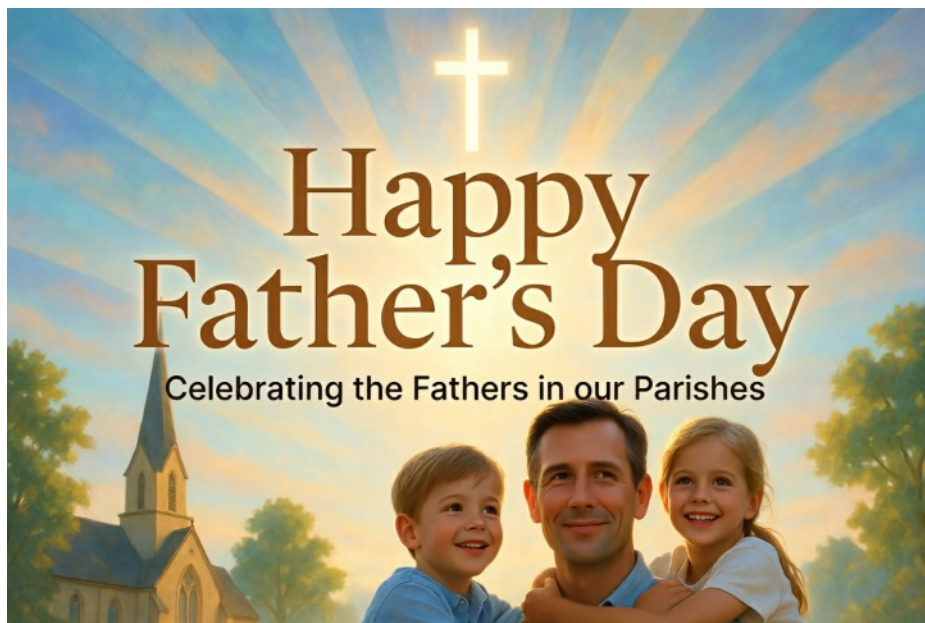

MINISTRY LETTER FOR JUNE 2026

BEING NELLY'S APPRENTICE

I worked in a Technical College where we taught apprentices. Somebody described apprenticeship as, "Watching Nelly do it, letting Nelly watch you do it, then going and doing it yourself." This is an ancient model. For example, it's what Jesus' disciples did. They spent 3 years spending time with Jesus, became like him and then they went off and did what he did. Put simply if we are to grow as Christians we should:

- Be with Jesus
- Become like him and then
- Do as he did.

Here's the thing: if you spend time with God, he does (good) stuff to you. I know this because I spend time with him and he does (good) stuff. Mostly, it is so gentle I don't realise he's done it until later. My wife and I have a very simple discipline of starting every day spending time in the presence of God. Bible Reading Fellowship or Scripture Union provide daily Bible Reading notes to help people do this. About 13 years ago, we started asking, "What are you doing, Lord. How can we step into that?" Then somehow, I can't say how, we found ourselves responsible for a weekly assembly in Hackthorn School. And then, somehow this grew to Ingham and Scampton Schools. And then we were doing a monthly after-school Messy Church in Ingham (not a church school) to which nearly half the children chose to come (along with a parent or carer). The Messy Church needed a team of about 10 people and we have no idea how we recruited them - they just appeared as we spoke about what we were planning. And some of them didn't really have close church links. Our local Methodist Chapel closed and 4 of the remaining people decided they wanted to do a Café Church in our village hall once a month so asked me to front it up. I found myself speaking about Jesus to about 200 children and adults a week in school assemblies, about 60 people in Messy Church once a month and Café Church now has over 40 people who are part of it. For the last 4 years we have organised a Reverse Advent Calendar where people collect food items through November so Foodbank has stocks to help people over Christmas - you have helped us raise nearly 2 tons of food over that time. Great! Thanks!

I'm now moving house and retiring from this work. On reflecting about my ministry I came to the conclusion that one of the things that has been my message is for people to SPEND TIME IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD (be like the disciples - Be with Jesus). If you do this he won't send you to China and he won't ask you to do something outside your skill set. He'll work with you according to your needs and abilities. He's gentle and kind.

So, as I say "Farewell" to you this is my hope - that you SPEND TIME IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD. Honestly, you will find that God will gently do (good) stuff when you do this. He won't send you to China and he won't ask you to do something outside your skill set. He'll work with you according to your needs and abilities.

Clean sanitation is still seen as a privilege in many places of the world. There is a way we can partner with our global brothers and sisters to increase access to toilets worldwide.

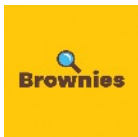
Almost 1:3 people in the world don't have access to a safe place to go to the toilet. There are 1000's of deaths each year due to poor sanitation - diseases such as cholera.

The new self-service booking option is now being used by even more patients and it seems to be working well. Just to remind anyone wanting to try this new way of booking PDA transport, the form is accessed by logging in to www.weltonurgery.co.uk and can be done on a computer, I pad or most modern phones. On the Health Centre home page you will find a link with the PDA logo, titled BOOK PDA TRANSPORT. Clicking this link will take you to our Terms and Conditions and then on to the booking form. Once completed, with the details of your appointment, press the submit button at the bottom and this will be sent to the coordinator on a secure webpage. The coordinator will allocate the job to a driver and inform the patient, by phone, of driver name and pick up time. This will mean you won't have to wait in a queue on the phone to the Health Centre and it will free up their phone lines. If you're not confident to try this system, a family member or friend can complete the form for you.

The plant sale at Welton May Fair on Welton Village Green together with plants sold outside the health centre on 9th May made a total profit of £431.85 for PDA funds. Thank you to all who donated plants to this sale and also to everyone who came along to buy. Luckily the weather was on our side which made a huge difference to the number of people out and about!

I have been asked to inform everyone who has been saving their medication blister packs that the person collecting no longer has an out let for them. Thanks to those who have left them with me to pass on.

With the ever-increasing number of requests for transport I find myself once again asking whether anyone reading this would consider being a volunteer driver for the PDA. I am happy to explain what is involved with no pressure. If you enjoy meeting people and have a few hours here and there to spare for this very worthy cause, please give me a call on the number below. My last appeal produced 5 new drivers which was a great response!

If you would like to book a table priced £10 to sell your own craft items etc at our Autumn Fayre, please give me a call. Sorry no cakes as we have our own cake stall and no hot food.

We are hoping to have a visit from 'Walking with Alpacas' from Legsby near Market Rasen. Many of you will have seen them at Welton May Fair on bank holiday Monday. More about this later.

Welton WordFest is returning to the village this June 6th, bringing with it a burst of creativity, conversation and community spirit. Whether you're an avid reader, a budding writer, a parent looking for something fun to do with the kids, or simply someone who enjoys being part of a warm community gathering, there's something on the programme for you.

One of the highlights of the day is a special creative writing workshop led by local author Gillian Poucher. Her session, The Craft of Fiction, runs from 1:30pm to 3pm at Welton Library and offers a friendly, supportive introduction to shaping stories and developing writing confidence. This workshop is completely free, but places are limited - only 10 tickets are available.

Families are also catered for at the library. The morning begins with children's storytime and crafts at 10:30am, perfect for little ones who love listening, making and exploring. Between 10am - 12pm, families can also take part in a fun scavenger hunt around the library - a brilliant way to get children excited about books and the magic of discovering new things. No tickets - open to all.

Over at The Nook Coffee House, the atmosphere shifts into something calm, cosy and quietly communal with the Silent Book Club, starting from 3:30pm. Again places are limited - only 20 tickets are available. This gentle, mindful event invites you to settle in with the book you're currently reading and enjoy around an hour of peaceful reading time alongside others. Afterwards, there's an optional sharing session where you can chat about what you're reading - or simply listen. It's a lovely way to discover books you might never have picked up otherwise, and a refreshing alternative to traditional book clubs with set reading lists.

And the best part? Every event is completely free. Thanks to the support of West Lindsey District Council. Tickets are available for the Creative Writing Workshop and the Silent Book Club from Welton Parish Council Office during opening hours or by telephoning 07832 175867 to reserve a place.

Later in the month we have an intriguing Community Hub talk on Tuesday 23rd June at 2pm. Experienced speaker Sam Millard will be asking the audience whether he is describing Rogues, Vagabonds or Heroes. Inspired by a folk song by a Lincolnshire man it looks at changes to the law in Victorian times which made the taking of wildlife a criminal offence at a time when life for working class families was anything but easy. A free talk open to all with light refreshments from 1:30pm.
