At the time of writing, Year 2 and Year 6 have just completed their SATs tests, otherwise known by Hackthorn children as 'Milk and Cookies' or 'Toast' week. We were so proud of their positive attitudes and perseverance during the tests. We know they have tried their best and that is what is most important. Social media has painted a bleak picture of SATs and the impact on children's mental health. The only stress encountered at Hackthorn was related to which topping would go on the toast or whose turn it was to wash up!

We have had many visitors in school recently, talking with staff and the pupils about our curriculum and our church distinctiveness. We received very positive feedback from them all and one Headteacher stated, "I am returning to my school feeling empowered with a renewed passion, having been here this morning." Praise indeed!

The summer term is always a busy one with sporting events, but the past few weeks have been especially exciting as we have added additional enriched learning opportunities to support our curriculum and to address our 'Developing Citizens of the Future' school priority. We were fortunate to virtually meet Dr Ayaz Bhuta MBE, Olympic gold medallist in Wheelchair Rugby. He delivered an inspiring presentation, sharing his journey of becoming a competitor in a sport commonly referred to as 'Murderball', which required tremendous courage, resilience, and determination. He encouraged the children to never give up when facing challenges.

Two different agencies visited to educate the children about environmental issues, involving a day of outdoor learning. Zoolab visited us again, with their amazing creatures and delivered a session called 'Climate Crusaders'. Y6 pupils attended the Church Schools' Festival at the Cathedral and KS2 pupils will be visiting Lincoln Mosque after half-term.

Over the next few weeks KS2 pupils will be preparing for their summer production. They have already been practising some of the songs, but the title of the production is still top secret.

We are excited about meeting our new starters. We hope that the children can cope with lots of exciting opportunities because that is what we offer at Hackthorn. The Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance Delivering life-saving treatment, day and night

At a time when every second counts, the arrival of the iconic yellow helicopter of the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance (LNAA) really can mean the difference between life and death.



Covering both Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire, last year the LNAA team were called to 1,610 potentially life-saving missions. And this year is set to be equally as busy with the crew responding to 147 missions in April alone.

The crew are called to the most serious incidents ranging from road traffic accidents to agricultural, horse-riding and other sporting incidents. The

doctor-paramedic team are highly trained, able to administer advanced pain relief, carry out enhanced life-saving medical procedures and give blood transfusions. This level of care and the speed at which the pilots can get to patients and get them to hospital is crucial. This is especially so when patients need to be taken to a Major Trauma Centre, the nearest being either at Nottingham or Hull. In some cases, this really can make the difference between life and death.

LNAA operates a 24/7 service with the helicopter able to take to the skies from 7am until 2am the following morning. After 2am, the critical care car takes over, ensuring that the equivalent of and A&E department can be brought to an incident whatever the time of day.

But this amazing service comes at a price. For each mission costs on average £4,000. As a charity, the Lincs



& Notts Air Ambulance receives no direct government funding and is not part of the National Health Service. It relies solely on the generosity of the hundreds of volunteers, supporters and public donations to keep its helicopters flying and Critical Care Cars on the roads.






