#### **NOVEMBER'S LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM**

As oversight minister for the Owmby Group of parishes I thought it might be good if I introduced myself. I'm Reverend Judy Shaw and I am at present licensed as associate priest in Nettleham. I am SSM (self-supporting minister) Which means that the church doesn't support me financially but that I support myself. Until recently I worked as a Teaching Assistant at Mount Street School in Lincoln, where I worked for 32 years! I trained for ministry part time at Lincoln School of Theology, which took a few years! I hope over the coming months to get around to each church and get to know you all better. Please don't hesitate to be in touch with me if I can help in any way.

November is a time of remembering. At the beginning of November, we have all Souls Day, traditionally a time to remember all our loved ones who have departed this world. We light candles and give thanks for all that they have been to us and whose memory we cherish safely in our hearts.

And then on the 11th November we have a Day of Remembrance, when we remember all those who have died in WW1 and WW11, and in other wars and conflicts around the world. At these times in some way we step into that place where words run out, as we gather in churches or at war memorials, or watch the events on the television, even though words are used they are given to surround the silence. We might think that nothing much happens in that silence and stillness that will envelope our nation at 11am, but it's an intense two minutes when we are deliberately doing something important, stopping, being still and remembering. And though we do so to remember those who have given their lives in the service of our nation, I think we all have some experience of those times when words run out, when we are speechless.

Silence is such a powerful thing and for me is an integral part of every funeral I take, the silence even if just for a few moments is often powerful and moving. However there is more, for when faced with sadness and loss, though silence has its place, we often cope by doing something more tangible than staying in the place where words run out because we cannot stay there for ever. And when we do that, we're in good company. Think of the followers of Jesus after he had died on the cross, they needed to do something. They came for his lifeless body, lovingly preparing it for burial. Perhaps washing it, gently cleaning his hands, examining the wounds that defined his final hours. That must have been a hard thing to do, and yet it was something that helped them grieve.

Likewise we too to do things to help us cope with loss and sadness. For example, we take flowers and tend the graves of our loved ones. Churchyards are sacred spaces for many, though visitors know their loved ones have died somehow by going there, they feel closer to them by tending and decorating their graves. The silence, the tending of graves and placing of wreaths the rituals that speak to us so deeply we can find echoes of this in the Eucharist in which we do this in remembrance of Jesus.

Before his death, Jesus gave us this sacred meal where we would meet him. Consequently, when we do this in remembrance of him, when we break bread, we meet him afresh and as we receive him are made new. Inevitably when we do this we fall silent too not because words have run out through loss and grief, but because we have met the living God and from that encounter flows reverence and awe, wonder, praise and hope.

As we look around our world it can seem that things are hopeless. Hardness of heart seems to prevail, the weak and vulnerable are abused and human life is diminished in such awful ways. We never seem to learn and yet when we meet Christ in word and sacrament our hope and vision is renewed.

So in this November of remembering may we recommit ourselves in our own small way to honour them all as we continue to work for peace and reconciliation and we do this sustained as we are by the prince of peace, whose life in us, changes and reshapes us and gives us hope. And hope is what we need.

As the days grow shorter and the air becomes crisp, our villages are gearing up for a Christmas Tree Lighting Extravaganza! This heart-warming event is not just about illuminating a tree; it's about bringing our community together for an evening of joy and laughter.

So, gather your loved ones, bundle up in your cosiest winter attire, and make your way to the Community Park on December 1st from 6pm. Let the warm glow of the Christmas lights, the laughter of friends and neighbours, and the mouth-watering treats create a memory that will linger in your heart long after the season ends.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

If you ever need a defibrillator (AED), follow these steps:

1. Call 999: Dial emergency services immediately for professional help.

2. Use a Nearby Defibrillator: The emergency services will tell you where the nearest defibrillator is and the code to open it. There's one in Normanby on the side of the shop

(https://w3w.co/mirroring.rift.easels) and Owmby has one on the side of Harrisons (https://w3w.co/mouths.neat.hiring).

3. Follow Instructions: AEDs have clear, step-by-step instructions. Listen carefully and follow them.

4. Apply Pads: Attach the electrode pads as directed, usually one on the upper right chest and one on the lower left side.

5. Clear the Area: Make sure no one is touching the person while the AED analyses the heart rhythm.

Administer Shock: If advised, deliver a shock by pressing the button as instructed. Make sure no one is touching the person.

7. Continue CPR: After a shock, perform CPR until professional help arrives.

Remember, defibrillators are designed for use by anyone, even if you're not trained. Always call for professional assistance first.

The equipment in both villages is checked regularly but if you notice there is anything wrong with it please notify the Parish Clerk.

Normanby Educational Charity is a fund which is paid out annually and available to all students, up to the age of 25 years old, resident in Normanby by Spital. The fund is not means tested but students **must** be in full time education **and** resident in Normanby by Spital, irrespective of where they are educated.

Alternatively, send a letter including the following: Name, address and phone number of the applicant, date of birth, which school/college they are attending and which year they are in at school/college. Also please state the date they became residents in Normanby by Spital or started school if it was after October 2022.

Note: **all students over the age of 16** must make the application themselves, adding the subjects being taken to the above requested information.

To help with the allocation of funds, please ensure that all the above information requested is include in your application.

Applications must be received by Saturday 1st December 2023 at the latest. Unfortunately, applications received after this date may not be accepted as the allocations have to be prepared in time for the Meeting of the Trustees.

Please may I remind you that all students, even those who have received a payment in previous years, must re-apply.
