MINISTRY TEAM LETTER FOR SEPTEMBER 2026

What is life if full of care we have no time to stand and stare?

Most of my friends and acquaintances, like me, are now retired and we often say, "I don't know how we found the time to work!" How can that be? I am full of admiration for today's young parents as they juggle caring for their children with work commitments, school runs, out of school clubs and arrangements for childcare. Parents now live busier lives than I did. I look at them and feel that they are having to "squeeze a quart (2 pints) into a pint pot". Being busy can be a good thing especially for those who live alone, are waiting for test results or are bereaved. The act of filling time with busyness helps to take the mind off feelings of anxiety, pain and suffering. Through carrying out every day routine activities, bodies, minds and spirits can be given a chance to heal and lives put back into balance.

Whether we are an adult or child, grandparent, parent or carer, working or retired, we can all benefit from periods of slowing down our busy lives by having some quiet time in quiet spaces. We are lucky to live in an area where we are never far from quiet places. 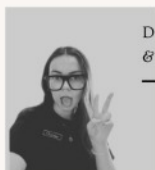

Glentham Parish Council - Meeting Highlights (9 July 2026)

The Parish Council met on 9th July at the Village Hall. Councillors received an update from County Cllr Bunney, who reported good progress with food waste collections and upcoming improvements to recycling, including soft plastics, batteries and vapes.

The Council discussed a request from VIDA to meet about their proposed anaerobic digester. Councillors agreed to hear more at a future meeting, purely for information, and emphasised that this does not indicate support for the project.

Routine maintenance was reviewed, including grass cutting, tree removal and repairs to the church clock. The Clerk is working with HMRC and the VAT office to ensure PAYE and VAT records are fully up to date.

New noticeboards will be purchased for the village, and the Village Hall reported a successful fundraising evening.

The Council noted that more parish councillors are needed and encouraged anyone interested to get in touch. Playground equipment will now be cleaned monthly due to tree sap.

WELTON PATIENT AND DOCTORS ASSOCIATION

I have had no response to my request for someone to help with the fund raising which is disappointing. If I don't get any offers of help I will have to consider which of our fund raising events to cancel for 2027. It will most likely be the Autumn Fayre.

I did have a message left, while I was on holiday, from a lady enquiring about being a volunteer driver. If you read this, could you call again as I have been unable, as I write this article, to make contact with you! I would still like at least 3 more new drivers who can offer a bit of time each month. The pressure on the transport scheme is becoming difficult to meet with more and more houses being built in the health centre catchment area (I can explain how it all works with no commitment from yourself).

Could I ask that if you have a car or are able to get to your medical appointment without using the PDA then please use your own vehicle. Just because we are the easy option is not a good enough reason to ask for PDA transport. We have had patients saying that parking is difficult at hospitals. This is not a reason to request PDA transport, our drivers also have difficulty parking. I know that the majority of users of the scheme are genuinely in need of transport but there is still a small minority who have cars and could easily transport themselves!

I am sorry if this sounds harsh but in the almost 20 years I have been Coordinator I have only ever had to turn down 1 request and that was weather related. Unless I get more volunteer drivers I will have to be more selective about who we can offer transport to and that is not a position I want to be in!

The Autumn Fayre will be held on 17th October and I am still looking for donations of small items for the tombola and trash or treasure stalls. If you have anything at all you could donate, please give me a call and I can collect or they can be left at the health centre marked for my attention (almost anything is suitable!).
