NOVEMBER'S MINISTRY LETTER

I worked with young people and a colleague was recently talking about the lack of young people in church. It reminded me of this letter written by a 15 year old who was struggling to find church relevant. She wrote to her vicar:

"For some time now I have been greatly aware of the time trap the Church of England is stuck in but it really came to my attention when church went on a trip to Liverpool and finished off with a short service of Evening Prayer at the Cathedral. The only prayer book they had available was one with the ancient language from 1662. I felt so left out and isolated because I just couldn't follow the words whatsoever. Because I didn't understand anything I couldn't concentrate on that service so I found myself (with a tear in my eye) praying for our churches to step out of the past and look to the future - or just concentrate on the present.

I think what churches need to do is build the congregation up, especially for children and keeping the 1662 service will not do this.

If the church doesn't have children or young people now when all of you have gone there will only be me left on my own because no-one will stick around to listen to people chanting words which went out of common use 200 years ago.

Just to make a point, here is a prayer of my own written in a special language which can be called English (just as the language in 1662 can be called English) but I could almost guarantee none of you could understand it because it is written as rap.

Dig it; Yo, Jesus, da Fresh Prince or da gleb, You R Def'n' alladatness. Da tip now 4 ma sups is your crib. Jesus, I wanna sup ya 'n' ask that you mix your squad into the now, make 'em Fresh 'n' Hype 4 Ya. Fly, man, I ask 4 a new flame to be active for you and may it live large. Honey, in the drift of ma sup I wanna ask that you don't allow da posse 2 dis your will, clear their lugz 2 peep you. Keep chillin, Peace.

This means:

Jesus, the King of the world who is supreme and above all others, my prayer for today is for your church. I want to pray and ask that you bring your people up into the present instead of lingering in the past; make them renewed and excited for you.

Oh Lord, I ask for a new flame to spark for you in the Holme Valley and that it will prosper for eternity. My friend and saviour, in the last bit of my prayer I ask that your will be done and you will open their ears to listen to you.

In the name of Jesus, Amen."

Was she a cool babe or a discordant heretic?





NOTES FROM WILLIAM FARR

In 1946, the Rev William Farr of Welton purchased for £600 some of the old Dunholme Lodge airfield that had been home during part of WW2 to 619 and 44 squadrons. His intention was to build a school on the site and in 1952, his dream was realized. Sadly he died in 1955 so he did not live the dream for too long, but the school, could not have done more to have lived up to the good vicars aspiration's . Starting out as a secondary modern, it changed to a comprehensive in 1974. Now an academy, the near 200 staff attend to the educational needs of around 1,500 pupils.

It is a fair guess that many of the readers of this magazine attended the school, and could attest to the high quality of education, achieved through the years. There are those who would possibly argue that back in the day, there was a much more important attraction; a 'tuck shop' on the residential caravan site next door ran by Mr Sellars. I am given to understand that quite a lot of dinner money never made it any further than the shops cash register.

I have been searching for anecdotes, and this is what I have come up with so far. I have a friend who changed schools in mid-stream, after moving from Market Rasen to Dunholme in the early 60s. Preferring his nickname Pip to his birth name, Pip made a pal of local lad Dick Taylor, who was very talented with his hands. His mentor was Mr Thomas who taught woodwork at the school. So talented was Dick, he decided to build a canoe!

After the school day was done, he took over part of the playground, meticulously working on his brainchild, using the skills Mr Thomas had brought out in him. This was no cosmetic exercise; when all the graft was completed he sailed his canoe down the River Witham all the way to Boston, setting off from the high bridge in Lincoln! This journey was with help from the natural flow of the river, but as I'm sure it was already clear to those who knew him, Dick was something of an adventurer, so he did the hard yards, paddling all the way back against the tide, a distance of around 33 miles! Phew, what a guy!!

The Taylor, Thomas relationship did not end when Dick moved on into the world beyond school. They ran a successful building firm together for a number of years, until Dick's tragic and untimely death in a caving accident.


Shortly after my friend 'deserted' from Rasen, part of the the sports field at William Farr, had to be dug up in order to lay some sewage pipes, no doubt much to the chagrin of the lads and lasses who did not take kindly to their sporting activities being put on hold. Now Pip was very proud of his dad Tom, who had worked hard to become a civil engineer. But as there is a time and a place for everything, he decided now was not the time, nor the place to make his feelings of pride known to his classmates, as it was Tom who was leading the team of workmen responsible for their missing out on the usual games lessons on the field.
