MARCH'S LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Spring is upon us and we are already seeing visible signs of that. Its actually my favourite time of year - new life in so many ways, and the church, currently in Lent is preparing to celebrate new life in Christ through our Easter celebrations.

Nature is amazing isn't it! Over this last few weeks I have been thinking a lot about trees. I have three very large (well maintained) beech trees in my garden and they overhang the road - they always bother me when we experience big winds like we have in the last couple of months. I am bothered by them and equally astonished by the way they hold up in the gales. I actually find trees fascinating because one of my favourite psalms, Psalm 1, uses the image of a tree to illustrate a healthy spiritual life. That psalm speaks to me about the laying down of roots in places where the ground nourishes them. It is an image for me of laying firm roots into God; but even if you are not a God-believer, for all of us laying down roots into places that nourish us is healthy for life - laying down our roots, for example, into love.

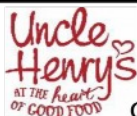
Trees I think are an amazing image for us, because they speak to us of life. There are seasons in our lives - seasons of fruitfulness, seasons of lack, seasons when we are less visible, when things are happening in the backgrounds of our lives to prepare us for something in the future, and there are seasons of pruning. Trees can become overgrown and unwieldy. Our lives our like that too, sometimes we need to stop doing some of the things that we are doing into order to enable other things to flourish.

The church is, I believe, going through a period of pruning. A period when we need to carefully pray and think about what God is doing among us, accepting what is working and what isn't, and looking for signs of new growth to encourage and nurture. Pruning is painful, but in the end, if we are to grow again, we have to bear the pain before new life comes - and that too, is the message of Easter - after crucifixion, comes resurrection.

Another busy month in Hackthorn School.

Pupils in Key Stage One have now come to the end of their gymnastics sessions for this year, and we have seen huge improvements in both skill and confidence.

From the first week, when tentative steps were taken to either jump in the foam pit or balance on the beam, to now running and completing a star, tuck or pencil jump into the pit and jumping over bean bags on the beam shows great perseverance (this term's school value) and dedication to their learning.

Years One and Two have been studying science and geography, the topic being weather. The children became obsessed with recording the daily weather patterns and the recent snowfall causing huge excitement.

They have also been busy making a class poetry book in the style of Shirley Hughes, all about the weather.

Reception pupils have been busy learning all about shape; looking at everyday objects with shapes in them and then moving on to 3D shapes. They had great fun going on a shape hunt around the classroom and showing off their findings in a Good Work Assembly to the parents.

Reception children have also enjoyed showcasing their talents on a Wednesday afternoon, performing in the classroom singing along to musicals and making good use of the stage in their role play area.

Key Stage Two youngsters have been using their hockey and lacrosse skills in PE, with great listening skills and practical skills using equipment.

They have also been studying Claude Monet, and have recreated the famous painting Waterlilies. With only primary colours available to them, they used red, yellow, white and blue, and were each given a square to work on. When completed what was put together is a masterpiece in itself, with some fantastic colour mixing by all children.

Key Stage Two children also attended Young Voices on the last day of term at Sheffield Arena. It was a long day, but the children sang their hearts out and a good time was had by all children and staff.

Breakfast and after school club have been using origami skills and the displays made by the children are beautiful and on display in the corridor for visitors to admire.

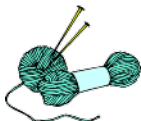

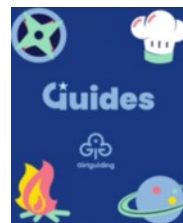
