OCTOBER'S LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

As I sit here writing this, many of our children and grandchildren have been back at school for a week or more. Time definitely waits for no one, and September has come round again. As you probably guessed from my last musings, I really really like the long days and summer sunshine. However, even I have to admit that autumn has its own attractions and we have had a recent burst of late summer warm weather which was very welcome after all the rain.

Years of being in the school system as a child, then as a student not to mention 16 years of my own children being in the school system means that September signifies to me a fresh start, probably involving new shoes and some nice stationery! Was I the only one who used to love wrapping my new textbooks with protective wallpaper covers carefully made from an enormous book of wallpaper samples. Do these even still exist?

September also means that the Open the Book team is back performing in the Welton, Dunholme and Scothern primary schools. I missed the first presentation this week because I was away on a quilting course with my friend from Norway but by all accounts, the team did an excellent job presenting The Creation story to the children in Dunholme. Next week they will be presenting the same story at St Mary's Welton first and then going on to Ellison Boulters School afterwards. You are probably wondering what on earth Open the Book is. Well, Open the Book is an exciting storytelling project where Bible stories are shared with children in a way that is fun, interactive and memorable. As invited guests in school, storytelling teams use the specially written resources to prepare and present a 10-15-minute scripted Bible story to a school assembly, involving the children as much as possible. Open the Book is all about telling Bible stories, not preaching or evangelising, so children of all faiths and those with no faith can watch and interact with the stories in their own way.

According to a recently conducted Times survey, about three quarters of serving Church of England priests believe that the UK cannot now be called a Christian country which I find very saddening. The priests are correct of course as only some 1.2% of the population regularly attend a service in the established church. However, there are growing numbers of people attending evangelical and Pentecostal churches which is good news. Other recent polling suggests belief in God may even have risen. And among those who say they have no religion or faith, 11% say there is definitely or probably a God, while a further 17% say they do not know - indicating that the 'no religion' choice doesn't necessarily indicate an atheist position. I think that on the whole parents are keen that their children learn about Christian values though. Although many would argue that the old church was too restrictive by our modern standards, it did, and still does, provide a robust template by which we can lead decent lives in a society that works for the common good. I think we would all agree that the ten commandments and the teachings of Jesus are not a bad place to start if we, as citizens, want a harmonious life.

It was Reverend Jane Foster-Smith who got the Welton, Dunholme and Scothern team started, and it really is a lot of fun. The children seem to appreciate our efforts and many of them say how much they look forward to our visits. There is also a new group starting up in Nettleham and wouldn't it be amazing if we could offer other schools in our area the opportunity to hear stories from the Bible?

If you think this is something that you might be interested in, we are always looking for new members. You would need to be safely recruited, undergo some training and have a DBS check before being allowed to take part in a performance but don't let that put you off. Just remember a Bible story well told has the power to spark the imagination, inspire exploration, give hope, create a smile, teach important lessons and connect generations. And what better time to start new projects, freshen things up and maybe even try new things than in the autumn?



Note: all students over the age of 16 must make the application themselves, adding the subjects being taken to the above requested information.

To help with the allocation of funds, please ensure that all the above information requested is include in your application.

Applications must be received by Saturday 1st December 2023 at the latest. Unfortunately, applications received after this date may not be accepted as the allocations have to be prepared in time for the Meeting of the Trustees.

Please may I remind you that all students, even those who have received a payment in previous years, must re-apply.
