NORMANBY EDUCATIONAL CHARITY

IF YOU ARE RESIDENT IN NORMANBY AND HAVE CHILDREN UP TO THE AGE OF 25 IN FULL TIME EDUCATION PLEASE READ ON:

Normanby Educational Charity is a fund which is paid out annually and available to all students, up to the age of 25 years old, resident in Normanby by Spital.* The fund is **not** means tested but students must be in full time education and resident in Normanby by Spital, irrespective of where they are educated.

Please send your application to me at the address below and include the following: **names and addresses of the applicants, their dates of birth and the year they are in at school.** Also please state the date they started school if it was after **October 2018** or if they came to live in Normanby after that date..

Please ensure that you include the child's age and the year the child is in at school so that the correct entitlement is given

Please note that all students over the age of 16 must make the written application themselves. It must include their date of birth, brief details of where they are studying, the year they are in and the subjects being taken.

All applications must be received by **Monday 2nd December 2019**. Unfortunately, applications received after this date will not be accepted as the reports have to be prepared in time for the Meeting of the Trustees.

Please may I remind you that all students - even those who have received a payment in previous years - must apply. Please send your applications to: Mrs Gariff, 1 Chapel Lodge Drive, Normanby by Spital, LN8 2HR.

**Please note due to the terms of the Trust only students resident in Normanby by Spital are eligible to apply. The plaque can be found above the arch on the bell tower wall, commemorating the benefactor and the original terms of her bequest.*





*** 'FLU CLINICS' ***

For the 19/20 'flu season and for those that are eligible and fall into one of the 'at-risk' categories, NHS England have advised the use of two vaccines - one for those aged 65+ and one for under 65's. To ensure a safe and accurate system and so that we are able to allocate one vaccine for all those eligible, we will be organising our weekend 'flu clinics in the following ways:

This year's weekend 'flu clinics will be:

SATURDAY 28TH SEPTEMBER 2019: PRE-BOOKED CLINIC - FOR 65 years and under

SATURDAY 5th OCTOBER 2019: PRE-BOOKED CLINIC - for 16 years and over

SUNDAY 6th OCTOBER 2019: PRE-BOOKED CLINIC - for 16 years and over

HALF TERM WEEK (21st - 25th OCTOBER 2019) - PRE-BOOKED CLINICS ages 2, 3 and 4 year olds that aren't at school.

These clinics will all be PRE-BOOKED - please contact reception for an appointment. If you are attending the surgery for another appointment, please let the clinician know and they will organise the 'flu vaccine for you at the same time.

CARERS - If you are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person, whose welfare may be at risk if you fall ill OR you are in receipt of carer's allowance you will be entitled to a free 'flu vaccine. Please let our reception team know so they can add you to our carer's register in preparation for 'flu season.

DID NOT ATTEND (DNA) - In August, 98% of patients attended the surgery for their appointments. We would like to thank these patients for attending or those that cancelled appointments they were unable to make so that slot could be used by another patient. If you would like to be able to receive booking confirmations and text message reminders for appointments, please see Reception to sign up to this facility.

ON THE DAY APPOINTMENTS - Please can we remind patients that the surgery does not open until 8am each morning as clinical staff are not on the premises before this time. Doctors and Nurse Practitioners start seeing the patients at 8.30am. If you are feeling unwell particularly if you have chest pain, shortness of breath, severe bleeding or collapse please phone 999 immediately or for less urgent advice phone 111. DO NOT COME AND STAND IN THE QUEUE OUTSIDE THE PRACTICE.

The acute illness clinic closes at 9.15am every day. After 9.15am until 6.30pm if you need to see a doctor on the day please telephone the surgery and you will be directed to the best option to meet your needs. Please DO NOT use the surgery as a walk in centre as you may be disappointed when you are asked to go home to wait for a call from the doctor.

STAFF TRAINING - The surgery will be closed for staff training from **1pm on Tuesday 15th October 2019 until 8am on Wednesday 16th October 2019**. Please could we ask that you order any medication with as much notice as possible to enable us to meet the tight deadlines that we face. A minimum of two working days' notice is required please. For those that don't already use the service, we have facilities to order your medication online at any time, please see Dispensary for more details.


