaviour when interacting with some of the animals, and a lot was learned about exactly how many legs a millipede can have.

There's so much more we could have mentioned this month, but there's really only time now for the 'Tea Party' which was organised to celebrate our Queen's 90th Birthday. Much music and singing, as well as dancing around the maypole took place, not to mention the reasonable quantity of cake which was consumed. Thanks go to the Friends for the organisation of this, which many visitors commented on how nice it was to be part of something with such a traditional feel to it.

At the Annual Parish and Annual Parish Council meetings held on Wednesday 18th May, apart from PCSO Angie Law popping in for about 10 minutes and all but one of your Councillors, not another soul turned up. Is there no one interested enough to attend to see how your Parish Council works? It was very disappointing.

Apparently there has been a problem with a drone flying around the village at night, which has disturbed a few villagers. A notice will be in the notice board and the Signpost so anyone who has a drone will know how to keep within the law.

The church wall repairs have still not been started, but we are continuing to remind WLDC. The new footpath on the west side of Main Street, which caused a lot of disruption during its construction, had to be "reconstructed". From the Big Society fund, CC Lewis Strange has very generously donated £300 towards repairs to the pathway through the cemetery.

Councillor Roy Bellamy was re-elected as Chair and Councillor Mrs Barbara Moulson was re-elected as Vice-Chair. As at 31st March 2016 there was £4,513 in the bank.

2 planning applications for Keepers Cottage, Main Street, were discussed and there were no objections.

OWMBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish Council and Annual Parish Meetings were held in the Parish Church on Thursday 19th May 2016.

Cllr Crompton-Howe thanked his fellow Councillors and the Clerk for their attendance and support throughout the year. He reported that WLDC have approved the scheme regarding the playing field. The matter is now with WLDC legal team. Normanby and Owmby Parish Councils have appointed a solicitor. When the land is handed over, a committee will need to be formed to move the project forward.

Cllr Crompton-Howe also reported that a £300 grant has been received from Cllr Strange to refurbish the cemetery path. A topple testof the headstones is due to take place in the near future.

A meeting was held with Luke Brown from WLDC to discuss the possibility of producing a Neighbourhood Plan. One person has already expressed an interest in helping. More volunteers are needed. NB Cllr Summers and Luke Brown from WLDC have expressed the opinion that it would be beneficial to carry out a joint Owmby and Normanby Neighbourhood Plan. Sadly Normanby PC have discussed it and decided they do not want to get involved with one.

Cllr Mellor raised the issue of a neighbourhood watch scheme. There isn't currently one running in Owmby. He explained that the national neighbourhood watch website is very informative.

The clerk explained that Normanby PC send a welcome letter to new people moving into the village and asked the councillors if this is something that they wish to pursue in Owmby.
