## SPRIDLINGTON VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 28 MAY 2026

During the 12 months since the last AGM the hall has been hired 24 times. While this is down from 32 hirings last year, this averages out at 2 per month, which is encouraging.

Hirings included 7 Parish Council meetings, 9 First Friday Club evenings, and 8 private hirings.

Following the resignation of one of the Trustees last year, the Committee is now down to 3 members. While the present Committee is prepared to continue to run the hall and be responsible for all maintenance and administration, plus gardening and cleaning, under these circumstances we do not consider it is viable or reasonable for the Committee to be responsible for organising social or fund-raising events.

It should also be noted that the 3 current members have been serving for a total of 35 years between them (Chair 15 years, Secretary 11 years, Treasurer 9 years) and are intending to retire in the next 3 years or so. This means that volunteers will have to come forward to take over the running of the hall or the village will lose this valuable amenity.

Grange Farm Energy provided funding in 2025 for the repair and renovation of the stone wall boundary fronting the car park. The work was carried out in July 2025 by Merv Berridge, who did an excellent job.

The PCC arranged for a survey of the large tree on the car park boundary and were advised to have the tree canopy reduced. This work was carried out a few weeks ago.

We are currently waiting to hear from Grange Farm Energy as to whether we have been successful in our bid for grant funds to cover the cost of redecorating the entrance and main hall.

With the current level of hirings and grants, we are able to keep the hall running as a viable asset to the village. We look forward to another satisfactory year.

What a fantastic response we had from all ages to our recent Wordfest events, plenty of participants and the feedback on the day was so positive as was that from those who completed the online review. The district council, who helped support the event, are delighted to see that there is clearly an appetite at the library for this sort of event which hopefully bodes well for the future.

Another really popular event launches on Saturday 18th July when we have the start of the annual Summer Reading Challenge which encourages reading for 4 to 11 year olds in the summer holidays through collecting stickers as a reward for books read. The theme this year is Read to the Beat, looking to inspire children to explore the connection between stories and songs, discovering how reading and music both ignite imagination and creativity. Youngsters can join anytime between 10am and 12 noon on that day and also enjoy making colourful model kites and ice creams at a craft session. If they cannot make it on that date no worries, they can join at any session up to the end of the school holidays and we do have some special stickers for the under 4s as well so they do not feel left out. Always very popular, it is all free and a good positive way to help children find their own entertainment in the holidays so bring them along and see one our volunteers to get things started.
