#### **JULY'S MINISTRY TEAM LETTER**

Where on earth has the first half of the year gone? I know time is supposed to pass more quickly when you're older, but this is ridiculous! It hardly seems five minutes ago that we were thinking about the start of Lent, let alone Pentecost which we celebrated at the end of May. By the time you read this, the Summer Solstice will have passed and I always feel a little sad; like it's downhill all the way to Christmas from now on. And I hate to depress some of you as we are scorching in high temperatures, but I am already thinking about what presents I will be making between now and December. (Conversely though my sister in Australia is getting excited at the prospect of their approaching spring and summer.)

I do love this time of year especially. Though every month of the year has interest and beauty, it's hard to beat June and July for the sheer abundance of their loveliness. The hedgerows are currently smothered in wild roses, elderflowers, and honeysuckle, and along the verges there are countless wildflowers all creating a wealth of food for bees. There has definitely been a resurgence in cowslips this year!

However, in spite of this, as Vita Sackville West wrote a century ago in her poem "The Land"....
'Though the year has turned already, and, by the end of this month, the days will be shortening again, still winter is a very long way off and there's plenty of time to enjoy the summer days that lie ahead.' I'm sure that all the schoolchildren and teaching staff (and many of you) echo this sentiment and are looking forward to the summer holidays - although we could do with some rain here at the moment...

From earliest times the Church has gathered on Sundays to celebrate the good news of Jesus Christ and over time an annual cycle of Christian memory-making has also developed. This allows us to remember his life, death, and resurrection; to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit; and to recall the ministry of the holy people who have spread the Christian faith over the centuries. Through this structuring of our Christian memory, the past is able to come into our present.

Besides the seasons of the Church year that have their own distinctive character like Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honoured in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Time. Well, actually there are two periods of the liturgical year that are called "ordinary time" that join together the Christmas and Easter cycles. One is the Season after Epiphany, and the other is the Season after Pentecost which we are in now.

The so-called 'ordinary time' is far from boring though. It allows for more continuous reading from the Bible, for the exploration of other themes such as creation and the environment, and for creative responses to saints' days and the various Sundays are not connected by a particular theme. The word "ordinary" most likely means "numbered" here (think ordinal numbers), because the Sundays of Ordinary Time are numbered e.g. Third Sunday after Trinity. Even the liturgical colour of green for Ordinary Time emphasises the pastoral nature of this period. And it kind of feels like a holiday period too in the church because of this. It is quite liberating sometimes when you can preach on other aspects of the bible or church life and are not restricted to following the lectionary (set bible readings for every day of the year.)

Holidays usually mean stepping away from our usual routines and activities and, consciously or unconsciously, things take on a slower pace. We all need time to recharge our batteries especially these days when we are worrying about a whole raft of things from the rising cost of practically everything, climate change, the continuing war in Ukraine etc. But wherever your travels take you, even if it is just down the bottom of the garden or the local park for an hour, I hope you are able to take time out and have a break from the daily stresses of life. We all need to get away from

it all even briefly and just remember that if your church is bitingly cold in winter, it will be pleasantly cool and peaceful on a hot summer's day and may be the perfect antidote if you are feeling hot and bothered. Wherever your travels take you - may God bless you and keep you safe.



- This has been quite a successful year and we are keeping our heads above water despite the loss of our two regular hirers in recent years (the choir and yoga classes).
- We organised a Casino Night on 25th November last year which was very well attended.
- A popular monthly event now takes place in the form of the First Friday Club started by
  Jane and Tamsyn following the success of the Queen's Jubilee Street Party in June 2022.
  It provides a great opportunity for the community to come together on an informal basis
  once a month. The village hall committee would like to offer their thanks to Jane and
  Tamsyn for setting this up and keeping it going.
- We have a small but regular income from the clothes recycling bank and it is hoped that
  this will continue to be used by the community.
- During the early autumn of 2022 we had the main window renewed as the old frame had rotted. The cost of this was borne by the Village Hall.
- Insulation is required in the serving area of the kitchen and funding has been applied for to cover the cost of this. We hope to hear the outcome of our application very soon.

- Thanks also to the Parochial Church Council who always give a donation when they use the Village Hall for church activities despite not being obliged to do so.
- Finally a big thank you to everybody who has supported the Village Hall over the last year and to Martin Spratt for auditing the accounts.



# The Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance Delivering life-saving treatment, day and night

At a time when every second counts, the arrival of the iconic yellow helicopter of the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance (LNAA) really can mean the difference between life and death.



Covering both Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire, last year the LNAA team were called to 1,610 potentially life-saving missions. And this year is set to be equally as busy with the crew responding to 147 missions in April alone.

The crew are called to the most serious incidents ranging from road traffic accidents to agricultural, horse-riding and other sporting incidents. The

doctor-paramedic team are highly trained, able to administer advanced pain relief, carry out enhanced life-saving medical procedures and give blood transfusions. This level of care and the speed at which the pilots can get to patients and get them to hospital is crucial. This is especially so when patients need to be taken to a Major Trauma Centre, the nearest being either at Nottingham or Hull. In some cases, this really can make the difference between life and death.

LNAA operates a 24/7 service with the helicopter able to take to the skies from 7am until 2am the following morning. After 2am, the critical care car takes over, ensuring that the equivalent of and A&E department can be brought to an incident whatever the time of day.

But this amazing service comes at a price. For each mission costs on average £4,000. As a charity, the Lincs



& Notts Air Ambulance receives no direct government funding and is not part of the National Health Service. It relies solely on the generosity of the hundreds of volunteers, supporters and public donations to keep its helicopters flying and Critical Care Cars on the roads.
