RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

Into Great Silence

We've recently started hiring DVDs by post, so as to have the occasional film to watch at home. When I said that I'd booked a film 3 hours long with no talking in it, I was greeted by stunned incredulity at home. "What's the point of that?" I was asked.

It was a film which two friends I was speaking to recently had raved about, one of the best films they had ever seen, I was told.

And no, it wasn't about penguins (though that one is worth watching too), it was about monks, Carthusian monks, who live a life of silence at a monastery in the French Alps, a way of life unchanged for 800 years.

Lincoln's most famous saint is St Hugh, Bishop of Lincoln in times of Kings Henry II & Richard the Lionheart. He was a Carthusian monk, who came to this country from France first of all to establish a monastery at Witham in Somerset. This he did so effectively that King Henry chose him to become Bishop of Lincoln. Not only did he build Lincoln Cathedral, being as involved in the labour as much as any stonemason or other craftsman, but he also brought new life to a rather tired & worn-out church. He is a good patron saint for Lincolnshire.

The Carthusian way of life is very tough. The basics are very basic, almost unchanged from the middle ages, no wall-to-wall carpets, central heating & haute cuisine here, but rather bare boards, wood-burning stoves & a home-grown vegetarian diet. Solitary, silent, these monks meet three times a day in church (one these times being the three hours between 12.30 and 3.30 am), and once a week go for a walk together. Otherwise, their time is spent entirely alone with God.

Grim? Scary? Well, the proof of the pudding comes in the happiness radiating from their faces, and from as conversation (yes, there is just one) with an elderly blind monk at the end of the film, who speaks eloquently of the joy of a life spent entirely in the company of God.

"What's the point?" you might ask.

The point is that what these guys do is a necessary corrective to our frenetic way of life. Most of us couldn't cope with half and hour of our own company, let alone a lifetime of it. We surround ourselves by distractions, things to do, noise, radio, TV, possessions. We have lost a sense of rhythm in our lifestyles and a sense of purpose in our beings. No wonder that we see the world as a haven of misery.

Without knowing the details, Carthusian (and, for that matter, other sorts) monks and nuns hold the pain of the world (as, for example, in Burma and China this week) up to a God of loving, for healing. And, by hook or crook, the pain of the world finds healing. They are doing the rest of us a service.

May we too find peace in our hearts, peace in our lives, and establish peace in the world.

God bless us all.

NORMANBY & OWMBY

NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

On Wednesday 7th May the Annual Parish and the Annual Parish Council Meeting took place – there were 11 members of the public, which included several children. Cllr Roy Bellamy had sent his apologies as had County Councillor Lewis Strange and District Councillor Jeff Summers. PCSO Matt Trafford represented the Police. The Clerk was in attendance.

In the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman – Cllr Mrs Adele Crowther asked the meeting to elect and Chairman for the Annual Parish Meeting. Jeannie Fortnum proposed and Mike Perry seconded that Cllr Adele Crowther chair the meeting.

The minutes of the previous APM were read out, approved and signed as a true record.

PCSO Matt Trafford gave a resume of the recent spat of incidents in our village – they are pursuing enquires and there will be a police presence in both Normanby and Owmby. It was stressed that no matter how insignificant a situation looks like, if anyone has any concerns, they should immediately ring the police. The Police are very concerned about issues relating to the youths of our community, there is no playing field, no village hall, no transport – in fact nothing for them to do.

A long discussion followed with input from the children present as well as the public and Councillors. The result was that a Public Meeting be called – jointly with Owmby to try even harder to locate some land for a playing field and to try to resurrect the "chance to share scheme" which should make the School hall easier to book and hopefully at a more reasonable rent.

Parking outside the school while dropping children off, seems a big issue. Would all parents, who bring their child(ren) to school by cars, please use the pub car park and then take the child(ren) across the road. Please be considerate to all other pedestrian and residents who live near the school. A parked car is a blind spot to other motorist and pedestrians. More yellow zigzag lines would be helpful, but it appears the request has to come from the school. Agreed to ask Highways if an advisory speed limit of 20 miles per hour, outside the school, could be introduced.

The Chairman's report was read out and the Financial Statement was adopted by the meeting.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting followed: present Cllr Mrs A Crowther, Cllrs D Kelsey, K Green, A Carter and M Crowe - 6 members of the public and the Clerk.

Cllr Roy Bellamy was proposed by Cllr D Kelsey and seconded by Cllr A Carter to be elected Chairman – all agreed.

Cllr Mrs A Crowther was proposed by Cllr A Carter and seconded by Cllr K Green to be elected Vice-Chairman – all agreed.

It was noted that a vacancy has occurred on the Council due to the resignation of Cllr Mrs S Mundy. The notice has gone up and when WLDC advise the Clerk, the Council can co-opt a new Councillor. Anyone wishing to apply for this post, would they please write (or email) the Clerk with a short resume about themselves.



REPORT FROM GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL

ANNUAL ASSEMBLY The Annual Assembly of Glentham Parish was held on 8th May. There were 7 Councillors, 4 Parishioners and 1 visitor. Apologies were

received from County Cllr L Strange; PC D Oakes and PCSO M Trafford. No concerns were raised.

<u>ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING</u> was held on 8th May in The Village Hall after the Annual Assembly. Cllr G Wiseman was elected Chairman and Cllr G Fox was elected Vice Chairman.

ADJOURNMENT - Several concerns were raised which included potholes round the Village Hall and the Clerk was asked to get quotes for filling these in as a temporary measure. There were also concerns regarding a blocked ditch and information was given reference the Conservation Area. Mr Lakeman congratulated the Parish Council on the work they had done during the past year and asked that they continue to pursue the purchase of a field for sports.

<u>Chairman's report</u> The Chairman, Cllr G Wiseman thanked the Councillors and parishioners for their continued support. He said that the Speed Reactor would, unfortunately, not be installed in time for the summer traffic but that the village would benefit in the coming years from this device. The Chairman thanked County Cllr L Strange for his support and efforts to obtain this device for Glentham.

<u>cCerk's report</u> The Clerk reported that attendance had been excellent and there had been no resignations during the past year.

Review of policies The Council carried out their annual review of policies, standing orders and financial regulations. The new laptop, printer and carry case are to be added to the Asset Register, the Financial Regulations are to be changed to reflect the new auditors and it was agreed to arrange a meeting with LALC to consolidate the procedural work the Council have carried out.

<u>Clock winding mechanism</u> The mechanism has been installed but unfortunately the clock has not worked properly since!! The contractors have attended once since installation and are going to attend again to try to rectify the problem.

<u>Neighbourhood watch</u> Cllr D Wiseman is to arrange an open evening in the Village Hall to explain to residents how such a scheme could work in Glentham.

<u>Finance</u> The proprietor of Glentham Village Stores had agreed to act as internal auditor, the external auditor being Clement Keys. The Council received the Statement of Accounts which showed that the figure in hand at the present time is £21833.92. A lot of this money is earmarked for the payment of the winding mechanism and for the refurbishment of the play park and the Village Hall. The Council had managed its finances very well and the Revenue Budget was healthy.

Date of next meeting Thursday 12th June 2008 in the Village Hall at 7.30pm when there will be the usual adjournment period for concerns/ideas. Everyone welcome.

CONSERVATION AREA - INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM WLDC

Rules and Regulations: A Conservation area protects all trees with a stem diameter of 7.5cm or greater (measured at 1.5m above ground level) or 10cm if thinning. Anyone wanting to fell or do work to a protected tree must first notify WLDC (a section 211 notice) of their intentions and allow 6 weeks in which to do a site visit, to do a TPO assessment of the tree(s). If the tree(s) do not meet the criteria for a TPO to be placed on them then WLDC will issue a letter saying they have no objection. A 'no objection' letter is valid for 2 years, after which the process must be done again for any further tree work or if the work hadn't been done within the 2 years. Under the Town & Country Planning Act 1990, any wilful damage or destruction of a tree within the conservation area, without following proper procedures, constitutes an offence.

REMUS RODHAM

Judy Wallman, a professional genealogical researcher, discovered that Hillary Clinton's great-great uncle, Remus Rodham, was hanged for horse stealing and train robbery in Montana in 1889.

The only known photograph of Remus shows him standing on the gallows. On the back of the picture is this inscription: Remus Rodham; horse thief, sent to Montana Territorial Prison 1885, escaped 1887, robbed the Montana Flyer six times. Caught by Pinkerton detectives, convicted and hanged in 1889.

with the Montana railroad. Beginning in 1883, he devoted several years of his life to service at a government facility, finally taking leave to resume his dealings with the railroad.

In 1887, he was a key player in a vital investigation run by the renowned Pinkerton Detective Agency. In 1889, Remus passed away during an important civic function held in his honour when the platform upon which he was standing collapsed.
