THIS MONTH'S MINISTRY LETTER

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Genesis 1.1.

As I am writing this, we have finally had some rain. As a keen gardener I have been looking hopefully at the sky for weeks now hoping that we would get a significant downpour. The first swallows have arrived from South Africa and are sitting on the power lines chittering away and they always make my heart sing because not only have they made the journey back here, but I really feel that summer has arrived. This is my favourite time of year and we have so much to look forward to over the next few weeks (unless you are taking exams or have hay fever) not only in the garden or countryside but events taking place across the country and even possibly holidays.

I have been reflecting a lot about creation and its wonder and complexity recently, not just because of all the wondrous things that we experience every day like tiny birds flying thousands of miles back to the same place every summer, but just after Easter I took my sister to an exhibition in Southwell Minster called *Threads through Creation* by a very talented artist called Jacqui Parkinson.

Many of us live without faith, God or religion but we all have faith in something or even someone. Humanism is a widespread western alternative to religion. It denies the existence of any power or moral value superior to humanity and rejects religion in favour of a belief that humanity can advance itself by its own efforts. The humanist believes that human beings are the product of blind evolutionary forces, and that positions of God are merely delusions that flicker through the brains of many.

But the bible isn't the only place where you will find creation myths. Earlier civilisations like the Assyrians and the Babylonians had their own versions too (and the Babylonians certainly had their own deluge myth.) A tablet at the British Museum known as the "bilingual" version of the creation legend describes the creation of man, and animals (by Marduk with the aid of Aruru), as well as the creation of the rivers Tigris and Euphrates, of land and plants, as well as the first houses and cities.

Jacqui though firmly believes that the 'hand of God' is evident in the whole story of creation. She maintains that creation and evolution, faith and science don't have to be in conflict. I personally find it exciting that scientists continue to develop better answers of how the earth was formed billions of years ago. There are very few people now who truly believe that a seven 'day' creation was anything other than seven 'periods of time'. The amazing thing however is that those people who wrote Genesis thousands of years ago got the order of the formation of the universe pretty much spot on.

She has therefore decided to tell the story of creation and the fall of Adam and Eve and their subsequent eviction from the Garden of Eden through a sequence of twelve enormous textile panels. She says that she tries to give the faith picture; the 'who' and 'why' of creation. "The Miraculous God who speaks and makes his essence of goodness and love evident in the diversity of 'stuff'."

I haven't got enough room in this article to describe every panel, but they are truly awe inspiring. The panels took Jacqui thousands of hours to complete, and I dread to think how many metres of thread were used!! The exhibition has been to several cathedrals already, but you still have a chance to catch it if you are on holiday perhaps in another part of the country (Worcester Cathedral until the 5 June, Exeter Cathedral 8 June to 24 July, St Edmundsbury Cathedral 27 July to 3 September, Guildford Cathedral 6 September to 16 October and Ripon Cathedral 19 October to 20 November.) Whatever you believe if you do get a chance to see it (www.creation-threads.co.uk) I don't think you will be disappointed; the exhibition is truly a visual delight of colour and imagination.







THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

A Man and His Dog Go To Heaven



Take your Breath Away by Linwood Barclay

Brie disappeared 6 years ago...her husband, Andrew was away with a friend ...He has always been number one suspect, hounded by the police, and his sister-in-law



who will not stop at anything to make sure he is put away...And then a woman looking exactly like Brie is seen in all the old spots...Is Brie really back? The story is mainly told from Andrew's point of view but it does change around.

This could not move fast enough for me - I really had to know if Brie was back. And every time I thought I was inching closer to an answer the plot would swing to another narrative and I would be left hanging. I had absolutely no idea who was behind it all but I really wanted to find out.
