LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Dear Friends

Many of us will remember the end of day at primary school. For me it was chairs on desks, hands together, eyes closed and then this prayer:

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee O Lord and by thy great mercies defend us from all perils and dangers of this night, for the love of thine only son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Then Yippy! Off to the cloakroom for hats and coats and home, free at last until the morrow. This happened every day without fail. The words were ingrained in our minds and re-enforced by Bible stories which were a part of school assembles and RE lessons.

As a child I thought the darkness was what came when the sun went down and the day was over. The perils and dangers were the things imagined, created from shadows and movements of trees in the breeze. It had little to do with the real darkness that is a part of so many people's lives.

Gradually I became aware of that darkness that comes suddenly and from nowhere. My father's industrial injury, that changes our lives; the death of Grandpa who had brought me up when dad was away in the war; the loss of a school friend. Gradually we realise that people can suffer real blackness that seems overpowering.

The darkness and despair when hope fades and we only see problems and difficulties to be faced. When our livelihoods are threatened by unemployment and the fear of losing homes, status and the inability to feed our children, meet our bills and debts. Darkness in which we can see no dawn.

The blackness that comes from serious illness, depression and the sense of fear when we or our loved ones are at risk. When we might have to face the future alone. We can easily picture so many reasons why the darkness might descend and engulf us. So many children share such experiences.

As we realise politicians seem to be floundering in the dark, when we don't know whom to believe or trust, as we see divisions that threaten our prosperity and futures, as we see companies failing or planning to leave the UK, as we hear of the health risks to so many in Africa, as conflict and aggression abounds and peace seems impossible, we fear the darkness.

As a child, the thought that God is defending me from such terrible dangers, even if I didn't know what they were, was a real comfort.

Now I take great comfort from knowing that He is there when other darkness threatens. Threatens not just me, and my loved ones, but people everywhere. No matter how deep the gloom, how great the danger, my defence is secure. The love of God protects me from the worst of the fears and dangers and I know I will, once more, be brought safely into the light. Just as I was on those dark walks home from school.

We can and must pass that hope and belief to those in need and lighten their darkness so the love of God shines upon us all.

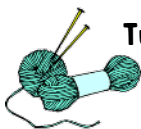

DID NOT ATTEND (DNA) - In May, 97% of patients attended the surgery for their appointments. We would like to thank these patients for attending or cancelling appointments that they were unable to make so the slot could be used by another patient. Unfortunately, 89 patients still failed to attend for their appointments which would have meant an extra 15 hours of available appointments.

CARERS WEEK - Carer's week was 10-16 June 2019. During this week we sent out text messages to all our registered carers (that have agreed to receive texts) asking them to confirm if they are still carers. If you received one of these texts, please reply to us. We are trying to update our carers register as we have some plans for later in the year and would like to be able to contact you about these.

If you are a carer for a friend or relative or have a carer yourself, please let us know as we can then add you to the register. You can do this by informing reception. If you are a young carer, then we would especially like to support you so please let us know.

We are going to have a dedicated notice board for carers in the waiting room, please look out for this for further details.

AFTERNOON NON-URGENT APPOINTMENTS - We have recently seen an increase in the number of walk-in appointment requests for non-urgent issues or those that would be most appropriately dealt with in A&E. If you need a same day (non-life threatening) appointment in the afternoon then please telephone the surgery and the receptionists will signpost you to the most appropriate person for a telephone call back that afternoon.

PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND THE SURGERY if you have chest pain, think you may have had a stroke or are bleeding and are unable to stop it - these all require a 999 call.

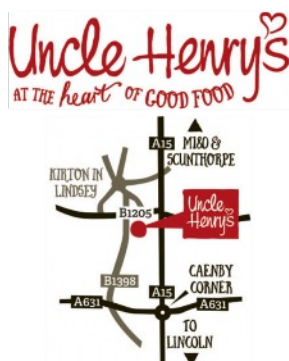

Please remember that if you leave a message at the weekend, your medication will be available from Wednesday. This is due to the time it takes to process the prescription, get it signed by the GP and order and receive the medication into the practice.

I would like to say how delighted I was to read that 97% of patients attended their appointments at the h/c in April. The PDA committee members and volunteer drivers have been working hard to get as many patients as possible signed up to the text messaging service but we obviously need to try harder! For 85 patients to not have attended, for whatever reason, is bad enough but the 14.5 hours of wasted appointment time is really sad as there are patients out there desperate to get appointments. Please consider signing up for text messaging if you haven't already done so and let's get that figure for attendance closer to 100%. We all like to think that we would never forget an appointment but clearly some of us do.

As far as the transport scheme is concerned could I ask that you try to have the correct change available. A driver will always carry some change but may have more than one pick up in the day so the correct money, or close to the correct money, would help.

Can I also remind all patients using the scheme that the charge is 40p per mile from the driver's door and return? I will always try to get a driver from the same village as the patient but this isn't always possible and you may therefore be charged a slightly different amount for the same journey. The charge for transport to the h/c is based on a fixed amount from the village in which the patient lives.

We would like to say a huge thank you to the residents and organisers of the Stonecliffe Park coffee morning on Friday 7th June the proceeds of which were donated to the P.D.A. Myself and Jan Sims went along to give our support and thoroughly enjoyed the couple of hours we spent there. What a lot of lovely, friendly people! I'm sure we have all heard about the scams which are going around at the moment but when I got news that some patients had been affected I thought it was worth mentioning in my news article. 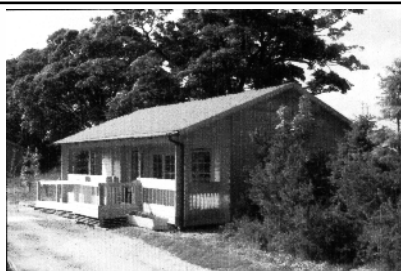
