



RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

When I came to Owmby Group of Parishes in November 2000, I was able to say that I expected to be here for 12 years, as I am due to retire in 2012 (there you are, you can work out how old I am).

I'm now about half-way through that period. I've been here six years, although sometimes it only feels like six months.

So, it's time for me to take stock of a few things, of what has (or has not been achieved during my first six years, & of what still needs to be done.

I'm not going through the catalogue of achievements & otherwise. You'll know the score within your own village, whether the church is better, worse, or just the same, whether the building is in better nick, whether the Christian community among you makes any difference.

There's at least six years' more work for me to do.

But let me say this. When I came here, you had been without a priest of your own for about 18 months. During that time, many people had taken it on themselves to make sure that the life and witness of the churches flourished. When I first came here, I almost wondered what there was for me to do, as other people were doing so much.

Now, it seems as if we're all hard at it.

But I do know, I have come know, what people in the Owmby Group of Parishes expect from their Rector. And it's not always what I think it should be.

We hear a lot about the increasing shortage of clergy in all the churches. Others have it worse, but even the Church of England is having to plan for a drastic reduction in its clergy numbers over the next few years, as my generation retires, and far fewer younger people come in to replace us.

By the time I retire, I doubt there will be half the number of vicars & rectors that there is now. I might even be the last Rector of the Owmby Group of Parishes. And we shall have to have learnt new ways of being church.

Actually, we've started.

Other people deal with the lion's share of looking after our church buildings and raising the (huge amounts of) money needed both for that work and for keeping the show on the road (which nowadays includes paying towards the pensions of the army of retired clergy and clergy widows). Other people still (and we need many more of you) are training for ministry, not only to take church services but also to lead local church communities and to exercise pastoral care in our villages. They won't end up as "vicars", but they will end up as local ministers, with a variety of titles and roles.

Once upon a time the local parson was expected to be the omni-competent leader of the church in the local community. Nowadays, he (or she) probably doesn't even live there, & comes in for a while to attend to just some of the work they used to do.

Twice upon a time, I don't think there will be a parson at all. And I have a feeling that God thinks the same.

The long-term future of all our churches depends on local people taking hold of initiatives to make sure that churches don't just survive, but flourish as the agents of the kingdom of God in our land. Which is what they were put there for in the first place.

What will your ministry be in all of this?

NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 9th August where Cllrs Roy Bellamy (Chairman), Ken Green, Mick Crowe, Adam Carter, David Kelsey and Mrs Adele Crowther were present. In attendance:- County Councillor Lewis Strange, Mrs Nadine Fox (Clerk) and one member of the public.

Apologies were received from Cllr Mrs Sally Mundy.

Public speaking time – many concerns were expressed regarding alterations to a property in the village. Councillors agreed to monitor the situation.

Noted complaints regarding speeding tractors, a stray dog, a noisy motor bike and low flying passenger planes.

The Parish Council meeting opened at 7.54pm. Highways matters – agreed to request urgent repairs to potholes in the village and for the resurfacing to be done. Before zigzag lines can be repainted and extended outside the school, the School Governors' have to make the request to Highways. Overhanging trees/hedgerow – Main Street, Mill Lane and Highgate Lane – agreed to request Highways deal with this matter as soon as possible. A tree survey is to be conducted by the Chairman.

Nothing to report on the play area for children or on speeding traffic. The church wall has been repaired and the High Street name plate has been replaced.

The grant for the War Memorial Book has been received and a lot of progress has been made – anticipated launch date for this book is around 10th/11th November. A quote has been received to restore the Memorial stone and Owmby has agreed to share the cost.

OWMBY PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE.

Last meeting held 24/7/06. pre meeting points to note.

Police information box is now being used and information already been acted up, so keep using it.

Rural Housing Enabler, Mrs Thomas explained WLDC policy on affordable housing and offered to survey Owmby residents to assess any housing needs. Normanby PC will also to be contacted so that could take part in the survey. PC accepted the offer. Survey Oct / Nov.

Public participation. Complains were received on the state of the hedge again on fen road, hawthorn branches encroaching upon the footpath. Clerk to write to the tenant farmer and request he cut hedges and this time brush the road.

Points raised in the meeting.

Footpath 9 across the cricket pitch & golf course still no direction signs, clerk to chase again!

The Paddock access/ egress WLDC Highway department will not alter the junction. Clerk to request "Concealed Access" sign.

Dog bins, 2 new ones Fen Road and the cemetery, third next year.

PC Notice board to be moved to the Normanby side of the surgery for better access. (thank you Dr Sultan)

WLDC consultation ref Recycling bin for the village. PC suggested that the only viable place was the Bottle & Glass with the others. Subject to the landlords agreement.

Free trees, 2 would be sought for the cemetery, permission to be sought as it is WLDC property also to plant some bulbs. The school might also be involved **Normanby Hall Trust Fund** stands at £9,032.37 (fund from the sale of the old village hall)

War Memorial Book. A book mainly on the villagers who fought in the 1st World War and based on the memorial is being produced by James Connor. This is being reviewed by both PC's and is being launched fittingly on the 11/11/06 in the school. There are plans for an exhibition of the book, village life at the time, copies available and hopefully Museum of Lincolnshire Life will be present with items from the time for the children to see and touch. A family day for all put it in your diary! More details to follow.

Highway Works. Surfacing and drainage works to Normanby road, Fen Road and Green/Mill Lane are in this years budget and should be well underway by now.

NB. Full Council minutes are on the Parish Notice Board by the Surgery. Councillors are always glad to receive constructive comments on village life / facilities so please come to the meetings or phone.

The next meeting will be on Monday 23rd October in Owmby Church at 7.30pm.

BOBBIES BEAT

New Child Car Seat Regulations – New regulations governing the use of child car seats are coming into effect this month (Sept). Hopefully by now you will have seen the publicity surrounding this so will be aware. Basically, children under 3



years of age MUST use the child restraint (ie child seat or booster) appropriate for their weight in any vehicle (including vans and other goods vehicles). In vehicles where seat belts are fitted, children aged between 3 years and 12 years of age up to a height of 135 cm (4ft 5ins) MUST use the appropriate child restraint. "Child restraints" is the collective term in the seat belt wearing legislation for:

Baby seat – rear facing and for children up to 13kg (approx age birth to 9/12 months)

Child seat – forward facing and for children 9kg to 18kg (approx 9 months to 4 years)

Booster seats – for children 15kg to 25kg (approx 4 to 6 years)

Booster cushions – for children 6 years and up.

Rear facing baby seats MUST NOT be used in a seat protected by a frontal air bag unless the airbag has been deactivated manually or automatically.

Who is responsible? Drivers are responsible in law for making sure that children under 14 years use seat belts or child restraints in cars, goods vehicles and mini-buses.

There are always exceptions – the "what if's" I don't want to get bogged down in these as this may cause confusion. But an example would be in an emergency for instance. There are others but if you have any questions, contact me and I will try and help. I think some well-known high street car accessory shops have leaflets re; the new law and could assist in fitting.

We will not however tolerate verbal (or obviously, physical) abuse of our staff, such actions are always taken seriously and may result in a patient being asked to find another doctor.


