FROM THE RURAL DEAN

As you read this, we will have just begun the season of Lent. Lent is taken from an old English word which means 'lengthen' - as it is observed in Spring when the light in the day lengthens. I don't know about you, but January felt like a very long month to me and it's lovely, and quite a relief to see the days lengthening, snowdrops in full glory and sunshine.

Over the season of Lent it's traditional to fast and focus. It's a season of preparation. In my Lent reflections this year I will be reading and reflecting on a book called 'Failure'! It doesn't sound like a barrel of laughs does it, but actually it does strike me that our attitude to failure can shape us. We fail every day (I don't think it's just me!). We fail in small things and big things and sometimes small things that lead to big things so, for example - I am not great at getting out of bed in the mornings, so I fail to get out of bed on time, which leads to me being rushed, forgetting things, missing something I should have noticed - not giving time to someone and so often the failures can heap one on top of another.... But what do I then do with that.... well, there are options:

- Cut myself some slack and do nothing;
- Beat myself up and decide I am useless;
- Learn from it and make better decisions in future;
- Accept that failure is part of life and move on;

There is another thing isn't there? We hate it when people see us fail - it feels humiliating - it makes us feel 'less than' the person we are. It makes me wonder - as we approach Good Friday and Easter - how Jesus felt as he approached the cross. The one who claimed to be the Messiah, Son of God, Saviour ends up in the ultimate humiliation of dying on a cross. Did it feel like failure? Was it failure? The cry of Jesus on the cross: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?", betrays perhaps that it felt like failure - the resurrection, though, shows us that the crucifixion was actually the pathway to success.

Maybe, just maybe, we need to look at our failures differently - that they aren't the end and a disaster, but that, if we allow ourselves to walk through them and learn from them, they become the pathway to success. It's true isn't it - the way we deal with failure and our attitude to it, shapes who we become.

Changes to voting at polling stations in West Lindsey from May 2023

Residents in West Lindsey will need to bring photographic ID if they choose to vote in person at the elections in May.

The new changes, which are being rolled out nationally, have been introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act, which was passed last year. It comes into effect for the first time this May and relates to voting in person, it does not impact postal voting.

All seats on West Lindsey District Council and both Town and Parish Councils throughout the district are up for election.

Ian Knowles, Returning Officer at West Lindsey District Council, is urging people to understand the changes now so that residents can elect the candidates they want to represent them and their interests locally in May.

He said: "For the first time in the district, people are being asked to provide an accepted form of ID to be able to vote in the West Lindsey local elections on 4 May and the town and parish Council elections. It may seem early but checking now means you will be ready to vote in May.

"Residents who do not have one of the accepted forms of ID can apply for free ID either online or by completing a paper application form and sending this to West Lindsey District Council's electoral services team.

"If you need any help with applying for the free ID or want to request an application form, you can contact the electoral services team on 01427 676576 or ereg@west-lindsey.gov.uk." Residents will need to ensure that they are registered to vote in the elections, which only takes five minutes to register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote and that they have the right form of ID if voting in person.

Ailsa Irvine, Director of Electoral Administration and Guidance, said: "Anyone voting at a polling station in England this May will need to show photo ID before they can be given their ballot paper. It's important that everyone understands what types of ID they can use, and how to apply for free ID if they need it. You can find information about the new requirement and what to expect at the polling station on the Electoral Commission's website."

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA or Commonwealth drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk/ or by completing a paper form. Please do not leave this too late to get one in time.

The full list of accepted ID is available on the Electoral Commission's website, along with more information about the new requirement and details of how to apply for the free ID, at electoral commission.org.uk/voterID.

Our Good Works assemblies have always been well attended but the turnout at our second hybrid one was exceptional with a few parents tuning in from their work abroad. Reception pupils shared their learning about Chinese New Year. Their enthusiasm was infectious. They thoroughly enjoyed participating in the Chinese food taste test and were amazing using chopsticks. They all tried every type of food...the noodles were the most popular, but opinions

were divided over the lychees! Making Chinese fireworks was a real hit but the pièce de résistance was when they walked into the KS2 classroom dressed as a Chinese dragon. The older children thoroughly appreciated their efforts and cheered them on, which was wonderful to witness.

We have enjoyed listening to an eclectic range of music during assemblies. We added Chinese Music to our plans and were intrigued by the different types of instruments. The children were particularly interested in the erhu and sheng.



Shrines of Gaiety by Kate Atkinson

A story about people; incredible characters converging on 1920s London. Nellie Coker is larger



than life; a woman with a large family and several Soho clubs where girls dance, men drink and there is a world of behaviour between the sparkle and the shade..Nellie has served her time courtesy of HM and knows that the boys in blue are out to send her back inside! She's ruthless and determined to pass her empire on to her children. Into this seamy world two young girls arrive from 'up North' runaways. They are young and naive and it's only a matter of time before they fall into the path of corruption - will it come via Nellie or the Police? Then there's the fabulous Gwendolyn who leaves her library to look for the girls.

1920s London and seamy Soho were brilliantly recreated. Atkinson cleverly wound the stories around each other, drawing them closer. The timeline moves backwards and forwards, deliberately vague which adds to the mystery as bodies are discovered in the Thames and you're on tenterhooks, fearing the worst. With everyone spying on each other, this was at once comical and terrifying!

Atkinson has created some fabulous females here - Fleur, a slip of a girl with steely nerve; Nellie, plump and aging who shuffles around with the air of having lost the plot when actually she is in totally command; Gwendolyn gutsy and capable...

Atkinson, rather like Nellie, keeps tight control of a huge cast and numerous locations whilst weaving in some fabulous comedy into a story which shines a spotlight on human depravity and corruption.
