MAY'S MINISTRY TEAM LETTER

What have the Romans ever done for us?

My all-time favourite Monty Python sketch is from the religious satire film "The Life of Brian." In it a group of hapless rebels form an independence movement in an attempt to revolt against the Roman Occupation. At a mass meeting the leader begins "What have the Romans ever done for us?" Someone in the crowd calls out: "The Aqueduct"; and then a list of benefits that the Romans have brought to the area begins; sanitation; the roads; irrigation; medicine; education; wine and so on. At the end of the meeting the exasperated leader says, yes, yes, yes but apart from the aqueduct, irrigation, sanitation, roads, medicine, education and wine, what have the Romans ever done for us?

Following on from the anarchic humour in "The Life of Brian", people living in the 21st century may ask a similar, but different question. "What has The Church ever done for us? Let's start with what do we mean by The Church? To many people The Church is seen as a building. Here, in The Owmby Group of Parishes we have five C of E Churches and one Methodist Chapel. From Glentham in the north to Hackthorn in the south we are well served by churches. Each one is unique, part of our heritage and culture and adds much to our way of living. Above the porch at Glentham Church is a rare medieval "pieta" There are unusual box pews and the church has a connection to The Pilgrim Fathers. Owmby by Spital Church is a beautiful Norman Church with a Saxon font. Saxby Church is both a church and a family mausoleum built c1775. Spridlington Church has a restored Thomas Nicholson Organ of historical importance. Hackthorn Church dates from the Victorian. Gothic period and has a fine peal of six bells that was installed in 2006. The Church is also the workings and people of Christian faith. The C of E was in the forefront of establishing education for all. Currently there are over 4,500 C of E schools in the UK. Within our Group of Parishes there is a C of E Primary School in Hackthorn and two other C of E Schools in Welton. Each of them provides excellent education, for children of all faiths and non, and are based on the ethos and values of Christianity. The Church also has a charitable function. In recent years this has come to prominence as organisations, such as The Trussell Trust, have set up Food Banks throughout the country. The Trussell Trust is an NGO and charity that works to end the need for food banks in the United Kingdom. It "is based on, shaped, and guided by Christian principles" and supports a network of over 1,200 food bank centres. In each of our parishes there are drop off boxes for donations and each week they are filled with the generous donations from people who live in the area.

Our churches are there for some of the most significant moments in our lives. Many children and adults continue to be baptised in church. In this increasingly secular age, there seems to be no shortage of couples wanting to be married in church. Many people chose a church as a setting for a funeral or a memorial service. The church is there for everyone who wants or needs these rights of passage.

So, "What has The Church ever done for us? Apart from the above functions, we must also add; fellowship, pastoral care, uplifting services, especially at Christmas, Harvest and Easter, and most importantly we share in the love of Jesus Christ. These and all of the other "what has The Church ever done for us" functions are there for everyone. West Lindsey Open Churches Festival runs between 13-14 May 2023 in our villages. All of our churches will be open and you can find out more about the buildings and the facilities, as you meet some of the fantastic volunteers that keep our churches going. Come along and find out what The Church is doing for you!

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

We had an 'egg-citing' start to science week when two of our younger children bravely volunteered to walk barefoot across cartons of raw eggs during the first assembly of the week. There was tremendous 'egg-citement' as the other children eagerly watched on. However, the result was not as 'egg-splosive' as they 'egg-spected'...they learned that feet are able to spread the pressure of their weight around eggs and that the eggs' arched structure keeps them from breaking. And so followed an 'egg-straordinary' week of fun-filled, interactive scientific 'egg-speriments' (I'll stop now!) and lessons about famous and contemporary scientists. KS1 thoroughly enjoyed the explosive Coke and Mentos experiment, demonstrated by the staff, and then completed their own investigations about the senses. On one afternoon, they had 10 activities to investigate!

Y3 and 4 pupils learned about centripetal force whilst spinning buckets of water around themselves, tested their theories about which shapes made the best structures and completed a Whodunnit? investigation using paper chromatography techniques.

Year 5 and 6 pupils were only able to participate in scientific experiments for two days as they went off on their residential to Willersley Castle Outdoor Pursuits Centre. They had a fantastic time climbing, fencing, grass sledging, travelling down a zip wire, participating in team building activities and completing a blind trail. The weather could have been better, but it did not dampen their spirits. They participated enthusiastically and returned home with clothes and luggage caked in mud! Once again, the children's behaviour was exemplary, and the centre's staff complimented them on their manners.

The final week of term was extremely busy...the Easter bunny visited us and left 321 eggs. It was wonderful to see the older pupils helping their younger buddies to find them. Many of our children participated in the Easter craft competition and their entries were displayed in the entrance of St Michael and All Angels' church for all to enjoy before the Easter service. The children sang beautifully, and our Year 6 pupils confidently read their bible passages.




Welton Village Library Book Review

Review of The Dutch Girl: Audrey Hepburn and World War 2 By Robert Matzen Forward by Luca Dotti, son of Audrey Hepburn

As I am married to a Dutchman the title 'Dutch Girl' drew my attention before I realised that it was a book about the famous Dutch-born film star Audrey Hepburn.

Although it's not really about 'Audrey the actress' we see on the silver screen but the childhood years she spent growing up on the front line of German occupied Netherlands during the World War II. She witnessed firsthand the events and aftermath of the hard fought battle for the Arnham region, part of which would later be told in the film, 'A Bridge too Far'.



This book is an expertly researched account of what is otherwise an unknown period of her life from child to a blossoming but fragile young women. Even more surprising was to learn that Audrey was raised by an aristocratic mother Baroness van Heemstra, who not only initially supported the Nazi regime but attended some of the pre-war Hitler rallies, proudly shaking the leader's hand on one such occasion. Later developments would greatly change her understanding and support.

However, this book gives the best account I have ever read of the experience of living under Nazis occupation. Audrey's vulnerability, terror, hunger and constant navigation of a safe passage through her daily young life is palpable. Audrey sustains herself through her passion for ballet and absorbing herself in ballet lessons and practice. Eventually Hepburn's honed dance talent and her mothers tenacity eventually led to principle

ballet roles performed for important German Officer. This was in the vain hope that it would curry favour with the occupying forces and decrease the threat to the family. Later Hepburn still a teenager, worked helping in a hospital where she is ideally placed to carry messages for the resistance run by the Dutch medical staff: a risky undertaking.

These early years experiences had a life-long influence on Audrey's attitude to her priorities for living. Even when she became a public figure and household name as a movie star her private life remained very private. A first hand account given by her son referenced in the book, shows her as a dedicated ever present loving mother and later gave way to her extensive humanitarian work.

This has to be my favourite book of the past year. Borrowed from Welton Library and also available as an audio book from Lincolnshire Library online (Libby App). Details available at Welton Library.
