To finish, I came across the following little poem by John Betjeman which spoke to my soul.


In a Bath Teashop

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

What an exciting three weeks we have had at Hackthorn, thanks to our very own Hatchery. The whole school has been watching the eggs turn in our incubator, and then we all enjoyed watching our first chick - which named 'Triggy' - hatch... thanks to the wonders of zoom and record!

The pure joy and delight on the children's faces has been wonderful to see, and some Year 6 children have commented "they have waited their whole life for this day".

In total we have had six chicks hatch and they have been named and cared for by the whole school, but especially by the Reception children; with every cheep and chirp they ran to check on them and make sure they had enough food and water.

Taking our children's interest in chickens, the whole school has benefited from this and a BIG thank you to The Friends of



Hackthorn School for funding the use of the incubator.

Key Stage 1 pupils are busy with their English. Although their book is a fiction book, their learning has taken them to non-fiction books and they are researching facts all about whales. Some of the children have been so inspired that they have taken this learning home, bringing in fact files that they have created in their own time. They are also busy working on their compositions of music, focusing on digital pulse and rhythm, for which they are enjoying using the computers.

Key Stage 2 youngsters are busy practising the songs for their production 'Shakespeare Rocks', which will be performed on June 19 and 20 (get your tickets from the school office).

Key Stage 2 are working on Volcanoes in their English lessons and have been finding out all about Pompeii and some interesting facts which they have shared in Good Work Assembly. They have also produced some fantastic pieces of descriptive writing that we have all had the pleasure in sharing during our Friday assemblies.

The Year 6 pupils have been preparing for toast week (SATS), with the most important decisions being what their toppings would be and 'could they have strawberries?'!

School Council wrote a letter to the Friends of Hackthorn School asking for some money to help buy plants to brighten up the front area of our school, and have been busy planting so there is colour all year round.

We have also started our annual swimming lessons, where the whole school gets on the bus with all the younger children buddying-up with an older child. It's lovely to listen to them chatting on the bus and the older children taking care of their younger buddies: A Hackthorn tradition of which we are very proud.

Spridlington Village Hall Committee

The Annual General Meeting of the Spridlington Village Hall Management Committee was held on Wednesday 01 May 2024.

The Chair's Report made the following points:

- The PCC was thanked for its continuing support, and Martin Spratt for auditing the accounts once again.
- Our application for grant funding from Grange Farm Energy was successful in the sum
 of £2.500, which was used towards the cost of insulating the roof spaces in the kitchen
 and serving area and replastering the ceilings. This has made these areas much more
 pleasant to use in the colder weather.
- A successful coffee morning was held on 30th September.
- The First Friday Club continues to be well-supported and the regular income from this is very much appreciated.

The Treasurer presented the audited accounts and reported that:

- Income from fund-raising was down from last year but receipts from hall hire were up.
- Expenditure on electricity has risen considerably over the year, but water charges have reduced following the detection and repair of a leak in the disused outside toilets.
- The clothing bank earned £138.00, and interest was earned on money invested in a Bank bond.
- All in all, a satisfactory year with a surplus of £400.00.

Three members of the public attended the meeting and during the open discussion the following points were raised:

- The committee is now down to 4 members, which makes putting on functions difficult. If the village hall is to be sustainable in the future, new members will need to step up in the next year or two as the current long-standing members will be retiring.
- It was suggested that we try to find a pilates or yoga group to replace the one that folded during the pandemic.
- We could look into having a small farmer's or craft market in the car park, and making
 use of independent food vans to cater for events.

We are very pleased to report that Anne Moore, who attended the meeting as a member of the public, has agreed to join the committee and we look forward to welcoming her to the next committee meeting in June.

Neighbourhood Plan

Normanby-By-Spital does not currently have a Neighbourhood Plan and the Parish Council has been asked by West Lindsey District Council to ascertain whether villagers would like to proceed with one. At this moment in time Normanby-By-Spital has been designated to have a plan on its own, it is a single plan for one village as the area designated by West Lindsey is for Normanby only.

We would like to ask for feedback if villagers would like to see a plan and if there is an appetite to form a working party of villagers to start a plan

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A Neighbourhood Plan provides the opportunity for a community to set out their vision for how they wish for their local area to develop over time. What type of housing the community needs to grow and where and how this could be achieved with a planning policy? This vision becomes a detailed wish list that is drafted into a formal document. Their are 8 steps to be followed to achieve a Neighbourhood Plan and funding can be applied for to cover the costs of consulting with villagers and employing professional consultants who can assist you along with the support of West Lindsey District Council.

Where Do You Start with a Neighbourhood Plan?

Step 1 - Is to decide on the designated area. This has already been achieved. Normanby Area.

Step 2 - To carry out a Public Consultation and this can be via a public meeting and or a questionnaire - Normanby By Spital Parish Council are happy to facilitate a meeting or questionnaire to obtain feedback if there is an appetite for a plan.

Step 3 - We are looking for interested individual villagers to start up a Plan from scratch. Some Parish Councillors are happy to help and support but we are looking for people within our community with an interest in planning or the ability to learn and LEAD this project with the help of various organisations.

The Benefits of a Neighbourhood Plan

A Neighbourhood Plan allows a community to come together and have a voice.

It can address issues of where development should be and what type of development is it.

A Plan should influence planning decisions made by the Local Authority.

A grant is applied for to cover costs - so the only cost should be that of villagers' time.

So the Question is: Does Normanby want a Neighbourhood Plan? If so, we need you to volunteer.





We can't unfortunately accept cake sellers as we have our own cake stall, and no hot food sales in the hall! We also have our own raffle and tombola.


