FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

My dear friends,

HOW ARE YOU?

We British often say "How are you?" as a greeting. Usually, we don't really want an answer. We don't want to be told about a person's aches, pains and sadnesses. The answer we want to hear is "fine".

It makes it meaningless, really.

For we all know that things aren't fine. I doubt if I know anyone whose health, circumstances, family and life really are "fine" at all. Life is a pretty imperfect experience.

If you believe, or even if you don't believe but wish you did, in a God of Love, there's an issue here. This is not how things are meant to be.

Read the beginning of the Bible, which is a story with a meaning rather than an attempt to provide a lot of factual information, & you might come to see that the way things are isn't the way God wants them to be either. A garden in the East, at a place called Eden, is a representation of Paradise, perfection.

And we would say there ain't no such place.

In that case, what have we done with it? Where has Eden gone?

There should be such a place of perfection; that is how things are meant to be, and perhaps we are charged with bringing it about, or restoring it, or maybe discovering where it has been hidden. And it should fill the world.

I believe we are called to bring a measure of order, peace and healing to a disorderly, conflict-ridden, broken world.

Council matters

District Councillor Jeff Summers gave the Parish Council a summary of what grants are available for projects costing several thousand pounds and offered to convene a meeting of six local Parish Councils within his ward to explain application procedures and to talk about possible topics for funding. The public are welcome and the meeting will probably be held in Glentham Village Hall, details will be posted on the notice boards as soon as known.

The Council is looking to fill a casual vacancy by co-option, and applications are invited from parishioners via the Clerk, who will be happy to talk about the duties of the work.

Communitylines, which is a County-funded organisation, is promoting a scheme to help with the heating efficiency of people's homes, and one or two representatives are sought from the Parish to be trained as advisers to the vulnerable of the community. The aim is to have local people give good advice on how to improve the insulation of properties and where to obtain grants and details of installation companies. Anyone interested can apply to the Clerk; training expenses will be met by Communitylines.

Problems with the Church clocks have continued for several months this year, although the maintenance company has now agreed to rectify two main faults free of charge. Other, lesser maintenance is required and will be done as funds allow but meanwhile both clocks should be fully operative again.

Faulty street lighting has been reported, but if you are aware of any which do not work properly, please let the Clerk know, with the lamp post number if possible, who will pass on the details to the County Council.

Date of next meeting

The next meetings are scheduled for Thursdays 6th October and 3rd November 2011. There is always an open forum for the public to raise any Parish issues and everyone is welcome.

As a registered patient of the Welton Health Centre (WHC) you are automatically a member of the Patient Doctors Association (PDA.)

The PDA is a voluntary organisation which was formed in the early 1990s with the aim of enhancing the services provided by the WHC to its patients. This is achieved in two ways.

First through fund raising; specific medical equipment is purchased for use by the Practice, equipment that is not necessarily available through NHS funding.

Second, an increasingly important function is the Patient Transport Scheme. The PDA makes use of some 32 voluntary drivers to offer transport to and from any medical appointment either at the WHC or elsewhere. This service is offered to those patients who may have difficulty attending appointments and is booked through the WHC reception.

As an organisation, the PDA has a formal constitution and a committee comprising; a chairman, vice-chairman, secretary, treasurer, health liaison officer and 12 committee members. Should you wish to help and become a member of the Committee then please contact the WHC.

The PDA holds an AGM each year, this year it will be held on Thursday October 20th in the WHC from 7.30pm - all are welcome.

The speaker is Dr Sunil Hindocha, the Chair of the Commissioning Group to which the Welton Health Centre belongs. He will address proposed changes to the NHS.

YOUR OPINION COUNTS

A number of patients may have received a GP Patient Survey to complete. I would ask those receiving this survey to complete and return it to the relevant address. You may not be aware but the results of these surveys have a substantial financial effect on the funding received by the Practice. Consequently, there may be less money available for the services provided by the Health Centre and to offset this there becomes an increased need for the PDA to fund raise. Should you have a problem then please mention it to the receptionist or alternatively put it in writing, addressed to the PDA Chairman.

The NHS has recently introduced an initiative intended to improve those services provided by Health Centres. The aim of this scheme is to involve various patient groups in the decision making process regarding the services offered by the Practice and how these may be improved.

The Practice intends to set up a number of differing patient groups that will participate in several surveys then feed back their views to the Practice. You may well have been invited to take part and I would request that you become involved as the surveys could have a serious financial impact and will also influence how the Practice functions. The first survey should start towards the end of October and you may well have been asked for suggested survey topics

This is your Doctors Practice and your PDA so please come along to the AGM as we value you and need your input.
