FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

What is your story? How do you make sense of the world? How do you know where you fit in? For many of us we understand the world through stories - perhaps in books, on TV, in the newspaper, listening to our family and friends and on social media (for the young at heart!). Stories convey a way of looking at our situation and our world. They help us to understand what is going on, how it affects our fellow human beings and where we fit in. Some see a complex world which they try to understand and play a meaningful role to make it better, albeit it in small ways. Others prefer to see how they can make the best of it for themselves. The rise of individualism has changed the way we live as a society with a greater emphasis on 'doing it my way'.

During Easter we heard one of the Grand Narratives in which Jesus progressed from being a popular itinerant preacher to be tried and crucified by the Roman authorities - only to rise again thereby bringing a new understanding of mankind's relationship with God. It's an enduring story that challenges us to think about the fickle nature of mankind, how we might wrestle with the big and small problems we face in our lives, and to consider the enduring relationship God has with mankind - but to recognise that our understanding of that relationship changes with each generation. Each generations, and each of us, has a slightly different 'take' on it.

I am writing this on Palm Sunday - the weather is fantastic. As I walked to church in Burton a procession of Austin Seven cars made its way through the village on the annual 'Sevens to the Sea' outing. They were splendid - as were the drivers demonstrating their double declutching skills going up the hill! We were joined for Holy week by Father George Guiver, from the monastic order the Community of the Resurrection in Mirfield. He will be talking to us throughout Holy week and imparting his 'take' on the Easter story.

My own story is changing - we are moving house and I have just become a grandfather. I am spending more time in an administrative role in the hospitals in Lincolnshire. The whole of the NHS is in difficulties and in Lincolnshire we have some particular problems which we need to fix so that we can provide the care required by the people who live here. The services required are quite different to those the NHS was set up to solve in 1948 when average life expectancy was around 65.8 years. The separation from social care is a particular problem for many people.

Our parish story will be starting a new chapter when Revd Sebastian Mattapally joins us as our Rector.

How will your story unfold over the next year? How do you see it fitting in with the enduring narratives of our lives in Britain and the big pictures unfolding in our rapidly changing world?

NORMANBY & OWMBY

NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 12th April, 2 members of the public, District Councillor Jeff Summers along with 6 Councillors and the Clerk attended.

D C Jeff Summers reported that WLDC planning department now has its full complement of officers and they are achieving 90% of reaching decisions in the given time.

The Local Plan is just awaiting approval and should be ratified by 24th April. 33 Parishes are now involved with the Neighbourhood Plan with 7 being fully operational. A leisure complex to be built in Market Rasen has been given the go ahead.

The matter of street lights being on all night in Owmby was raised, but Normanby lights fall under the jurisdiction of WLDC and Owmby under LCC. D C Jeff Summers was asked if he could get Normanby's street lights turned back on.

The training session on how to use the defibrillator will have been held by the time you read this - a thank you goes to the volunteers - and the street light near the Bottle and Glass is now on all night so one can see the defibrillator during the hours of darkness.

A meeting has been held with Highways regarding where an entrance should be constructed for the playing field, but we are waiting for confirmation. We are still waiting for information regarding having the overhead power lines across the field put underground. At this meeting it was confirmed that the refreshing of white lines in Normanby is on their list of jobs to do this year and Highways are working through the numerous potholes everywhere.

The grass verge along Main Street has been reseeded - could motorists please not park on the verge. The hedge in the centre of the cemetery will be lowered and halved in width as soon as the birds have finished nesting.

By a majority vote, it was agreed to support the Neighbourhood Plan, Cllrs Mrs B Moulson to set it in motion.

Yet again, I have been asked to request dog owners clear up after their dog has fouled.

The Annual Parish Meeting is to be held on **Wednesday 10th May** in the school hall, starting at 7.30 and this is an opportunity for all villagers to attend and express their views on any subject relating to the village. We would like to see you attending.

The Annual Parish Council meeting follows the above meeting.





FLIX IN THE STIX

Wednesday 3rd May, 7.30pm - Sully (2016)

Directed by Clint Eastwood and starring Tom Hanks, Sully tells the true story of when, on January 15 2009, the world witnessed the "Miracle on the Hudson" when Captain "Sully" Sullenberger glided his disabled plane onto the frigid waters of the Hudson River, saving the lives of all 155 aboard. However, even as Sully was being heralded by the public and the media for his unprecedented feat of aviation skill, an investigation was unfolding that threatened to destroy his reputation and his career.

As usual tickets cost $\pounds 3$, with $\pounds 1$ from every ticket donated to the village hall committee or parish council for use within the venue or local community. Food and drinks will also be available at each screening, with all proceeds going to the local village hall committee.

This project is currently funded in part by Big Lottery Fund's 'Awards for All' initiative to improve communities as well as by the British Film Institute's 'Neighbourhood Cinema' initiative and 'Film Audience Network' (through Film Hub Central East) to bring specialised film programming into areas with limited access to a cinema. The funding allows Blueprint: Film Foundation to provide screenings to village halls at no cost to the committee.


