THIS MONTH'S PASTORAL LETTER

As I write this article, we are in the period of mourning following the death of her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. We have opened our churches as spaces for people to write in a book of condolence, to light a candle, to remember and to pray. In these local spaces, and around the nation, there has been an outpouring of grief. Her late Majesty said, "Grief is the price we pay for love". Many loved the late queen, and for many, her death has brought to the surface the pain they feel over lost loved ones. Sometimes we feel so alone in our grief, but this period of mourning has shown us that we are not alone, we live in a community of fellow mourners, a community of people who love and have lost their loved ones. As Christians, we believe that we belong to a community not only of the living but of the dead, a community of people held together in the love of God forever. We sometimes feel angry with God when we lose our loved ones. It is right to feel angry that death exists, to wish that we didn't have to go through the suffering of losing someone we love. It is a terrible tragedy. I find that, when I talk to God about this, a glimmer of light is seen in the darkness. I become aware that He walks with us through the darkness, that He understands the pain. Grief is the price we pay for love, but ultimately Love is greater than our grief and it is Love not loss that has the final word.

The late queen had a deep Christian faith from which she drew strength for her years of devoted service. In the year 2000 she said that she found "great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example."

Now, as autumn begins, as nature displays its glory before passing into the sleep of winter, I am reminded of Christ's words "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11.28). We face many challenges as we move towards the winter. May we follow Christ's example, building a community willing to serve others, working for a peaceful and just world and being there for each other in times of need.

CHRISTMAS APPEAL







I thought I would share with you what's been happening at Welton Larder. At the start of the pandemic, we opened a foodbank every Thursday afternoon in St Mary's Church, Welton. It's been serving people in the community and beyond ever since.

There are many reasons why people access a foodbank, but regardless, we try to give everyone a warm welcome because it can be really difficult to admit that you need help.

We have stocked shelves which offer a range of basic produce, even fresh fruit and vegetables when available. And at Christmas and Easter we also provide vouchers for the local butcher on Ryland Road, to whom we are very grateful for their support.

Recently, we began a new venture. We now open from 11.30am for coffee, tea, cake, and a simple light lunch, remaining open until 3pm. It is open to anyone who would like to meet new people, have a chat with old friends, enjoy some good free food, and if need be, access the Larder too. Going forward we also hope to offer a range of support and advice services. If you know someone who needs help, please let them know about us, and if you would like to meet new friends pop in for a cuppa and say hello.



Born a Crime by Trevor Noah

This book is not another autobiography in the usual style but a collection of stories from the



authors's lived experiences being born and raised in a South Africa of apartheid. It struck me as the most insightful, honest, sometimes shocking but also occasionally humorous read.

You may know Trevor Noah as the young South African born comedian and USA Talk show host, who uses his humour to make social and political comment. You can catch him on Youtube to see samples of his intelligent, quick witted, straight talking but crafted delivery.

As the title suggests the circumstances of his birth was a crime punishable by imprisonment or worse. Noah's mother was a poor but strong-willed black South African women who's relationship with the author's white Swiss born father was illegal in the eyes of the government of the day.

The segregation system categorised Trevor as 'coloured' and therefore he could not be seen with his black mother

or his white father. This presented a constant fear of being discovered but also a complex maze of identity issues, trying to find a place he could fit within the family and communities.

Noah's quick wit, tenacity, energy, high spirits and multi-lingual skills takes you on a breathtaking voyage of discovery through the boy's eyes. A worthwhile journey.
