#### FEBRUARY'S MINISTRY LETTER

#### Lighten our Darkness

When you receive this month's Signpost Magazine, Christmas and New Year Celebrations will be well and truly over. Most people, especially children, look forward to Christmas but for some the preparations for the "big day" may have resulted in frayed tempers, anxiety about the cost implications and spending more money than they could afford. Shopping for presents, toys, clothes, food and decorations; writing Christmas cards and visiting relatives and friends can be exhausting. We seem to wait so long for Christmas that when it finally arrives it is easy to become distracted from being able to experience the joy, happiness and anticipation of this special season.

No sooner does Christmas Day arrive than it is over. The 6th of January is thought of as the 12th night after Jesus' birth when, by tradition, the three kings visited the infant Jesus and presented their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. It marks the end of Christmas. It is still customary for many people to remove Christmas decorations before 12th night. My mother, who had several "old wives' tales," believed it brought bad luck to leave decorations up beyond then.

In the church tradition, Candlemas is the day that really ends the Christmas season. Candlemas falls on 2nd February, 40 days after the birth of Jesus and marks the time that Joseph and Mary took the infant Jesus to the Temple. Here they were greeted by Simeon who had waited for many years to see the Messiah. As Simeon takes the infant Jesus into his arms, he knows him to be the one he has been waiting for.

Many churches will pack away the Nativity Scenes on the 2nd February; a date that is part way between Christmas and Good Friday; part-way between Jesus' birth and Jesus' death. Perhaps you have now taken down all of your Christmas decorations. Lights that shone brightly on the tree, in windows and outside your homes will have been switched off and put into storage.

In my home we follow the Candlemas tradition. The main decorations have been returned to the loft, but the nativity set is still on display, and we will continue to switch on the seven light Menorah displayed in our window until 2nd February. The lights provide a welcome reminder that even during the cold, dark days of January we have the promise that Jesus is the light of the world, and there won't be too long to wait until we see the beauty and new growth of Spring. Now, isn't that something very special to look forward to?

The children were excited to return to school for the new term, and there was a flurry of snow to welcome them back.

Key stage one have started this block of six weeks with gymnastics at Witham Hill, and the first week saw many of those children who had not attended before being a little nervous of some of the apparatus, unsure of jumping off and hanging on to various pieces of equipment. But by the end of the hour they were throwing themselves into the pit and jumping off the vaulting horse. It is such a great opportunity for our children to learn these skills.

The same Key Stage have also started their new English book "The Antlered Ship" and are excited by some of the place names that are mentioned on the map at the front of the book.

Years 3 and 4 have started their History topic on the Anglo Saxons and have been interested to learn that they used sign language to communicate and some of our place names originate from Anglo Saxon times. They shared their new learnt knowledge in Friday Worship.

Years 5/6 have also started a new English book called "The Wild Way Home" by Sophie Kirtley. After the first two lessons the children were that excited about the book they were talking about it on the playground, wondering if Charlie could be a boy or a girl, and they could not wait for their next English lesson. The whole school heard a little bit about the plot when one of our Year 6 pupils shared this in Collective Worship.
