BISHOP OF GRIMSBY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

'We are convinced that England will never be converted until the laity use the opportunities for evangelism daily offered by their various professions, crafts and occupations... this being so, the Christian laity should be recognised as the priesthood of the Church in the working world, and as the Church militant in action in the mission fields of politics, industry and commerce'. So said the 1946 report, Towards the Conversion of England, commissioned by Archbishop William Temple.

Seventy years later, and a more recent report, *Setting God's People Free*, debated at General Synod earlier this year, makes exactly the same point, and asks for what it calls two major culture changes in the way we think about being and doing Church.

'Until, together, we find a way to form and equip lay people to follow Jesus confidently in every sphere of life in ways that demonstrate the Gospel we will never set God's people free to evangelise the nation,' says the report. *'Until laity and clergy are convinced, based on their baptismal mutuality, that they are equal in worth and status, complementary in gifting and vocation, mutually accountable in discipleship and equal partners in mission, we will never form communities that can evangelise the nation'.*

It is a report that reminds us that as Christians we are not just redeemed *'from'* something, but *'for'* something as well. Each one of us is called to play our part in bringing about the transformation of our world and of lives as we share what we know of Jesus in all the different places God sends us to. We gather together on a Sunday to be sent scattered into the world as Church the other six days of the week.

It is an exciting vision of what the Church has always been called to be, but maybe one we have not always lived out. The challenge for us as a diocese is how we do that now, to move from just words in a report, to actions that make a difference. Seventy years has been a long time to wait.

NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

DOGS - This is an urgent appeal to some dog owners. While most owners have control over their dogs, some do not and these are the ones who cause problems. You must be able to see your dog at all times, just in case there is someone round the corner. Whether your dog is trustworthy or not, some other dogs may be frightened if a strange dog approaches them, be it in a friendly manner or seemingly aggressive, as this can cause a serious situation where the owner sometimes comes off worse. Be it early in the morning or late at night, please make sure you always have control over your dog(s) and please do try to keep them safe in your garden, not to run free around the village and crossing roads where they could get run over.

Also, your dog should have a collar on, with a tag displaying at least your phone number and of course it is now a legal requirement for your dog to be micro-chipped.

DRIVERS - Please, could all motorists be aware of the speed they are travelling through our village. You may not be breaking the speed limit, but our roads are very narrow. Along Private Lane there are a lot of children now but some tractor drivers as well as car drivers go much too fast for the conditions, especially if there are parked vehicles. Cars parking on Main Street are also causing a problem, but some car drivers do not drop their speed to suit the conditions. Both Private Lane and Main Street have narrow pavements, so if a pedestrian has a child or dog or both with them, it is a little scary at times when cars pass them too fast. Please respect our village.

HIGHWAYS - An urgent request was sent to Highways to ask for the potholes along Private Lane to be filled in, but at the time of writing, nothing has been done.

FOOTPATH - It was also requested that Footpath No 3 - the one at the end of Chapel Lane - be cut back, but this may not happen until the middle of July.

We can but try.

MEETING - The next Parish Council meeting has been arranged for Thursday 13th July.

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

DISPENSARY - A reminder again that the Dispensary staff require at least two working days to process a request for a routine repeat prescription. Queries and non-repeat requests may take longer. The Dispensary staff always endeavour to process these requests as quickly as they can.

Patients are able to help streamline the process in the following ways:

- Signing up to electronic prescribing and ordering repeat prescriptions online - this is much quicker than all other methods as requests are made electronically and signed off several times a day.
- Leaving requests for repeat prescriptions on the Dispensary answer machine - option 4 on the telephone system.
- Only telephoning to speak to the Dispensary staff between 2pm and 4pm when they are able to have a dedicated response.
- By being aware of Bank holidays / weekends when it may take longer than normal to process your prescription and to make requests in good time.

PHARMACY2U - A company called Pharmacy2U have written to some of our patients offering their services for the processing, dispensing and posting of medication. However, there are some important considerations that we feel patients should be aware of:

- Under current local NHS rules, we are not permitted to receive requests for repeat prescriptions from these types of Pharmacies.
- The letters are using the NHS logo and Practice name without authorisation to do so.
- The letters state that we recommend this company, which we do not and we do not know how they have obtained your contact details.
- They do not deal with fridge items or controlled drugs and a separate prescription will be required for these.
- If you choose to use this company, there is very little the Practice can do to help in the event of your medication being delayed. Medicines are delivered by Royal Mail and could be taken to a sorting office if no one is home.

If you have any further queries relating to this matter, please contact Dispensary.

CYBER ATTACK - We would like to take this opportunity to thank all patients, staff and colleagues for their understanding and patience during the events that unfolded as a result of the national cyber-attack on Friday 12th May 2017. Whilst the impact on the Practice was limited due to the quick response times we were only able to offer a very limited service during this time. Everyone was very supportive and we were pleased to be back up and running by Tuesday 16th May 2017.


