Remembrance Sunday is the second Sunday of November, the Sunday nearest to 11 November (Remembrance Day), which is the anniversary of the end of the hostilities of the First World War at 11 a.m. in 1918.

Remembrance Sunday is marked by ceremonies at local war memorials in most cities, towns and villages, attended by civic dignitaries, ex-servicemen and women (principally members of the Royal British Legion), members of local armed forces regular and reserve units (Royal Navy and Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Marines and Royal Marines Reserve, Army and Territorial Army, Royal Air Force and Royal Auxiliary Air Force), youth organizations (e.g. Scouts and Guides), and military cadet forces (Air cadets, Army cadets and Sea cadets). Wreaths of poppies are laid on the memorials and two-minutes' silence is held at 11 a.m. Church bells are usually rung 'half muffled', creating a sombre effect.

RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

HISTORY

I'm a great believer in history. I was horrified some years ago when I found out that history is on the way out in many schools. How else do you find out your story? How else do you find out about the mistakes we have made in the past, in the hope that we won't do so again? What a weird world this brave new world of ours is!

I was really pleased when a group of people in Owmby & Normanby produced their latest book, about life in those villages during the War (we call it THE War, but a lot of young people nowadays might even say "What war?" I particularly like the way there is a CD included, with the voices of those elderly people whose memories make up some of the most fascinating parts of the book. Well done, to those people, for this and for their earlier book, for the people of Hackthorn for their book a year or two back. Is there a local history of your village, and if not, why not?

November is a month for remembering. In church, we commemorate All Saints and All Souls at the beginning of the month, and there are memorial services in which people remember their loved ones before God. There are such services at Owmby and at Burton. You'll find the time of the one nearest to you elsewhere in this magazine. Sometimes it helps to hold before God someone who has meant a lot to you.

November also brings Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday. There are moving ceremonies for these days in many of our churches. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we remember them. We certainly do, and we ask some very searching questions about why young servicemen and women still die for their country and for freedom. We haven't really made a good job of learning our lesson. What price history now?

There was a recent TV series called the Tudors. It opened lots of eyes to the history of the Church of England. It even put some people off. I'm not surprised. History, like life, is often very messy. Even November 5th comes with a lot of history and religion attached. What do you think a Roman Candle is, or a Catherine Wheel? Maybe it is a bit of fun, but it may not be something to be too proud of.

Tomorrow I'm meeting groups of schoolchildren in their local church, and they have some questions for me about the Church of England. I shall be as honest as I can. I'm glad I studied some history, and am always interested in the chance to find out a little more.

Today's world often has no time, no consideration, for history and experience. No wonder we get ourselves in a mess. The latest fashion may look quite pretty, but may not be very wise.

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

THE FORK

There was a woman who had been diagnosed with cancer and had been given three months to live. Her doctor told her to start making preparations to die - something we all should be doing all of the time. So she contacted her priest and had him come to her house to discuss certain aspects of her final wishes. She told him which songs she wanted sung at the service, what scriptures she would like read, and what she wanted to be wearing. The woman also told her priest that she wanted to be buried with her favourite Bible.

Everything was in order and the priest was preparing to leave when the woman suddenly remembered something very important to her. "There's one more thing," she said excitedly.

"What's that?" came the priest's reply.

"This is very important." The woman continued, "I want to be buried with a fork in my right hand." The priest stood looking at the woman not knowing quite what to say. "That shocks you, doesn't it?" the woman asked.

"Well, to be honest, I'm puzzled by the request," said the priest.

The woman explained. "In all my years of attending church socials and functions where food was involved, and let's be honest, food is an important part of any church event, spiritual or otherwise, my favourite part was when whoever was clearing away the dishes of the main course would lean over and say, 'You can keep your fork.' It was my favourite part because I knew that something better was coming. When they told me to keep my fork, I knew that something great was about to be given to me. It wasn't jelly or pudding. It was cake or pie - something with substance. So I just want people to see me there in that casket with a fork in my hand and I want them to wonder, 'What's with the fork?' Then I want you to tell them, 'Something better is coming, so keep your fork too."

The priest's eyes were welled up with tears of joy as he hugged the woman goodbye. He knew this would be one of the last times he would see her before her death. But he also knew that the woman had a better grasp of heaven than he did. She KNEW that something better was coming.

At the funeral people were walking by the woman's casket and they saw the pretty dress she was wearing and her favourite Bible and the fork placed in her right hand. Over and over the priest heard the question, "What's with the fork?" And over and over he smiled. During his message, the priest told the people of the conversation he had with the woman shortly before she died. He also told them about the fork and about what it symbolised to her. The priest told the people how he could not stop thinking about the fork and told them that they probably would not be able to stop thinking about it either. He was right.

So the next time you reach down for your fork, let it remind you, oh so gently - that there is something better coming.

Dear Friends,

First of all, can I remind you about the Taster Day in the Cathedral on Saturday 14th November at 11:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. for those who want to explore approaches to prayer and so discover what works best for you. No need to book, and there is no charge - just come along and I will look forward to welcoming you. A packed lunch would be a good idea.

Meanwhile, we are delighted that the Archbishop of Canterbury will be with us from 5 - 8th March next year as we mark the Centenary of the death of Bishop Edward King. The Archbishop likes to visit Dioceses when he can, but it is unusual for him to give so much time to one place, so we consider ourselves to be rather privileged.

On Friday 5th March he will be celebrating Fresh Expressions of Church with people coming to Lincoln from all over the country. Apparently we are a bit of a market leader when it comes to promoting and resourcing Fresh Expressions, so it is a chance to showcase some of those initiatives.

Saturday 6th March sees the Archbishop giving a Lecture in the Cathedral at 11.00 a.m. and then Presiding at a celebration of the Eucharist at 2.30 p.m. when we hope all Parishes will be represented. Further details about these events, and how to secure tickets, will be notified in due course but for now please put this date in your diary.

In addition, the Archbishop will travel to the north of the Diocese on Sunday 7th and the south of the Diocese on Monday 8th after Celebrating the Eucharist in the Chapel of Edward King House on Edward King Day.

By no means least, he will meet Ordinands and Readers in training, visit the U2charist project and dine with Civic, Business and Voluntary Sector leaders so as to get a feel for our context and the challenges we face.

All in all, it should be a very special weekend for us, and I hope as many people as possible will be able to share in our celebrations.

On Wednesday 11th November a service will take place at the War Memorial.

The short service will precede the 2 minutes silence at 11:00 a.m. so if you arrive about 10:45 a.m. and congregate around the war memorial you will be made very welcome. Wrap up warm if it is a cold day as the wind howls round that corner.

Once again I ask those dog owners who still will not clear up the mess after their dogs have fouled the pavement and or grass verge to please do so. It was reported that a dog had fouled, not just outside someone's home, but actually in the drive as well - now this is really not on. We have very few stray dogs in our village, so this culprit most likely was with an owner and to expect someone else to clear up after someone else's dog beggars belief. Five of your seven Councillors have dogs (as does the Clerk), so they know what they are talking about. They love their dogs and take full responsibility for them, so please every irresponsible dog owner take note.

Trees - for so long Lincolnshire County Council has given out free trees to all Parish Councils and we have had our fair share. 



GLENTHAM PARISH COUNCIL

MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 10TH SEPTEMBER 2009

Adjournment Period - Concerns were raised regarding the amount of Ragwort within the village and on the roadsides. Two parishioners are to draft an item for the Signpost and the Parish Council is to contact Highways asking for them to remove Ragwort from their property.

Concerns were also raised regarding the speed of traffic using Bishop Norton Road. The Parish Council are to contact Road Safety Partnership to ask for an 'Archer'.

The meeting was reconvened at 7:39 p.m. and Cllr N Simpson took the chair.

Planning matters included an application for an extension to a property on Middlefield Lane to which the Council returned no comment and the granting of an application for a storage unit which was noted.





Winter Driving

Reduced visibility and slippery road surfaces make winter driving particularly hazardous. Good observation is essential so that you can interpret conditions accurately and adjust your speed accordingly. No matter what the other conditions, if you can't see the road clearly, you will need to reduce your speed so that you can stop within the distance you can see to be clear. This is a simple and fundamental principle of defensive driving. In winter, road surfaces are frequently covered by frost and ice, but often not uniformly. Isolated patches and certain gradients will remain icy when the other parts have thawed. The good driver will therefore be on the lookout for these areas. If you drive too fast on a slippery or wet road surface your tyre grip will be substantially reduced and the risk of skidding increased. Remember - it is better to arrive a little later than not at all! Smooth control is another essential element of safer winter driving. You should always aim to plan your action early and brake, steer and change gear as smoothly as possible so as not to affect the grip of your tyres on the road surface. In poor weather especially, better, safer driving is about good preparation, good self-maintenance, good vehicle maintenance, the right knowledge, the right attitude and a thoughtful driving plan. Have your vehicle fully serviced before winter starts and have the anti-freeze tested.

Check that your lights are clean and working. Make sure your battery is fully charged. A faulty battery will let you down, probably at the most inconvenient time - so if in doubt change it before it fails!

Always keep the windscreen and windows clean and the washer bottle filled with screen wash to the correct concentration. This will prevent the solution from freezing. Items to have in the vehicle. Tow rope, spare bulbs, spare fuel, shovel, hazard warning triangle or similar, spare wheel (with tyre at correct pressure and tread) high visibility jacket, jump leads, emergency tyre weld (for temporary 'low speed' repair) Wellington boots, or similar, de-icing equipment, first aid equipment (in good order) working torch, car blanket, fire extinguisher (fully operative) Make sure you know and understand the hazards and risks of all types of weather conditions, especially ice, snow and fog - before you venture out. Short-term weather forecasts are now very accurate, so listen to local/national weather broadcasts and to travel information bulletins on the radio. If conditions are very bad, avoid making your journey unless it is absolutely necessary. Clear your windows and mirrors completely of snow and ice before you set off. (Make sure the heater is blowing warm air before setting off - it will keep your windscreen clear). Winter and spring sunlight can present drivers with an unexpected hazard. The angle of the sun in the sky will frequently be too low for your visor to be able to help. If you are blinded by glare, reduce your speed. Reduce the effect of glare by keeping both the inside and outside of your windscreen clean and grease free. Dark lenses (or dark prescription lenses if you are short-sighted) are suitable for combating glare, but all dark tinted lenses should be removed whenever the sun goes in. Dark lenses must not be worn in duller weather or at night as they seriously reduce the ability to see.

To Summarise - ALWAYS DRIVE TO THE ROAD CONDITIONS.






