Feeding the 4,400!

In 2022 Owmby Group and Springline Parish collected enough food (about $1\frac{1}{2}$ tons) to make 4,400 meals in December - especially for Christmas. We organised a **Reverse Advent Calendar**. In a traditional Advent Calendar there is a piece of chocolate for 25 days of December. In a Reverse Advent Calendar we collect food to give away. The idea is to contribute 25 items for Foodbank. I recently visited a Foodbank. People were missing meals because they couldn't afford the food. Even some in work were struggling. The volunteers provided friendly smiles, a warm drink, a snack and a sympathetic listening ear. It was an oasis.

We hope to match the collecting effort of two years ago - especially in this time of a cost of living crisis.

HACKTHORN & COLD HANWORTH

HACKTHORN C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

It was a dinnertime with a difference on 9th October, as some of our children enjoyed a trip to the village hall to be part of their community lunch.

This is a wonderful initiative run by villagers and church wardens where local residents join together for soup and dessert on the first Wednesday of every month. And this time some of our Key Stage Two pupils were invited.

The children were 'put to work' setting tables, taking orders and clearing dishes... but most importantly joining the residents for their lunch and a good chat!

We can't wait to join them for Christmas lunch and to sing Christmas carols. A big thank you to Hackthorn residents for making us feel so welcome; there was a lovely community spirit.

Key Stage Two2 were treated to a performance of Twelfth Night by the Young Shakespeare Company (YSC). Our children took part with great enthusiasm, being selected to play parts, creating atmosphere with sound effects as well as making insightful comments about the characters' feelings and motives. A fantastic morning was had. YSC visits every year, meaning children experience four different plays over their time at Hackthorn.

Hopefully this goes some way to developing a love for the Bard in preparation for their secondary education, as well as a real love for a wonderful writer.

This year we chose to become involved with World Mental Health Day and supported Young Minds' 'Hello Yellow' campaign to raise awareness of the importance of sharing our worries and concerns with others. All the children came to school dressed brightly (some even dressed as bananas!).

Our School Council arranged and ran a photo booth over break times where the children posed with props made by School Council as well as some items from the dressing up boxes and also with their friends. Lots of fun was had whilst becoming more aware of mental health and what this means. We spent time doodling along with Doodle Boy and considered what we have done recently to support our own wellbeing.

Key Stage One youngsters have been looking at Significant People as part of their history topic. Their focus has been nursing through history and they have loved learning about Florence Nightingale. They have also studied the lesser known First World War nurse Nellie Spindler, The Angel of Passchendaele, which has really sparked their interest and empathy.

From this, we have started a People Who Help us topic with Key Stage One and EYFS (Eary Years Foundation Stage). We have been visited by 'Nurse Nic', an ACP nurse from A & E at Lincoln County Hospital. She brought with her lots of tools of the trade and used the teachers to demonstrate on. The children asked fantastic questions and she was very impressed with their knowledge of the body. She left lots of equipment for our new 999 service role play station.

Alternatively, send a letter including the following: Name, address and phone number of the applicant, date of birth, which school/college they are attending and which year they are in at school/college. Also please state the date they became residents in Normanby by Spital or started school if it was after October 2023.

Note: all students over the age of 16 must make the application themselves, adding the subjects being taken to the above requested information.

To help with the allocation of funds, please ensure that all the above information requested is include in your application.

Applications must be received by Saturday 1st December 2024 at the latest. Unfortunately, applications received after this date may not be accepted as the allocations have to be prepared in time for the Meeting of the Trustees.

Please may I remind you that all students, even those who have received a payment in previous years, must re-apply.


