#### **MINISTRY LETTER FOR SEPTEMBER 2025**

You're Never Too Old to Learn.

Or so the saying goes. Learning is usually associated with infancy, school days and youth. From birth we learn to smile, eat with a spoon, crawl, walk, talk, and reach other milestone events in our lives. We learn to write, read, count, draw, paint, ride a bike, skip and many other skills and accomplishments which we develop over time. And then comes the time when we are ready to learn to drive, apply for a passport, give first aid, how to fix a leaking tap and find a job. We learn so much throughout our lives and much of it is because we have good teachers. It's easy to recount when learning begins but the question is "does it ever end?" Hopefully not, because in learning something new we are refreshed and feel a sense of achievement. For each of our churches in the Owmby Group of Parishes there are Church Wardens. They weren't born as Church Wardens; they had to learn the job as they went along. Agreeing to be a Church Warden is a steep learning curve probably unlike anything else they have been trained for. Not only did they learn how to set up for weekly services, they quickly began to be experts in preparing for funerals, weddings, and baptisms; how to complete registers and annual data returns; apply for a faculty; what to do if a tree fell onto the church during a gale or the roof needed repairing and now, more recently, how to negotiate their way through new legislation safeguarding and health and safety All this they do as unpaid volunteers.

As you drive or walk past our churches, you can see that they are loved and well cared for. Step inside one of our churches and you will see the same care. This is thanks to the Church Wardens and other volunteers who give their time freely.

At the beginning of His ministry, Jesus gathered a disparate group of twelve men who followed Him from the shores of Galilee to the foot of the cross. The Bible doesn't describe the backgrounds of all the disciples, but we know that Peter, Andrew, James and John were fishermen, and Matthew was a tax collector. What we do know is that each disciple was a volunteer who left his home and family to learn and understand what their new lives would be with Jesus as their teacher.

Two thousand years later, Christians try their best to follow Jesus' teaching. Following Jesus helps us to realise that we still have a lot to learn about ourselves and other people. It is a lifetime commitment. Rather like volunteering to be a Church Warden.




