MINISTRY LETTER FOR MAY 2025

CAN BOUNCING UP AND DOWN, PAINTING FEET, AND CHATTING ALL THE TIME TO YOUR NEIGBOUR BE CHURCH?

I love traditional Anglican services. That's because people of my age went to schools where we had a Christian assembly every morning with a reading from the King James Bible, sang a traditional hymn and were encultured into the Anglican way. In 1978 I visited a school at assembly time. The assembly was based on the song "Summer Nights" from the film "Grease"! There were good moral lessons for the children. But no Christian content.

That's one of the reasons that when I go to church now I'm in a congregation like me - grey and wrinkly! So I spend most of my time now not leading trad church services.

Once a month we do Messy Church as an after school club in our local school. We tell the children a Bible story. Then we have about ten craft activities for them. They have fun and we can continue with the story. For example, to continue the Easter story of Jesus washing his disciples' feet the children paint their own feet and tread on paper to make a "take home" print. The adult helper then does a service to the children by washing their feet. "Do you think it tickled the disciples feet?" asked one child, giggling. They love it.



And once a month we do a Cafe Church in the village hall. Unlike church buildings the VH is warm, has comfy seats, a great kitchen and toilets. We start off with a hymn, prayer, and reading. And the leader explains the reading (5 minutes max). Then, through a series of questions people sit around discussing the topic. Imagine a sermon or formal lecture as like this. Somebody stands at the front and tells the audience about something. It's like I could tell you what my favourite biscuit is like. The audience is passive. In Cafe Church they talk about the ideas themselves. They are active. It's like digesting the biscuit themselves. About 30 people come. A third of those people don't belong to any other church.



Finally, I help out at a monthly Family Service. For the last three months the children have been learning a song about Jesus being a superhero. It's an action song which involves imitating Superman, Spiderman and other superheroes and has a lot of bouncing about in it. The "sermon" might be a conversation between the leader and a cheeky puppet.

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

Spring term always seems short in time but full of activity. We have yet again had a whirlwind of a term with one of the highlights being the Years 5 and 6 residential trip to Willersley Castle in Derbyshire.

We are very proud of our collective worship council who shared another bible story in the lead up to Easter. This time their focus was the resurrection of Jesus. We're already looking forward to their next worship.

Many of the children have entered competitions to illustrate our school's values over the last few months and the winners' art works have been turned into signs that have been placed around the playground and they look brilliant.

Key Stage One and Reception have been busy with their latest DT project of 'food from around the world'. Everyone enjoyed sampling food from different cuisines at our International Cafe. The children were very brave and tried a little bit of everything, with some children completely finishing their plates. This led to creating our own food and designing pizzas. The school smelt delicious all day!

KS2 have continued their art topic on the subject of pattern. Having already looked at Neolithic pattern, they have also had a go at making their own Roman mosaics. The children designed their pattern first using complementary colours before glueing tiles of coloured paper into their chosen design in sketch books. The classroom was surprisingly tidy by the end of the lesson despite the hundreds of coloured squares all over the desks! We finished our topic by looking at Tudor art. The children produced some beautiful symmetrical Tudor images including knots and Tudor roses. All their work has been detailed, intricate and carefully produced.

The entire school walked down to church for our annual Easter Service. We opened our service with Years 5 and 6 playing the Easter processional on the bell plates. Years 3 and 4 processed down the aisle with their palm crosses and the congregation loved the musical afternoon. The school choir was in full force performing three-part harmonies and everyone felt ready for the holidays. We finished the entire afternoon with an Easter bake-off in the village hall. Congratulations to our winning bakers and everyone who entered. This raised valuable funds for our Friends of Hackthorn School. We hope lots of people will join us for our next exciting fundraising events, the FOHS Treasure Hunt on Saturday, April 26.

We are also very excited to announce that Hackthorn C of E School have been invited to sing as a choir supporting Lincoln Academy of Theatre Arts in the upcoming production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat at Lincoln Cathedral this July. We will update everyone when we have more details of this exciting event.





This was an increase of £267.18 on last years total. A huge thankyou to all who bought tickets, raffle tickets, cakes and cards. We hope you all enjoyed this event and will continue to support our other fundraising events. Thanks also to Welton Chippy who generously donated and rumbled the potatoes.

I have been asked to make clear the way we charge for PDA transport as there has been some confusion recently! The charge for trips to Welton health centre appointments is based on the village in which the patient lives. This will not vary regardless of where the driver lives. I have volunteer drivers who live in villages some distance from Welton but we ensure, through our fund raising, that they are paid 45p a mile in total. For any other medically related journey the charge to the patient is 40p per mile from the drivers door and back.

We anticipate getting additional transport requests following the announcement that the health centre is no longer able to offer certain services for example the removal of clips and stitches following surgery. Transport for these services will be charged at 40p per mile.

The PDA are once again holding a plant sale at the Welton May Fair on **Monday 5th May**. We will have a good selection of bedding plants and vegetable plants at reasonable prices. Hopefully some larger plants as well eg rose bushes, hydrangeas etc If anyone with green fingers would consider growing us a few plants, flower or vegetable, it would be appreciated. We also take house plants and any larger plants you might have dug out of your garden and split. We can collect if necessary and have the use of a large greenhouse to store plants in. We can also provide small plant pots if anyone would like some, just give me a call. We will have a selection of ceramic pots for sale on the day.

As part of Local History Month this May, we'll be honouring an old Welton custom that's nearly vanished from memory - the beautiful and symbolic act of well dressing.

Historically, the people of Welton marked Ascension Day each year by decorating five of the village's wells. Using branches, lilac, laburnum and cloths bearing Bible verses, villagers built floral arches and celebrated the gift of fresh water with processions, hymns and prayer. Sunday school children would scatter flowers at each well, while the day ended in tea and song.

In the library this May, we'll be bringing back the spirit of this tradition in two community events. On **Saturday 24th May**, children will gather to craft paper flowers and decorations for a newly imagined well. On **Saturday 31st May**, families and local groups are invited to add their own homemade creations flowers, butterflies, leaves and more - made from any material, from paper to crochet.

We're excited to rediscover and reimagine this piece of Welton's past - and we'd welcome residents of nearby villages to help dressing our well in 2025.

A further local history month event brings Caroline Foster to the library with a talk 'It Could Only Happen in Lincolnshire' on **Tuesday 20th May** at 2pm.
