BISHOP OF GRANTHAM'S LETTER

Dear Friends

Many of us will have experienced moments of awful isolation in our lives, or of panic, or of sheer joy. The range of situations, and of emotions, to which we can be exposed is huge. These things help to form the richness of human living. But in themselves they can sometimes be immensely difficult to handle.

Jesus' promise was to be with his friends. Although they experienced the crushing sadness of his death, and the huge sense of betrayal that most of them felt in terms of their own abandonment of him, they also experienced the joy of his resurrection and the happiness of new times spent with him. They would naturally have understood that his promise to 'be with them' meant that he would not physically leave them.

However, what Jesus meant when he said that they would not be left on their own was that the Holy Spirit would always be with them. It is the Spirit, the third Person of the Holy Trinity, that we celebrate during the month of May. Jesus is taken from us, body and all, but the Holy Spirit is poured out for us and on to us.

The Feast of the Holy Spirit is Pentecost. It happens at the end of Eastertide, and thus marks the very last transition that began weeks before when, on Ash Wednesday, we entered the wilderness in preparation for Holy Week and Eastertide to come.

Coming 'at the end of things' Pentecost can sometimes seem to be almost an afterthought - a last gasp of celebration before the year turns fully green and 'normal time' resumes. I suggest that we should, however, try to see it as another moment of real transition, when, gifted with the Holy Spirit, God's people realise that they have all that they need in order to live their lives fully and without fear in the world.

The Holy Spirit is described in scripture as 'advocate' and 'guide'. He is the Person of the Trinity who is always there. No matter what our particular emotions may be in any moment, God is with us.

As we continue to grapple with population movement, with continuing unrest in so many parts of the world, and with the serious issue of the Referendum in our own country, to name but three things, I hope that we may draw strength, confidence and joy from the presence of the Spirit. Our gracious God does equip us with all that we need to live our lives as disciples in the world today.

May God bless you this Pentecost and always,

NORMANBY & OWMBY

NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting held on 14th April, Mr Steve Bird was welcomed as our new co-opted Councillor for which we are very grateful.

4 members of the public attended but DC Jeff Summers and CC Lewis Strange sent their apologies as did the Police and one Councillor.

We are still trying to have a Normanby by Spital road sign put up on the west side of the A15 as, coming from Lincoln, there is no indication of where the road is. Some potholes have been filled in but there are still more to do.

Unfortunately, we are no further forward with the Community Space due to WLDC planners not making a decision, but we are keeping on at them. The church wall repairs have not been started yet and it was agreed the Clerk enquire as to when the work will start.

It is our intention to improve the grass verge along Main Street by putting down some top soil and spreading grass seed, we just hope no one drives on the verges again.

The accounts, having been checked by our Internal Auditor (thank you Pete Harrison) were approved at the meeting.

The amount of dog dirt along Main Street and other areas in our village is appalling. Please, please, please be responsible and clear up after your dog has fouled, it is so inconsiderate and gives responsible dog owners a bad name. If the culprits are seen fouling, their owners may be reported if they do not clear it up and it is a shame it has got to this stage. It might help if poo bags are supplied near the bins, but honestly, they are not expensive to buy and most dog owners have a supply in their pockets (even if they do not have their dog with them).

The next meetings will be the Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Parish Council meeting being held on Wednesday 18th May, still starting at 7.30. All members of the public are welcome.





WELTON FAMILY HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

I would like to thank you for your co-operation in recent weeks when we have had to close our dispensary hatch during certain periods due to severe staffing shortages and apologise for any inconvenience this may have caused. I am pleased to report we are almost back to normal staffing levels after a very difficult time. Dr Gomez has started her maternity leave and will be away from the practice for several months. We are delighted that Dr Kathryn Fickling and Dr David Bletcher are covering both her and Dr Porter's maternity leave in the forthcoming months.

We are in the process of working on a bid to submit to our CCG (clinical commissioning group) with a view to them supporting it for consideration of funding via the Primary Care Transformation Fund which would help the Practice deal with the anticipated influx of patients due to the significant housing developments planned in our catchment area. This would involve working closely with Lincolnshire Co Operative Society to develop the present library site thus enabling a significant increase in space and giving opportunities for working in different ways. We are mindful that the Parish Council currently have the lease for the library but understand that this has always intended to be a short term arrangement until alternative suitable premises can be found, and we trust that there will be a way forward for both of us to provide our services in suitable accommodation. Bids have to be submitted by 2nd May 2016 and the outcomes will hopefully be known by mid summer.

We are very open to new ideas about what patients would like to see on our website and have asked our Patient Participation Group (the PDA) to feed back to us any suggestions for inclusion or improvement. We are glad that quite a few patients are now signing up for on line booking - this can be accessed via our website - and for ordering prescriptions electronically - which improves efficiency for us all.

A reminder that our Patient Participation Group do a fantastic service organising voluntary drivers to bring patients to medical appointments and we were disappointed to learn that some of the drivers feel that they are being " used " inappropriately. If you are requesting to book transport please be reminded that this is intended for those patients who do not have alternative methods /family to transport them - our drivers are very precious to us and do a sterling job and we would be very disappointed if they felt over burdened or decided to reconsider continuing to offer this service.

A Lincolnshire wide survey has been conducted by Lincolnshire Parent Carer Forum in recent months asking how patients with learning difficulties find services in primary care and the results were not as positive as hoped. As it is anonymous it is difficult to know whether any of the comments refer to our own practice so we are sending out our own survey to our patients and would be really pleased if anyone receiving gives us honest feedback so we can see whether or not we need to consider any changes - any suggestions would be very welcome. The original survey can be viewed on our website.

Pregnant ladies in England, under the advice from the World Health Organisation, will no longer be offered screening for rubella susceptibility from 1st April '16. Those who have already booked and accepted screening prior to this date will continue to be offered ante natal and post natal screening and non-immune ladies will be referred for a second MMR. It is therefore vital that we all work to ensure that uptake rates of the MMR vaccine as part of the childhood immunisation programme remains high in both boys and girls. All ladies booking for maternity care will still be offered screening for HIV, hepatitis B and syphilis.

Many mums will now be aware that Angela Lyons, our Nursery Nurse, who has worked with us for around twenty years - initially alongside Mrs Dorothy Robinson, our Health Visitor, has decided to retire early and focus her skills on minding her own grandchildren instead. We would like to thank Angela for all her support and hard work over the years and I know that many patients have benefited from her sensible and practical advice in caring for young ones over the many years - may she enjoy a long and happy retirement.

We are regularly asked by patients who move out of our Practice area if they can remain on our list and whilst we appreciate the fact that we are their preferred practice, we apply our practice boundaries very strictly in order to be fair to those patients we serve. It may be on occasions that this may mean that patients actually move nearer to the Practice and are understandably frustrated by our request to re-register, but our limits were determined and agreed by NHS England some time ago and we cannot register anyone who falls outside of these boundaries. We apologise for the situation and do not wish to cause offence by refusing registrations and hope patients understand the reasons behind this. Our boundary traditionally stood when we had around 5,000 patients so with around 9,400 today, the rationale behind enforcing this is obvious. In view of the proposed developments we have to be safe - we cannot refuse to register anyone living within our Practice area and we cannot close our list so there has to be some protection for both parties.
