FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear All,

I was interested to hear of a recent claim that apparently one in four adults in the UK think that the story of Superman can be found in the Bible. I seem to recall first hearing of this as part of a review of the daily newspapers on the radio and I thought at the time that there must surely be more to this interesting headline than first appeared, and so it proved. The headline had been drawn from some new research conducted by Bible Society UK and had done a fine job of getting this research noticed.

As the proud owner of some Superman slippers (a Christmas gift from my children!) I thought that I would do some of my own research into this story, and it would seem that 'When asked to identify storylines that could be found in the Bible, Superman's plotline, described as "A hero from another planet with super powers on earth saves lives and the world from disaster", scored highly with parents who thought they could find that story in the Bible'. The point of the research had been to encourage greater numbers of people, of all ages, to open their Bibles and discover its great texts.

According to the study, 23% of children said they had never read, seen or heard Noah's Ark and 25% had never heard the Nativity story, and yet one in three adults thought that it was important to read Bible stories to their children. It all makes for interesting reading, and I feel that the study is timely as we approach Lent and seek to make use of the opportunity for special reflection and preparation.

As well as our regular Sunday services and gatherings on Ash Wednesday (in the morning in the Owmbly Group and in the evening in the Springline Parish), I am hoping that there will be a series of walks that will take in some of our villages and communities. As I write we were still confirming the routes and the times for these walks but details will be forthcoming and I hope that they will offer us an opportunity to take some time out together and to learn more about ourselves and our location. Not everyone will wish or be able to join in on these walks but I hope that everyone will feel a part of them, whether that be in seeing us off or welcoming us home, praying for us or taking comfort that as we walk prayers will be offered for all who live, work and serve in our communities and visit here.

There is great power to be found in recognising that God walks alongside us in all things, and so this Lent I hope that you will sense Father, Son and Holy Spirit as we all make that Lenten journey again.

BISHOP OF LINCOLN'S LETTER

Dear friends,

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent, traditionally seen as a time for prayer and penance in the church; a time for drawing aside and reflecting on our Lord's journey to the Cross and our own journey as Christian people.

As we seek to move forward together as a faithful, confident and joyful diocese, Lent provides an ideal opportunity for us to clear away some of the clutter that can get in the way of that making those things a reality in our own lives. Lent gives us a structured framework in which to stop, to pray, and to reflect on the things that stand between us and God; between us and each other; between us and the best of who each of us is.

That is not always an easy thing to do. It can take us to uncomfortable places as we uncover things about ourselves that we would rather remained hidden, or are reminded of the broken-ness and cruelty that mar God's world.

On Ash Wednesday many of our churches will hold services which include the imposition of ashes. If you have the opportunity to attend one of these services, I encourage you to do so. The ash is also a symbol of what is left when everything else has gone and things are laid bare. Their imposition on our foreheads is a powerful reminder of our own vulnerability and of the ways in which we fall short of all that God intends for us.

But Ash Wednesday is only the beginning of the Lenten journey. Jesus' journey to the Cross will be transformed into the Easter joy of the resurrection - a transformation which shows the world that God's power is made perfect in weakness.

That possibility of transformation is the basis of our hope as disciples of Christ. It is the light that shines even when all seems darkest in our own lives and in the life of the world. We need not fear: the God who endured the pain of death on the cross is the same God whose love and forgiveness are freely offered by God to each one of us.

We are not alone; the light shines in the darkness.

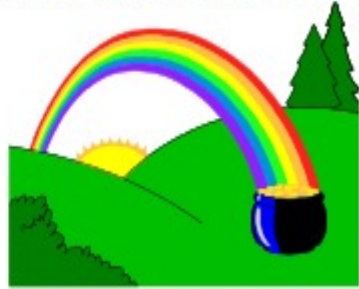

LENT COURSE 2014

The subjects covered in the course will include Believing and Doubting; Jesus - our Teacher; Jesus - our Saviour; Jesus - Conqueror of death; and Jesus - Lord and Brother. All are most welcome.

Help LIVES to save lives

LIVES (Lincolnshire Integrated Voluntary Emergency Service) wants to make sure that any person who becomes acutely unwell or injured in the Spridlington Group area (Glentham, Normanby, Owmbly, Saxby & Spridlington) will receive rapid emergency care within 6 minutes of dialling 999. LIVES First Responders are specially trained volunteers and are often the first on the scene following a 999 call. They attended over 14,000 999 calls last year, saving almost 250 lives in Lincolnshire. LI Responder Volunteers to help with their life-saving service in the Spridlington area. Any person over 18, with a car, in good health and living locally can be trained to provide basic life support, relatively simple skills that do save lives.

First Responders work in partnership with EMAS (East Midlands Ambulance Service), with two dedicated LIVES desks at ambulance control. When a 999 call comes in, the controller contacts the nearest on-call LIVES Responder, who is usually able to arrive at the scene within five to six minutes of the call. Those first few minutes before or during an emergency such as a stroke or heart attack are critical for someone's recovery or even survival.

Sally jumped up as soon as she saw the Surgeon come out of the operating room. She said, "How is my little boy? Is he going to be O.K.? When can I see him?"

NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the last meeting, held on 5th February 2014, 2 Councillors were absent, but it was very good to see District Councillor Jeff Summers and County Councillor Lewis Strange. No members of the public attended.

WLDC have been awarded the Best Waste Service Collection in England for the second year running. Thank you to all residents who made this possible by sorting out their rubbish.

The energy created (and then sold on to the National Grid) from the waste plant run by Lincolnshire Council is bringing in extra revenue, though £150 million still has to be cut from their budget. Ways are being looked into to improve the rail network, with a better service provided for trains from Lincoln to London in particular.

Highways say that repairs to Private Lane are still ongoing and hopefully will be resurfaced properly this year (maybe).

Due to the inclement weather, the cemetery

gate has not yet been repaired, but on the bright side, two new volunteers have come forward to train as First Responders - one from Normanby and one from Glentham.

Possible grants are being looked into to repair the war memorial, though no decision has been reached as to who we will use to do the repairs.


A joint meeting between Owmbly and Normanby will be arranged shortly, to discuss the way forward regarding the possible playing field.

We are still working on how best to improve the grass verges along Main Street.

Let us all hope, that by the time this issue comes out, we shall have forgotten the wind and rain and be experiencing spring like weather. Take care everyone.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on March 19th, though the venue has not been decided.

NOTES ON COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 6th FEBRUARY 2014

Councillor John Youngson Summers has regretfully decided to leave the Council due to a number of calls upon his time. Sincere thanks go to John for his work and guidance over the years. A **vacancy** now exists for a replacement and applications are invited. No special skills are needed, just a desire to 'make a difference' in your community for the benefit of all. Anyone interested should contact any Councillor or the Clerk (details below) who will be glad to explain what is involved.

The current **Parish Plan** will expire this year and moves are in hand to renew it for a further five years. The aim is to build on the work so admirably done on the original plan and members of the public are invited to become involved, either to participate in its renewal or to help with delivering questionnaires, or simply to give opinions and advice. A speaker from Community Lines will address the Council meeting on 3rd April with recommendations as to how to proceed, and the general public are warmly invited to come along and hear what she has to say.

Traffic speeding has long been a bone of contention to residents, and the Parish Council recently invited PC Martin Doherty to give some help in this respect. Martin has accepted

fully that there is general concern and has undertaken to make roadside speed checks at irregular intervals, backed up by appearances of the mobile speed detection van. Martin also took the opportunity to explain that, despite being thin on the ground, the police response team continues to provide a 98% achievement in a 20-minute response time in rural areas, and the public are urged to report all suspicious activities.

Notification has been received that Councillor Adam Shaw's application for a grant to restore the **Church clock** has been successful. Once permission has been obtained from the Church authorities, work can proceed.

Fund raising for a **defibrillator unit** has begun: Councillor Sarah Shaw has organised a number of quiz nights, and with the help of the Crown Inn and other donors, the fund currently stands at £322. Future quiz nights are planned, and together with money granted by Councillor Lewis Strage, the target of £1,000 should be achieved this year.

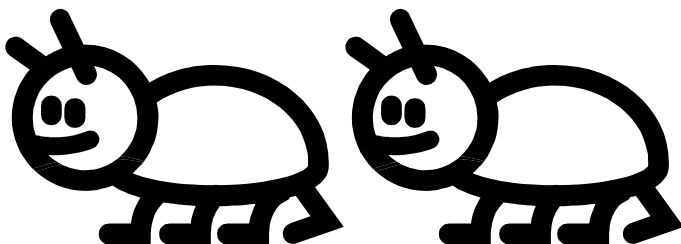

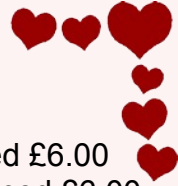

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

Since our last report there has been increased media interest in the imminent Care.data extraction which is the automatic extraction of patient data from the electronic GP medical records due to start in early spring. A leaflet has been sent from the government to every household informing them of the rationale behind the extraction but we know that some patients are still unaware of the fact that their data will be extracted unless they give specific instructions to their GP to do otherwise. Practices are not able to opt out of providing the data so it is vital that patients understand what is involved and any patient wishing to opt out may complete one of the forms available in the surgery or write directly to us stating what their preference is. The decision may be reversed by the patient at any stage but obviously objecting once information has already been taken would only prevent any new data being extracted.

Thank you to all patients for the feedback on the changes we made to our appointment system in September last year. These included moving the open access surgery from 11am to the earlier start time of 8.30am and increasing the amount of pre-bookable appointments and reducing the "on the day" booking slots as a direct result of patient feedback with patients who need to be seen or given urgent advice being contacted by the duty doctor during the day and seen or give

advice as deemed appropriate. Whilst some patients have given us very positive feedback, we are aware that many patients do not like some of the changes made and we are collating the feedback and reviewing the situation and wish to assure patients that we are aiming to respond as quickly as possible to improve the situation where we are able. We are conscious that as the village expands the demands on our services can only increase. As the average patient now consults a doctor 8 times per year, with a list size of almost 9400, it is easy to see why surgeries are always busy, even though we have the equivalent of four and three quarter full time doctors working in the practice on a regular basis plus the registrars who are training to be GPs. Numerous meetings, administration, telephone consultation, case conferences, preparing/delivering tutorials to the registrars, professional study days etc all have to be factored into the week for each GP as well as routine surgery appointments. All of our rooms are in daily use by various members of the team and the option of expanding our staff or premises is very limited. However, we remain committed to respond to patient feedback and welcome suggestions to improve access generally and aim to report back positive changes in the next newsletter.

PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOLS



We are getting more and more complaints about irresponsible parking whilst dropping off and collecting children from schools. This is a common complaint across the county especially during winter months during adverse weather conditions; however it's during these winter month's that the risk to all road users and pedestrians is increased due to reduced vision caused by the adverse weather and reduced light.

All drivers please be aware that children are very small and thus more difficult to see amongst parked vehicles and busy junctions. When parking please ensure that you park responsibly and legally.

I remind you that it is an offence to park as shown below:

- Over a dropped kerb
- Within 32ft of a junction (or within a junction)
- On yellow zig zags (during school drop off and collection times)
- On Footpath/grass verge
- On double yellow lines

As well as your own children's safety please think about other pedestrians; some of whom may have sight or physical difficulties and may have guide dogs or mobility aids which are hindered by parking irresponsibly.

Pedestrians with pushchairs or wheel chairs are obstructed by preventing them from crossing the road in a safe place if you obstruct drop kerbs as well obstruct their vision to judge when its safe to cross.

So before you stop to 'drop off' or 'collect' children, or 'park' your vehicle please consider if you are committing any offence or increasing the risk to other community members as this is liable to you receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice.
