SEPTEMBER'S LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Before writing a Ministry Team Letter for Signpost, I usually have a number of ideas or themes in my mind that eventually evolve, over time, into the printed version. Today it is different. On Monday 30 July, news outlets were reporting on the horrific attack and stabbing of children and adults who were enjoying a happy, carefree dance class in Southport. For two weeks the news was dominated by reports and details about what happened during a few brief minutes that tragically ended the lives of three beautiful children and left other children and adults critically injured.

Journalists arrived quickly on the scene and we saw and heard from people in the local community who were horrified by what had happened. When interviewed on camera, eyewitnesses could not speak about what had happened. Some people used the same words; horrific, horrendous, unbelievable. It was clear that people who were nearby and had witnessed what had happened were traumatised. Words that we use in our everyday vocabulary were inadequate to express feelings of shock, grief and helplessness with one bystander summoning up what had been witnessed; "nobody can believe it; how do you even comprehend what has happened?" Within hours friends, neighbours and people from the local community began to bring flowers; children laid down teddy bears and candles were lit near the street where the attacks took place. It was as if people needed a place to go to where they could think, pray and cry. This they did in silence.

Following on from this tragedy we learned of riots where it appears that angry mobs, inflamed by postings on social media, used their words and actions to incite feelings of hatred, intolerance and prejudice. This they did in anger.

How do we respond when we are "lost for words? Communities in the towns and cities where riots took place expressed their sorrow and anger in practical ways. Churches and Community Centres opened their doors giving quiet spaces to those who needed to find a place of peace, love, compassion and prayer. Groups of people came together to sweep away debris, to replace windows and rebuild walls. Someone set up a "Just Giving "page in the hope of raising £100, but this amount quickly grew to over £1000 which will be shared between local communities where properties were damaged in the riots.

When our lives are turned upside down by the shock of something that happens unexpectedly, we too can be "lost for words." In these circumstances people of faith may pray using a familiar prayer such as "The Lord's Prayer" on behalf of themselves or others. People of no faith may turn to stillness and mindfulness.

When you receive this edition of Signpost, in early September, many of the flowers laid in memory of Alice, Elsie Dot and Bebe will have wilted and been removed. The initial shock and horror of the attacks will have subsided. People will again be able to find words to express their feelings. But for many, especially the parents and family of Alice, Elsie Dot and Bebe, the pain and grief may never go away and they will continue to be lost for words, so let us all speak for them by keeping them in our thoughts and prayers.

Major Roofing Project for St Michael & All Angels Church, Hackthorn

A major project is to begin in mid-September to re-slate the nave and north aisle roofs of the church. Rain leaking in has resulted in damage to the historic organ so the re-roofing is needed as a matter of urgency. The work is projected to cost some £110.000 and we are fortunate to have secured grants of £20,000 from Marshall's Charity and £10,000 from the National Churches Trust on behalf of the Wolfson Foundation to help with this vital repair work.

The building work will mean that unfortunately our church will be closed for the duration of the project, a period of about 3 months, during which time our congregation will join and support the other churches in Owmby Group. We very much hope to be able to resume services in December.

At St Michael & All Angels, Hackthorn we are so grateful to the National Churches Trust and Marshall's Charity for the grants towards the cost of the urgent repairs needed to make the roof watertight. We work hard to keep our lovely church welcoming and well cared for - having a leaking roof has made this very challenging!

Such a large project is extremely daunting but being able to carry out the much needed repair with the help of these grants will ensure the future of the building that means so much to so many. When the building is watertight again, we shall work towards restoring the internal decoration which has been impacted by the leaks and begin to address the damage that has been done to our historic organ. As stewards of this significant building, we want to do our best to ensure its future as a place of worship and an important focal point in our community. Once again, we are very grateful to the National Churches Trust and Marshall's Charity for this support.


