FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP OF GRIMSBY

Dear Friends

Science - A Challenge to Religious Belief: this is the title of a recent little booklet written by a former colleague who, while spending most of his professional life as a research scientist, also found himself being ordained towards the end of his professional life.

When posed as a question, rather than as a statement (as in the booklet's title), it is one that always has me shouting 'No' in response. It was while I was doing my own research on sugar chemistry that I came to an active Christian faith, and yet in so much popular thinking today the title is held to be true. In the recent *British Social Attitudes* survey it was reported that 71% of people aged between 18 and 24 said they had 'no religion', fuelled I suspect at least in part by that cultural sense that science has triumphed and that 'religion' no longer has a part to play in the modern world.

By contrast, a short book I read over the summer (What We Talk About When We Talk About God by Rob Bell) used the word 'open' to describe the world we live in. A world that is 'open' to far more mystery and depth, beauty and order than science by itself can describe. As Rob Bell says, 'Science does an excellent job of telling me why I don't have a tail, but it can't explain why I find that interesting!'

A small group in the diocese is currently exploring the connections between science and faith, and at their recent day event, which was entitled much more positively 'The Fruitfulness of Science and Faith', it was pointed out that the history of the relationship between science and faith is complex, and it is one that has been 'hijacked' at times for ends that are nothing to do with faith or science. We looked at terms such as conflict, independence, dialogue, integration, complexity and prophetic conflict to describe possible positions that people have held, and all are good, but, in the end, it is that word 'open' that I like. That is, to be able to live in a world 'open' to the possibility of something beyond that which 'science' alone can describe. For me, that made sense, when I came to that conclusion, amongst the sugar solutions in the laboratory, over 35 years ago. It is something that I am convinced of still today.

NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Cllrs Roy Bellamy (Chair), Mrs Barbara Moulson (Vice Chair), Ken Green, David Barton-Smith, Mrs Claire Parr and Mrs Linda Houtby were present. Cllr Steve Bird, DC Jeff Summers, CC Lewis Strange and the police sent their apologies. The Clerk and one member of the public were in attendance.

The untidy state of **Manor Cliff** was discussed as there are weeds growing in the guttering and in the block paving. Mr Boyd had been informed that the protocol was to go through the Parish Council, but he is prepared to deal with this matter if the other residents of Manor Cliff agree to share the cost. It was agreed the Parish Council cannot afford to deal with the matter as other areas which have block paving would expect the Parish Council to deal with these. The Clerk was asked to request Highways weed kill areas which are very untidy in the village and at the same time ask them to cut back the very overgrown grass verges and hedgerows and the white lines to be refreshed.

The annual audit has been returned, completed and passed without any comments.

A report had been received from the **Community Park Committee** and a long discussion followed over their progress. Cllr R Bellamy agreed to make enquiries regarding the drainage, cutting the grass, clearing the barbed wire and the removal of a tree.

The **Neighbourhood Plan Committee** has finally received the remittance for the grant they applied for in July and will be holding a meeting shortly with the view of getting a questionnaire out to all villagers in Owmby and Normanby.

It was agreed to write to the Head of the school, asking she speaks to the children about playing in the **church yard**, before and after school, as some residents find their behaviour very disrespectful.

It was noted that a **Green Waste** consultation paper has been launched to ask residents opinion on paying for the green bin.

The **next meeting** has been called for Wednesday 18th October.



Planning - the Council has submitted its objections to the Poultry application, however Parishioners should now be aware that further information has been submitted to WLDC, and therefore an additional 30 day consultation period has begun. Please also note that whilst the Parish Council applaud the action group, they do not necessarily support all the view expressed in its literature. The view of the Council is the one posted in the minutes or under the submission marked Parish Council on the planning portal.

Children's Playground - the cradle swing is due to be repaired over the forthcoming month, and the Council are looking at replacing the matting under swing.

TO ALL PLAYGROUND USERS - After our Annual inspection, the Steamboat has been found not to be suitable for use much longer, we would like to put something else in its place and we welcome any feedback that can be given. 

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

ZERO TOLERANCE - I feel disappointed to have to make this the first part of our newsletter this month but after a few examples of rude and abusive behaviour from a very small number of patients, I am now required to remind those few that this behaviour is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.

We expect that you treat our staff with courtesy at all times. The staff work very hard on behalf of our patients and therefore we expect that they have the right to work in a safe environment. For this reason, Welton Surgery is committed to the NHS Zero Tolerance Policy. No form of violence or abuse is acceptable whether it be towards the staff or any other person on practice premises.

INFLUENZA VACCINES - A reminder for those that haven't already attended, we now have or 'flu vaccinations in stock and our final Saturday morning (*ADULTS ONLY*) drop in clinic will be held on Saturday 7th October 2017 between 9am and 11am. Annual seasonal influenza immunisation is recommended for people in the following groups, who are more at risk of the complications of influenza, including:

- All people aged 65 years and older (including all those aged 65 years on or before 31 March 2017).
- All people aged 6 months to under 65 years in the following clinical risk groups:
 - Chronic respiratory disease
 - > Chronic heart disease
 - Chronic liver disease
 - Chronic neurological disease
 - Diabetes mellitus
 - > Immunosuppression
 - > Asplenia or splenic dysfunction
 - > Pregnant women
 - ➤ Morbid obesity (BMI 40+)

Seasonal influenza immunization is recommended in certain healthy people to reduce the risk of transmission to vulnerable groups, including:

- Children aged 2 years to under 8 years old on 31 August 2016 (including children of appropriate age for school years 1, 2, and 3), as part of the national childhood influenza immunization programme.
- People living in long-stay residential and nursing homes or other long-stay care facilities (not including prisons, young offender's institutions, or university halls of residence).
- Household contacts of immunocompromised people, including carers (people who expect to share living accommodation on most days over the winter).
- People in receipt of a carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person
 whose welfare may be at risk if the carer falls ill. This should be considered on an individual basis, at the
 healthcare professional's discretion, and may include children who are carers.

Further dates for influenza clinics and children's vaccines to be confirmed. If you are unsure if you are eligible please check at Reception.

TELEPHONE CALLS - Please could we politely remind patients that if they have booked a telephone call with one of the clinicians to have their mobile telephones / landlines close by to prevent missed calls / the clinician needing to ring back.

HEPATITIS A AND HEPATITIS B (update) - We have been advised that the national shortage of Hepatitis A and B vaccines is likely to continue well into the New Year and as a result practices are unable to obtain further stocks. If you think that you may need one of these vaccines over the forthcoming months, please discuss this with one of our Practice Nurses who will be able to advise you further.

DNA's - In August, 34 patients did not attend for their appointments with the doctors and 80 appointments with the nurses. Over 19 hours of clinical time was lost. Please try to remember appointments or cancel with us if they are no longer required. This becomes especially important over the winter period as demand for appointment increases. **Please let us know if you are unable to make your appointment.**

STAFF TRAINING - The surgery will be closed for staff training from 1pm on Tuesday 17th until 8am on Wednesday 18th October 2017. When considering the staff training afternoon, please could we ask that you order any medication with as much notice as possible to enable us to meet the tight deadlines that we face.
